- Selection Process The committee will select 131 participants for the championships. Twenty-five teams and six individuals will be selected.
- 8. <u>Selection Criteria</u>. All contests against Division III opponents will be in primary criteria. The following criteria will be used to select the four\* at-large teams and six individuals to the championships.

#### Primary:

- •Won-lost percentage against Division III opponents;
- •Division III head-to-head competition;
- •Results versus common Division III opponents;
- Adjusted scoring average;
- •Score versus par;
- •Strength of schedule in Division III;
- •Record versus top 25 Division III teams;
- •Place finish in contests;
- Average drop score;
- •Late-season performance.

#### Secondary:

- •Won-lost percentage against non-division III opponents;
- •Results versus common non-Division III opponents;
- •Strength of schedule;
- •Record versus top 25 non-Division III opponents.

Coaches' polls and/or any other outside polls are not used as a selection criterion by the women's golf committee for selection purposes.

- 9. 2018-19 Selection Process. Teams and individuals must play a minimum of twelve 18-hole rounds on a course at least 5,800 yards, including a minimum of three rounds in the spring and register with Golfstat by October 1, 2018, in order to be considered for selection as an at-large to the championships. Teams receiving automatic qualification berths (Pool A) must meet minimum sport sponsorship requirements but otherwise will be determined as dictated by the conference (e.g., do NOT need to meet the minimum twelve 18-hole rounds, three rounds in the spring requirement). A team or individual desiring to participate in the championships must complete all tournaments by May 5, 2019. A team may compete with four or five players. Teams or individuals that are not able to meet eligibility requirements due to weather or other extenuating circumstances may submit a written waiver to the NCAA championships manager prior to the selection call for consideration by the women's golf committee.
- 10. Regional Rankings. The committee will publish four regional rankings. There will be one ranking in the fall and three rankings in the spring. The fourth published ranking will be at the time of selections. Regional rankings will be published Nov. 8, April 18, May 2 and at the time of selections, May 6.

- 11. <u>Championship Format</u>. The championships will consist of both team and individual competition conducted concurrently. The tournament is 72 holes. All participants will complete 54 holes of competition. After 54 holes of competition, the field will be cut to the top 15 teams and top six individuals not on one of those teams.
- Rules. The 2018 Fall Hard Card is posted on the Division III Women's Golf landing page on <a href="www.NCAA.org">www.NCAA.org</a>. The 2019 Spring Hard Card will be posted in January.
- 13. <u>Annual Meetings</u>. The 2019 NCAA Division III Women's Golf Committee annual meeting will be June 24-26, 2019, in Indianapolis. Feel free to submit agenda items in writing to the NCAA championships administrator, Nancy O'Hara.

14. Minimum Yardage. The committee will be adjusting the minimum yardage requirement for the 2019-20 season to:

PAR 70 = 5,600

PAR 71 = 5,700

PAR 72 = 5,800

PAR 73 = 5,900

PAR 74 = 6,000

- 15. <u>Two Active Coaches</u>. Two designated coaches from each team will be permitted to give advice during competition at the championships. The two active coaches must be recognized institutional representatives.
- 16. Access Ratio. The men's and women's committees have proposed that the championships committee review and modify NCAA Bylaw 31.3.1.1 to increase the access ratio in women's golf from 1:7 to 1:6.5. The championships committee will review the request during their February 2019 meeting along with other sport budget-impacted requests.
- 17. Regional Realignment. The committee has requested the championships committee review a proposal to align the five regions in an effort to more evenly distribute the institutions across the regions. This would be effective for the 2019-20 academic year.
