**Similar to 2024.** The first RAC ranking will be published as an alphabetical list of teams under consideration rather than rank order.

Men's lacrosse bench personnel will continue to be a coaches decision to have all current rostered student-athletes in the bench area in uniform. The squad size of 32 student-athletes and travel party of 34 individuals is unchanged.

**Pre-Championship Manual.** Don't forget to go online and print the NCAA Division II Men's Lacrosse Pre-Championship Manual, which will be available online by **January 31, 2025,** on NCAA.org.

**Preliminary Round Game Times.** The committee set the following game times for the preliminary rounds:

- First Round 4 p.m.
- Quarterfinals 1 p.m.
- Semifinals 1 p.m.

Host institutions may not deviate from these times without approval from the committee. The only reasons the committee will grant a different game time would be for commencement or hosting of other NCAA championships.

#### Selection of Participants for Division II.

[Reference: Executive Regulations Section and Bylaws 31.01, 31.02, 31.1, 31.2 and 31.3 in the NCAA Manual.]

**Selection Requirements.** To be considered for championship selection and rankings, a team must satisfy all scheduling requirements as outlined by championships policy in that sport and a team must have an overall win-loss-record of .500 or better versus Division II opponents.

#### **Selection Criteria:**

The following criteria shall be employed by a governing sports committee in selecting participants for NCAA championships competition [Bylaws 31.3.3; criteria for selection of participants and 31.3.3.1 criteria for selection in team sports]:

- Availability of student-athletes for NCAA championships;
- Nullification;

Required Selection Criteria. Following confirmation of the availability of student-athletes for NCAA championships and the application of nullification, the following required selection criteria shall be applied in no particular order:

- In-region winning percentage;
- Division II winning percentage;
- Division II strength of schedule (opponents' average winning percentage and opponents' opponents' average winning percentage);
- Division II head-to-head competition; and
- Results versus Division II common opponents.

# **Sports-Specific Selection Criteria** (in no particular order).

- In-region strength of schedule (opponents' average winning percentage and opponents' opponents' average winning percentage;
- In-region Ratings Percentage Index (RPI).
- Performance Indicator (PI).

Additionally, input is provided by regional advisory committees for consideration by the Division II Men's Lacrosse Committee. A Division II governing sports committee must contact a regional advisory committee prior to making its final selection of teams if the committee selection differs from the regional

advisory committees. Coaches' polls and/or any other outside polls or rankings are not used by the Division II Men's Lacrosse Committee for selection purposes. Conference tournament games will be included for selections.

#### Bylaw 31.3.3.1.1 – Countable Competition.

For NCAA team-championship selection purposes, competition is countable only when the teams played are varsity intercollegiate teams of four-year, degree-granting institutions that conduct a majority of their competition in that team sport against varsity intercollegiate teams (see Constitution 3.3.4.4) of four-year, degree-granting institutions located in Canada, Mexico and the United States, its territories or possessions. Competition against service teams, professional teams, semiprofessional teams, amateur teams, two-year colleges and club teams shall be excluded. (*Revised: 2/4/08, 1/18/14 effective 8/1/15, 1/20/18*)
