

NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Update - February 2021

1. 2021 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship update.

a. Championship announcement – <u>SAN ANTONIO IS TOURNEY TOWN!</u>



b. <u>Due February 26</u>: Conference Automatic Qualifier (AQ) Requirements. Deadline for conferences to submit their AQ requirements identifying how their conference AQ will be

determined for the 2021 Tournament, if changes need to be made. Send AQ requirement updates to Meredith Cleaver, mcleaver@ncaa.org.

c. <u>Due February 26</u>: Championship Eligibility Waiver Process. An institution must have a minimum of 13 games against Division I institutions to qualify for team selection as an at-large or automatic qualifier in the NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Championships. d. NCAA Evaluation Tool (NET). The NCAA Evaluation Tool (NET) has replaced the Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) as the contemporary sorting tool used to measure a team's quality and help evaluate team resumes for selection and seeding in the Division I Women's Basketball Championship. The first release of the NET rankings took place on January 4, 2021 and will be updated daily throughout the remainder of the 2020-21 season.

b. NEW & DOWNLOADABLE: TIP with Excellence Toolkit. The NCAA has developed a "TIP" with Excellence Toolkit, in partnership with the Drake University Robert D. and Billie Ray Center and the Excellence with Integrity Institute.

There are three (3) team culture practices included in the "TIP" materials, each focus each focused on one of the NCAA Women's Basketball values: Teamwork, Inclusion, and Passion. The three Team Culture Practices are not sequential. They can be done in any order at any time. Each Culture Practice can be conducted in a variety of environments — the court, the locker room, a classroom, a film session, on the bus — as you see fit.

The TIP Team Culture Practices feature several research-based Excellence with Integrity TOOLSTM as their core content. The culture development EWI TOOLSTM distill relevant research, as well as over 20 years of the authors' implementation experience in leadership and culture development, into simple, consistent, and replicable strategies. The EWI TOOLSTM will guide the immediate activities presented in the TIP Culture Practices sessions and are intended to be used in support of your ongoing team culture development beyond the original practice sessions.

Each Culture Practice includes a Student-Athlete Playbook and a Coaches Guide for the coach, or whomever is leading the Culture Practice. Both documents are fillable pdf's: they can be viewed on a smart phone, tablet, or computer, and they have areas that can be typed into and saved; the documents can also be printed out and used as needed in a paper format.

4. NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee/NCAA Division I Council Hot

Topics. Throughout the fall and winter, the Women's Basketball Oversight Committee and the Division I Council discussed and acted on regulations and policies impacted by COVID-19. A summary may be found <u>here</u>. A listing of actions currently under consideration may be found <u>here</u>.

• Several actions impacting women's basketball include the following:

a. Waiver to permit two noncoaching staff members to be managers and practice players.

b. An additional season of competition and extension of eligibility granted to student-athletes, provided certain criteria are met.

c. Temporary recruiting dead period extended to April 15, 2021 in all sports.

d. Waiver approved to permit 4-4 transfer student-athletes currently serving a transfer year to be immediately eligible, provided certain criteria are met.
