4. Automatic Qualification.

There will be 23 conferences receiving automatic qualification in 2019. The remaining 57 teams will be selected via at-large bids.

5. Submission of Competition Schedules.

Continuing this academic year, teams are required to submit their season-long competition schedules, and any team that withdraws from a regularly scheduled tournament or cancels a scheduled tournament without reason will incur losses to each team in the field. However, should a tournament be cancelled for reasons beyond the control of the team, no penalties will be incurred.

The policy reads as follows:

"Teams are required to submit their spring schedules by February 1 each year. Any team that withdraws from a regularly scheduled tournament or cancels a scheduled tournament will incur losses to each team in the field. However, should reasons beyond the team's control cause a tournament cancellation or team withdrawal, the team will not incur any penalties. Review and approval of these cases will be the responsibility of the Division II Men's Golf Committee."

6. <u>Substitution Policy for</u> <u>Head-to-Head Medal Play Finals Only.</u>

Beginning in 2019, and at the finals site only, an eighth travel party member (a sixth student-athlete) will be reimbursable for participating teams.

This student-athlete will be eligible to compete <u>only</u> in the head-to-head medal play portion of the championships, if substituted by the head coach prior to the given round of competition. No substitutions will be allowed during the medal play portion of the

National Collegiate Athletic Association November 14, 2018 JWB:ndo championships. The sixth student-athlete will be considered a spectator during the competition rounds that he is not participating.

The student-athlete will be eligible to participate in the practice round and will be eligible to use the practice facilities; however, all practice round policies, including pace of play, will remain unchanged.

7. Practice Round Policy.

Continuing in 2018-19, players will be permitted to hit multiple tee shots during Regional and Finals practice rounds on Par 4s and Par 5s. This change will not impact Par 3s, as players will be permitted to hit only one tee shot on Par 3s. All other practice round policies will remain the same, including pace of play.

At the finals site, teams will be permitted to have six players play in the practice round.

8. Coaches Connection Program.

Men's Golf is in its second year with the Division II Coaches Connection program in 2018-19, in an effort to better serve coaches throughout the division. One coach has been appointed from each conference for men's golf, and monthly conference calls are held with the coaches' connector, conference representatives, GCAA and NCAA staff.
