- Confirmation of AQ's and pool numbers will be determined based on the sport sponsorship information available at the time of championships selections.
- 7. 2021 Championships Field Size In September, the Division III Championships Committee recommended and the Division III Management Council approved that brackets and field sizes be maximized at 75 percent for the

2020-21 academic year only. The committee will select 116 participants for the championships inclusive of 22 teams and six individuals.

- 8. 2020-21 Selection Process. In May, the Division III Membership Committee reduced the minimum number of contests required for sport sponsorship and championship selection by 33 percent for the 2020-21 academic year only. The Division III Women's Golf Committee has since reduced the number of rounds needed by 33 percent to be considered as an at-large selection. Teams and individuals must play a minimum of eight 18-hole rounds on a course at least 5,800 yards, including a minimum of two rounds in the spring and register with Golfstat, in order to be considered for selection as an at-large berth to the championships. Teams receiving automatic qualification berths (Pool A) must meet minimum sport sponsorship requirements but otherwise will be determined as dictated by the conference (e.g., do NOT need to meet the minimum eight 18-hole rounds, two rounds in the spring requirement). A team or individual desiring to participate in the championships must complete all tournaments by May 2, 2021. A team may compete with four or five players. Teams or individuals that are not able to meet eligibility requirements due to weather or other extenuating circumstances may submit a written waiver to the NCAA championships manager prior to the selection call for consideration by the women's golf committee.
- 9. <u>Selection Criteria</u>. All contests against Division III opponents will be in primary criteria. If there are at-large teams and individuals selected, the following criteria will be used.

Primary:

- Won-lost percentage against Division III opponents;
- Division III head-to-head competition;
- Results versus common Division III opponents;
- Adjusted scoring average;
- Score versus par;
- Strength of schedule in Division III;
- Record versus top 25 Division III teams;
- Place finish in contests;
- Average drop score;
- Late-season performance.

Secondary:

- Won-lost percentage against non-division III opponents;
- Results versus common non-Division III opponents;
- Strength of schedule;
- Record versus top 25 non-Division III opponents.

- Coaches' polls and/or any other outside polls are not used as a selection criterion by the women's golf committee for selection purposes.
- 10. <u>Championship Format</u>. The championships will consist of both team and individual competition conducted concurrently. The tournament is 72 holes. All participants will complete 54 holes of competition. After 54 holes of competition, the field will be cut to the top 15 teams and top six individuals not on one of those teams.
- 11. <u>Rules.</u> The 2020-21 Hard Card is posted on the Division III Women's Golf landing page on <u>www.NCAA.org</u>.
- 12. <u>Annual Meetings</u>. The 2021 NCAA Division III Women's Golf Committee annual meeting will be June 14-16, 2021, and will be conducted virtually. Feel free to submit agenda items in writing to the NCAA championships administrator, Nancy O'Hara.

13. <u>Minimum Yardage</u>. The minimum yardage requirement for the 2020-21 season is:

PAR 70 = 5,600

PAR 71 = 5,700

PAR 72 = 5.800

PAR 73 = 5,900

PAR 74 = 6,000

- 15. <u>Date Formula Change</u>. The men's and women's committee surveyed the membership and made a proposal to the championships committee to alternate years. Beginning with the 2023 championships, the women's date formula will be the 2nd Tuesday in May in odd-numbered years and the 3rd Tuesday in May in even-numbered years.
