- How do you wrap the event up effectively?




Hosting Off Campus with Craig Hicks

- Conduct a site survey and brainstorm issues and possible solutions
- Have a point of contact at the facility who is your go to for all questions
- Prepare for the worst, hope for the best. You're away from home, things will go wrong
- Don't be afraid to ask for help



During the Weekend of Live Events with Justin Sweeney

- In addition to the essentials, ask what do you want to get out of the weekend?
- The "essentials" are still the most essential
 - o Properly staffed events
 - o Games statted and delivered
 - o Take care of all the nuts and bolts of a home event
- Get as much done as you possibly can on the front end of the week in order to:
 - o Get important stuff off your plate ASAP
 - o Identify where your problem areas and needs for the event are more quickly
 - Have more time to promote the event more often leading up to tip-off



During the Weekend of Live Events with Justin Sweeney

 Be both at peace with and strategic about leaning on your resources heavily (ask for all the help you can, get it out in front of potential helpers as soon as possible prior to the event)

- Setting up the social plan beforehand
- Being adaptable (this could also work for the split-site stuff I was talking about)
- Taking care of the other SID
