Dates

- April 10 – 14, 2029
- April 9 – 13, 2030
- April 8 – 12, 2031

Facility Requirements

- Minimum seating capacity of 500 spectators.
- The facility must be a bowling center with a minimum of 32 lanes, but prefers 40 lanes, or an arena or convention center with 32 to 40 fully automatic portable bowling lanes.
- Automatic scoring machines are required.

Lodging Requirements

- All hotels should be in close proximity (ideally within walking distance) from the competition venue.
- The team hotel(s) must be of comparable quality and distance from the venue
- Minimum of five double/doubles sleeping rooms for each team is required, two complimentary bedroom suites are recommended.
