Dates

- March 16 and 18, 2029
- March 22 and 24, 2030
- March 21 and 23, 2031

Facility Requirements

- Minimum seating capacity of 3,500 seats.
- The facility must have access to two ice-resurfacing machines.
- At least four locker rooms to accommodate 27 players each.

Lodging Requirements

- Preferred seven separate hotels (Teams, HQ, Bands, Media).
- Preference for team hotels to be within 15 miles of competition venue.
