Facility Requirements

- For Giant Slalom and Slalom Alpine, the facility must be able to conduct competition
 according to International Ski Federation (FIS) rules for FIS-sanctioned events and by
 United States Ski and Snowboard Association (USSSA) standards for USSSA-sanctioned
 events.
- For Sprint, Classical, and Freestyle Nordic events, the facility must be able to meet the
 guidelines, course specifications, measurements, and other requirements as outlined by
 International Ski Federation (FIS) and United States Ski and Snowboard Association
 (USSSA) standards.

Lodging Requirements

- Majority of team will secure their own property for lodging, but some teams may need assistance of the host to identify quality properties.
- All contracted hotels shall be in close proximity to the competition venue.
