

REPORT OF THE NCAA DIVISION III MEN'S LACROSSE COMMITTEE JUNE 16-17, 2025, ANNUAL MEETING

ACTION ITEMS.

- 1. Legislative items.
 - None.
- 2. Nonlegislative items.
 - a. Automatic qualification.
 - 1. Recommendation. That the following 27 conferences be afforded automatic-qualifying status to the 2026 NCAA Division III Men's Lacrosse Championship: Atlantic East Conference; Centennial Conference; Coastal Lacrosse Conference, College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin; Conference of New England; Empire 8; Great Northeast Athletic Conference; Heartland Collegiate Men's Lacrosse Conference; Landmark Conference; Liberty League; Little East Conference; Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association; Middle Atlantic Conference Commonwealth; Middle Atlantic Conference Freedom; New England Small College Athletic Conference; New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference; North Atlantic Conference; North Coast Athletic Conference; Northern Athletics Collegiate Conference; Ohio Athletic Conference; Old Dominion Athletic Conference; Presidents' Athletic Conference; Skyline Conference; Southern Athletic Association; State University of New York Athletic Conference; United East Conference and USA South Athletic Conference.

The anticipated pool allocations for the 2026 championship are as follows: Pool A - 27 and 13 at-large.

- 2. Effective date. September 1, 2025.
- 3. <u>Rationale</u>. Each conference meets the requirements of NCAA Bylaw 31.3.3 and has completed the automatic-qualification declaration form. (Note: Pool allocations may adjust based on 2025-26 sponsorship numbers.)
- 4. Estimated budget impact. None.
- 5. Student-athlete impact. None.
- b. Bench personnel.

- 1. Recommendation. The committee would like to revisit feedback presented to the championship committee back in April and September 2022, February of 2023, September of 2023, and September of 2024. Per those discussions, feedback, meeting reports and survey results the men's lacrosse committee would like to seek approval to allow each participating institution to bring as many student-athletes as they have on their current roster to the championships and be permitted in the bench area.
- 2. Effective date. September 1, 2025.

Rationale.

- a) These student-athletes are a part of the team all season, but when they make the NCAA championship selected student-athletes are regulated to sit in the stands away from their teammates. This is a situation where no coach, administrator or athlete looks forward to either. For those teams that make it to the NCAA championship tournament, it immediately turns into one of the lowest moments of the year for the coaching staff, administrators and of course the selected student athletes and parents. They should all be celebrating and preparing for their next opponent, when the focus then turns to 'how am I going to tell these kids they are sitting in the stands? Please refer to attachment A.
- b) Coaches are instructed by their presidents and directors of athletics to maintain higher roster sizes than in the past due to the high education financial climate. The ability to ensure a full championship experience will only contribute to the overall experience of the student athletes. This will in turn provide a higher rate of retention among those student-athletes. Please refer to attachment B letter from the Intercollegiate Men's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IMLCA).
- c) The men's lacrosse committee agreed with allowing the women's lacrosse institutions to match the bench limit of fifty to match the men's lacrosse bench limit as it provided the women's programs full access for their athletes. This is something we are all striving for. However, the committee feels that the decision does not accurately and equitably reflect the current roster landscape of the men's lacrosse teams. The substitution patterns, positions, equipment, field dimensions, and the playing rules are all completely different, unlike soccer, basketball, hockey, tennis, and volleyball that lacrosse is being grouped in with.
- 4. Estimated budget impact. None.
- **5.** <u>Student-athlete impact</u>. This would provide positive experience for the student-athletes.

c. Squad size.

- 1. <u>Recommendation</u>. The committee would like to recommend the addition of two student-athletes to the current thirty-two person squad size for a total of thirty-four as the new squad size.
- 2. Effective date. September 1, 2025.
- 3. Rationale. Division III men's lacrosse is the only contact sport across all three divisions that does not have a rest day between games (i.e., football, men's and women's ice hockey and division I and division III men's lacrosse). Currently division III men's lacrosse plays back-to-back for their second/third and quarterfinal/semifinal rounds. Throughout the regular season and conference tournaments, teams are not limited to the number of student-athletes to participate in a contest. In men's lacrosse, there is several specialty groups (i.e., face-off, man-up and man-down units) and ample substituting happening throughout the game. The wear and tear on these student-athletes builds up with not having a rest day between their second/third and quarterfinal/semifinal rounds. The committee plans to submit a recommendation for the next budget cycle a proposal for a day of rest between the second/third and quarterfinal/semifinal rounds.
- 4. <u>Estimated budget impact</u>. \$794.16. The budget would cover the participant medallions of two per team for thirty-six teams. The four semifinalists do not receive participant medallions as we provide for the thirty-seven person travel party.
- 5. <u>Student-athlete impact</u>. This would provide positive experience for the student-athletes as this will give two additional student-athletes with the ability to participate in the championship.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

- **3. 2024 annual meeting report.** The committee approved the 2024 annual meeting report as submitted.
- 4. 2025 championship review. The committee reviewed the 2025 championship, pointing out the successes and the challenges during the event. The committee commended the Harvard University and Krafft Sports & Entertainment staffs for their outstanding work at the championship site. This year was challenging having the Division I Women's Lacrosse Championship at the same site that made the three men's divisions alter their practice times and locker room availability. Overall, the Division II and Division III championship game had their highest attendance on record with 25,228 and streaming numbers were great.

- **a. Surveys.** The committee reviewed the survey results and discussed them throughout the various sections of the agenda. The number one topic in the survey results was student-athletes in the bench area rather than being placed in the stands.
- **b. Bench personnel.** The committee discussed bench personnel size and strongly recommends that teams be allowed to bring as many student-athletes as they have on their current roster to the championship and be permitted in the bench area. This would allow for a better overall student-athlete experience for all institutions that participate in the championship. These coaches are charged by their presidents and directors of athletics to maintain high roster sizes and this policy would assist with the retention of student-athletes. These student-athletes are a part of the team all season but when they make the NCAA championship these student-athletes are regulated to sit in the stands away from their teammates.
- **c. Selection show.** The committee discussed the quality of the selection show. The committee would like staff to collaborate with our streaming company on initiatives enhancing the selection show.
- **d.** Format. The committee discussed the back-to-back game format for the second/third rounds and quarterfinal/semifinal rounds. The committee and staff continue to receive feedback through surveys and conversations with our participating institutions. Many of the institutions are seeing through their sport tracking devices significant drops in bursts, speed, and energy on the second day of the back-to-back games. The committee plans to submit a recommendation for the next budget cycle a proposal for a day of rest between the second/third and quarterfinal/semifinal rounds.
- **5. 2026 championship planning in Charlottesville, VA.** The committee began to plan for the 2026 championship in Charlottesville, VA. Game times will be at 1 and 4 p.m., with Division III playing in the first contest followed by the Division II championship. Staff will be taking a site visit to the University of Virginia in late July.
- **6. NPI.** The committee reviewed the NPI dials and felt they may need to be minor tweaks but nothing drastic when the committee will be permitted to make changes. The committee would like for the championships committee to look at a .500 rule for at-large selections in the championship. For the first time ever, there was an at-large selection of a team based on NPI with a below .500 record.
- 7. Rules. The committee met with men's lacrosse rules committee liaison to discuss items discussed at the June 2025 men's lacrosse rules committee annual meeting. This year was a non-rules change year. Staff will continue to update the committee on any potential changes being discussed in the upcoming rules change year.

- **8. Future championship sites.** The committee reviewed the future championship sites for 2027 and 2028 championships. The committee looks forward to returning to Philadelphia in 2027 followed by Foxborough in 2028.
- **9. Sport sponsorship for 2025-26.** The committee reviewed and discussed new sport sponsoring members and their placement in their respective regions.
- 10. Committee and regional advisory committee (RAC) rosters. The committee reviewed the national and regional advisory committee rosters and noted upcoming vacancies on the regional advisory committees. There will be one new member on the national committee for the upcoming year.
- 11. 2026 annual meeting. The committee agreed to meet virtually on June 15-16, 2026.


