SAVE THE DATE – FIRST and SECOND ROUNDS

WHO: Institutions who sponsor Division I women's basketball

WHAT: 2021 championship hosting – non-predetermined sites

WHERE: Host institution's home court

WHEN: Friday, March 19 and Sunday, March 21 OR

Saturday, March 20 and Monday, March 22

First- and second-round sites will be awarded to the top 16 seeded teams who submit a bid that meets the requirements for hosting.

In the event that a top 16 seeded team does not submit a bid or their bid does not meet requirements for hosting, the Division I Women's Basketball Committee will select a host from the remaining submitted bids that meet the requirements for hosting. In order to adhere to the bracketing principles, it may not be possible to select the next highest seed to host.

Therefore, any institution who wants to host is encouraged to submit a bid.

REGIONALS

Regional competition will be hosted at predetermined, neutral sites.

Regional hosting parameter: A team may not be assigned to play in any arena in which it has played more than three regular-season games, not including conference post-season tournaments.

Regional hosts for 2021 are: Albany, New York at Times Union Center (Siena College and Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference); Austin (Cedar Park), Texas at H-E-B Center (University of Texas at Austin); Cincinnati, Ohio at Cintas Center (Xavier and Cincinnati USA Sports Commission); and Spokane, Washington at Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena (Idaho).

LODGING

A total of 5 hotels are requested to host the first and second round of the championship as listed below for check-in on Wednesday, March 17 with check-out on Monday, March 22 OR check-in on Thursday, March 18 with check-out on Tuesday, March 23. Please be sure hotels are available for both sets of check-in and check-out dates as site dates will not be determined until Selection Monday, March 15. All hotels <u>must</u> be full service properties with catering services on-property. The hotels should provide a fair and reasonable rate for the local market. The NCAA is committed to providing an affordable championship for participating institutions and recommends that all room rates do not exceed the NCAA's maximum rate cap of \$185/night plus taxes. NCAA Hosts are encouraged to secure national hotel brands if possible (e.g. Marriott, Hyatt, Hilton, Sheraton, Starwood). Team hotels should be within reasonable proximity (under 30-minute drive) to the competition venue. 1 Headquarters Hotel: accommodates NCAA event personnel, game officials, media, etc.

- Approximately 15 rooms per night (including 1 suite) for 5 nights.
- 1 complimentary meeting space (800 sq. ft.) for 1-hour meeting on Thursday or Friday night.

4 Team Hotels (or 3 if the host institution will stay on campus):

- Total of 46 rooms at each hotel with 23 of the rooms held for the first 3 nights (2 of which should be suites for coach/administrator). The remaining 23 rooms should be held on contingency, one of which is for the team bus driver (if needed).
- 2 complimentary meeting spaces/team, held on a 24-hour basis for 5 days (minimum of 800 sq. ft. each)
- Complimentary internet in meeting space and travel party sleeping rooms.
