



**REPORT OF THE NCAA
DIVISION I MEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE
JUNE 1-2, 2026, MEETING**

ACTION ITEMS.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

1. Legislative items.

a. Attendance at Division I Men's Basketball Contests, Including Other Conference Tournaments.

- (1) Action. The NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee introduced a proposal into the October 2026 legislative cycle to prohibit institutional staff members with responsibilities specific to men's basketball from attending Division I men's basketball preseason contests, regular season contests and contests during conference tournaments other than their own. Further, the oversight committee supported exceptions to permit attendance at the same event at the same site (e.g., a member institution's own conference tournament, regular-season tournament or event involving multiple teams) and at contests in which a family member (or practical equivalent of a family member) is a participant (e.g. student-athlete, coach, band/cheer member, celebratory/honor recipient). The proposal would permit attendance at postseason events, (e.g. NIT, NCAA Division I men's basketball championship tournament) subject to event policy.
- (2) Effective Date. Immediate. Subject to NCAA Division I Cabinet action.
- (3) Rationale. Fairness during the recruiting process.
- (4) Estimated budget impact. None.
- (5) Student-athlete impact. None.

2. NCAA Division I Cabinet update. The oversight committee received an update and provided feedback on the Division I age-based eligibility model. Specifically, the oversight committee supported; (a) removing actual or expected high school graduation date from the list of events that would trigger the start of a student-athlete's five-year period of collegiate eligibility, and (b) including specific academic progress requirements for individuals delaying collegiate enrollment following their actual high school graduation or 19th birthday. Generally, the oversight committee supports the uniform eligibility approach addressed by the age-based eligibility model.

3. Guidelines for pre-enrollment violations involving professional teams. The oversight committee received an update on the NCAA Division I Academics and Eligibility Committee

guidelines for processing athletics eligibility certifications in 2026-27. NCAA staff noted the material update for the 2026-27 certification cycle was the inclusion of the guideline specific to violations where prospective student-athletes enter an agreement with, compete on, or receive compensation from a team that participates in a league with minimum compensation that exceeds actual and necessary expenses (e.g., NBA, NFL, Premiere League, WNBA). For those violations, the certification condition is eligibility not reinstated.

4. **NCAA Division I Bylaw 17 Decentralization Feedback – Phase I.** The oversight committee discussed the decentralization of Division I Bylaw 17 (Playing and Practice Seasons). The committee provided feedback to the NCAA Division I Cabinet on the first practice date, first competition date, end of the playing season, maximum number of contests, summer athletics activities and health and safety for men's basketball. Of note, the oversight committee did not recommend any changes to the first practice date, first competition date, end of the playing season or maximum number of contests. Similarly, the oversight committee recommended maintaining summer athletics activities and the annual exemption for one regular season game in Hawaii versus a member institution located in that state. The committee recommended the elimination of annual exemptions that permit an institution to exempt automatic qualification contests and regular season contests played in Alaska versus a member institution in that state.
5. **Out-of-season activities discussion.** The oversight committee continued its discussion on out-of-season activities in Division I men's basketball. The oversight committee supported an initial concept that would change the foreign tour, summer athletics activities, skill instruction outside the playing season and outside competition legislation in men's basketball as a mechanism to address the following concerns identified by the oversight committee:
 - Due to high transfer rates, most teams have brand new rosters each year.
 - Student-athletes want to play against individuals other than their teammates by the end of summer.
 - NCAA college basketball is the only level that does not have summer competition against "like" opponents (i.e., youth, high-school and professional).
 - Teams must travel abroad to play games in the summer.
 - Coaches' feedback suggests competition on foreign tours is not comparable to playing other Division I teams.
 - Consistent with decentralization efforts, increased flexibility in national rules for outside (non-institutional) competition is being considered.
 - There is inconsistency in the number of skill instruction hours between out-of-season during academic year and summer.

The oversight committee will gather feedback from stakeholders in preparation for its discussion on June 25 and may introduce a legislative proposal into the October 2026 legislative cycle.

6. **Agent discussion.** The oversight committee discussed the evolving role of agents within the Division I men's basketball landscape. The committee supported NCAA staff developing a voluntary agent registry to incentivize agent engagement (e.g., providing contact information, educational background, licenses, services, etc.) and provide transparency for Division I men's basketball coaches and student-athletes.
7. **Transfer window discussion.** The oversight committee discussed the notification of transfer legislation that was adopted January 14, 2026, which permitted undergraduate student-athletes to initiate the notification of transfer process during a 15 consecutive-day period beginning the day after the Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Championship games. The oversight committee requested data from the National Association of Basketball Coaches, NCAA Student-Athlete Advocacy Committee, student-athlete engagement group and other sport oversight committees to evaluate whether adjustments to the transfer window are needed for the upcoming academic year. The oversight committee will continue its discussion on transfer windows during a future meeting.
8. **NCAA Division I MBOC nominations for June 2026 vacancies.** The oversight committee reviewed nominees and appointed a new member to the oversight committee. Notification to the appointee will follow the established process and rosters will be updated in accordance with the start date for service.
9. **NCAA Division I MBOC playing rules nominations for June and September 2026 vacancies.** The oversight committee reviewed nominees and appointed new members to the playing rules subcommittee. Notification to the appointees will follow the established process and rosters will be updated in accordance with the start date for service.
10. **Legislative relief waiver review.** The oversight committee reviewed and provided feedback on a legislative relief waiver.
11. **2026 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship and National Invitation Tournament (NIT) review.** Due to time constraints, the oversight committee will review this agenda item at an upcoming meeting.
12. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship expansion and international media coverage update.** Due to time constraints, the oversight committee will review this agenda item at an upcoming meeting.
13. **Men's basketball stakeholders May 12 meeting with the National Basketball Association, National Federation of State High School Associations, Naismith Hall of Fame, National Basketball Players Association and USA Basketball update.** Due to time constraints, the oversight committee will review this agenda item at an upcoming meeting.
14. **Review of NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee March 11-15 Selections meeting, April 2 and May 4 meeting reports.** Due to time constraints, the oversight committee will review this agenda item at an upcoming meeting.

15. **NCAA Men's Basketball Playing Rules Subcommittee May 4-6 annual meeting update.** The oversight committee received an update on the Men's Basketball Playing Rules Subcommittee annual meeting from the men's basketball secretary-rules editor. It was noted that this is a nonchange year, however the subcommittee did modify two approved rulings:
 - Officials will call 10-second backcourt violations when the shot clock reaches 19 seconds, rather than 20. This change better aligns with shot clocks that measure tenths of a second and improves accuracy in administering the rule.
 - When two media timeouts would otherwise occur consecutively, the game clock must run before the second timeout is granted.
16. **NCAA Men's Basketball Officiating update.** Due to time constraints, the oversight committee will review this agenda item at an upcoming meeting.
