#### **REMINDERS:**

### • Site Selection for 2029-31:

Bids for the six regional sites for 2029 through 2031 and the finals site for each year will be accepted tentatively from August 1 to September 1, 2026. The committee will review all bids during the fall with an announcement of all sites likely in early January 2027. Exact timing of the bid process will be finalized later this spring.

- <u>Substitution Allowances</u>: A reminder that substitutions are permissible at conference championships, in addition to NCAA Regionals & the National Championships. Substitute student-athletes may use the practice facilities during championships competition.
- <u>.500 Rule for At-large Selection</u>: A reminder that the .500 rule will be in effect for the second time with the 2025 selections. Any team with a record of under .500 will not be eligible to be selected at-large. Teams that win a conference automatic qualifier slot, do NOT have to be above .500.
- Automatic Qualification Invitations to Individual Conference Medalists: Conference medalists whose teams are not selected into the NCAA regional fields, will receive an automatic invitation as part of the 36 individuals selected nationally for regional competitions. This is for the individual medalist only and cannot be transferred to any other player and conferences must have a playoff to determine the medalist.

### • Updated Selection Criteria

- 1. National Collegiate Golf ranking;
- 2. Head-to-head results;
- 3. Adjusted scoring average;
- 4. Head-to-head stroke differential;
- 5. Results versus common opponents;
- 6. Overall won-lost record;
- 7. Strength of schedule; and
- 8. Spring trending. (added for 2025-26)

# • Year Round Finals Site Course Access Policy:

The men's and women's golf committees have adopted a closed course policy for the championships at Omni La Costa. No coach, team or individual may play or walk the course, including the second course located on property at any time (including the summer). The only exception is for any student-athletes who had a membership to the course prior to August 1, 2023.
