

# NCAA DIVISION I COMPETITION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE REPORT FROM THE NCAA WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS COMMITTEE DECEMBER 7, 2020, VIDEOCONFERENCE

**Action Items:** The NCAA Division I Competition Oversight Committee will consider a recommendation for a hosting change for one of the 2021 regional locations.

#### KEY ITEMS.

• **2021 regional site.** The committee recommended a new site for one of the 2021 regionals, following notification from previously selected hosts that they will not be able to fulfill their hosting duties due to challenges stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic (see Action Item.

### ACTION ITEMS.

- 1. Legislative items.
  - None.
- 2. Nonlegislative items.
  - 2021 National Collegiate Women's Gymnastics Championships regional host.
    - a. Recommendation. That the Division I Competition Oversight Committee approve the University of Georgia as the host for one of the 2021 National Collegiate Women's Gymnastics Championships regional location, April 1-3. Georgia will replace the University of New Hampshire as the host of the regional. This site adjustment is a result of staffing and facility impacts created by the COVID-19 pandemic.
    - b. Effective date. Immediate.
    - c. <u>Rationale</u>. When bids were originally awarded for the 2021 regional locations, the format for post season was six regional locations and Georgia was awarded a regional. After the championship format changed to four regional locations, the regional sites were adjusted, and Georgia was moved to host a regional in 2019 instead of 2021. The other site that lost the opportunity to host in 2021 after the format change was changed to host in 2018 and will host again in 2025. Georgia was not selected to host in the most recent bid cycle and will not have an opportunity to host again until 2026. Given this, the committee believed the opportunity to host the 2021 regional should be provided to Georgia.
    - d. Estimated budget impact. \$90,000.

e. <u>Student-athlete impact</u>. Georgia has served as a frequent regional host and will provide quality facilities and a memorable experience for all participating student-athletes.
