#### Championship Information.

**2020 Championship.** Will be combined and will be held at Lincoln Financial Field, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, May 24, 2020.

**Pre-Championship Manual.** Don't forget to go online and print the NCAA Division III Men's Lacrosse Pre-Championship Manual, which will be available online by **February 1, 2020** on NCAA.org.

Score Reporting. The score-reporting and stats-reporting processes are combined for Division III men's lacrosse. Schools will submit all schedule and results information to the NCAA statistics site (<a href="http://web1.ncaa.org/stats/StatsSrv/login">http://web1.ncaa.org/stats/StatsSrv/login</a>), and this information will then be imported into the score-reporting system for use by the sports committees. Specific instructions and reporting deadlines will be communicated to SID's in a memo from the media services staff. #### Selection Requirements.

To be considered during the selection process either as an automatic berth (Pool A) or an at-large berth (Pool B and Pool C), an institution must play at least 70 percent of its competition against Division III in-region opponents, unless a waiver has been approved by the Division III Championships Committee.

#### In-Region Definitions.

- 1. All competition within an institution's defined sport/evaluation region.
- 2. All competition within a 500-mile radius from one institution to another. The NCAA Travel Expense System (TES) will be utilized to confirm distance from campus to campus.
- 3. All competition against conference opponents.
- 4. All competition within an institution's defined geographic membership region (Constitution 4.13.1.1).

**Region 1:** Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Rhode Island, Vermont.

Region 2: New York, Pennsylvania.

**Region 3**: Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana,

Michigan, Mississippi, North Carolina, Ohio, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, West Virginia.

Region 4: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington, Wisconsin, Wyoming.

#### Countable Competition - Bylaw 31.3.4.1.1:

For NCAA team championship selection purposes, competition is countable only when the teams played are varsity intercollegiate teams of four-year, degree-granting institutions that conduct a majority of their competition in that team sport against varsity intercollegiate teams (see Constitution 3.2.4.4) of United States four-year, degree-granting institutions. Competition against service teams, professional teams, semiprofessional teams, amateur teams, two-year colleges and club teams shall be excluded.

#### Selection Criteria – Bylaw 31.3.4.2:

The governing sports committee responsible for the selection of the balance of the championships field shall select teams in Pools B and C based on the criteria below. The criteria of two or more teams shall be compared to determine the higher-ranked team. An attempt shall be made to determine the ranking of two or more teams after consideration of the primary criteria (see Bylaw 31.3.4.2.1). If the evaluation of the primary criteria does not result in a decision, the secondary criteria will be used (see Bylaw 31.3.4.2.2). All the criteria listed will be evaluated.

#### Primary Criteria - Bylaw 31.3.4.2.1:

The primary criteria for ranking and selection (all contests leading up to NCAA Championships); all criteria will be evaluated (not listed in preferential order):

- Won-lost percentage against Division III opponents;
- Division III head-to-head competition;
- Results versus common Division III opponents;

- Results versus ranked Division III teams as established by the final rankings and the ranking preceding the final rankings. Conference postseason contests are included:
- Division III strength of schedule.
  - Opponents' Average Winning Percentage (OWP) 2/3 weight
  - Opponents' Opponents' Average Winning Percentage (OOWP) 1/3 weight

\*NOTE: Contests versus provisional and reclassifying members in their third and fourth years shall count in the primary criteria. Provisional and reclassifying members shall remain ineligible for ranking and selections.

#### Secondary Criteria - Bylaw 31.3.4.2.2:

If the evaluation of the primary criteria does not result in a decision, the secondary criteria will be used. All the criteria listed will be evaluated (not listed in preferential order).

- Non-Division III won-lost percentage;
- Results versus common non-Division III opponents;
- Division III nonconference strength of schedule.

**Definition of Strength of Schedule – Bylaw 31.3.4.2.3.1:** The strength of schedule shall be calculated by combining the opponents' average winning percentage (OWP) with the opponents' opponent average winning percentage (OOWP) on the weighted scale of two-thirds weight for OWP and one-third weight for OOWP.

Additionally, input is provided by regional advisory committees for consideration by the Men's Lacrosse Committee. Coaches' polls and/or any other outside polls or rankings are not used as a criterion by the Division III Men's Lacrosse Committee for selection purposes.

An institution must play a minimum of 10 games during the traditional season against Division III opponents to be considered for selection.

#### **Championships Committee Actions.**

Approved that the following 27 conferences be granted automatic qualification into the 2020 NCAA Division III Men's Lacrosse Championship:

Capital Athletic Conference. Centennial Conference, College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin, Colonial States Athletic Conference, Commonwealth Coast Conference, Empire 8, Great Northeast Athletic Conference, Heartland Collegiate Men's Lacrosse Conference, Landmark Conference. Liberty League, Little East Conference, Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Middle Conference. Atlantic Conference Commonwealth, Middle Atlantic Conference Freedom, Midwest Lacrosse Conference, New England Small College Athletic Conference, New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference, North Atlantic Conference, North Coast Athletic Conference, North Eastern Athletic Conference, Ohio Athletic Conference, Old Dominion Athletic Conference, Presidents' Athletic Conference, Skyline Conference, Southern Athletic Association, State University of New York Athletic Conference and USA South Athletic Conference.
