2025-26 TRAVEL POLICY CHANGES

DIVISION I and NATIONAL COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

- -High-cost city list addition of two cities, Las Vegas and Anaheim, bringing the list to 18.
- -Baseball and softball 50 percent seeding.
- -Women's soccer add day of rest between 2nd and 3rd rounds.
- -Men's and women's cross country increase field size by one additional team per gender.
- -NC men's fencing and NC women's fencing mixed championship is now broken into men's and women's for scoring, no change to travel policy.
- -NC men's volleyball add three teams, increase bracket from nine to 12.
- -NC skiing addition of Nordic sprint event.
- -NC women's wrestling championship addition of new championship in winter 2026.
- -NIT pays at NCAA DI men's basketball per diem rate of \$255.

DIVISION II:

- -Increase per diem rate from \$135 to \$150 for NCAA paid travelers.
- -Per diem addition of 18 high-cost cities:

- -Per diem rate for championships conducted in the above high-cost cities will be \$205.
- -Men's basketball joint championship with DI men's basketball. Championship game in Indianapolis, Sunday, April 5, and per diem paid at the DI rate of \$255.
- -Men's football add four teams, increase bracket from 28 to 32.
- -Men's lacrosse add two teams increasing bracket from 16 teams to 18 teams.

DIVISION III:

- -Per diem increase from \$135 to \$150 and host per diem increase from \$55 to \$60.
- -Women's ice hockey add one team increasing bracket from 12 to 13 teams.
- -Men's basketball joint championship with DI men's basketball. Championship game in Indianapolis, Sunday, April 5, and per diem paid at the DI rate of \$255.
- -Men's volleyball add two teams increasing bracket from 19 to 21.

All Divisions

Should an institution elect to travel with more travelers than allowed by NCAA policy, the institution must pay for additional passengers above the NCAA-paid travel party size. For commercial flights, that cost will be the actual cost charged by the airline. For charter flights, the institution will be charged \$500, one way, per additional passenger.
