- Mini-trophies will be presented to the top three individual place finishers in each discipline.
- The most outstanding performer will receive an individual trophy.

Credentials

The following credentials will be distributed at registration Wednesday, March 6:

- Each participating student-athlete will receive a student-athlete credential.
- Each participating coach will receive a coach credential. There is a maximum of two for each qualified team and a maximum of one for an institution with only individuals qualified.
- Sports information directors should request a Media credential at ncaa.com/media.

Drug Testing

NCAA championship committees, following a recommendation from the NCAA drug-testing subcommittee, have discontinued the practice of announcing whether drug testing will be conducted at NCAA championship events.

Although knowing prior to competition whether NCAA drug testing was to occur had value for reasons of convenience, it left open the possibility that student-athletes might be tempted to use banned substances if they knew that NCAA testing was not being conducted at the site of competition.

Therefore, all coaches and student-athletes should presume that NCAA drug testing will occur at this championship event. Please inform your student-athletes that in the event they are notified of their selection for drug testing, the student-athlete must inform an official representative of your institution (e.g. coach, athletics trainer) before proceeding to the drug-testing site. Student-athletes will be reminded by the courier to contact their team representative.

Elite 90 Award – NCAA Academic Recognition Program

The Elite 90 award is presented to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade-point average competing at the finals site for each of the NCAA's 90 championships. Each institution that has at least one student-athlete qualify for the finals round/site is eligible to nominate a student-athlete to win the award for that championship. All ties are broken by number of credits completed. All documents, including eligibility, deadlines and nomination forms, are available at <u>Elite 90 forms</u>. The submission deadline for nomination for Men's and Women's Rifle is **5 p.m. Eastern time Wednesday, February 27.**

Media Information

For the Rifle Championships, we ask that coaches and student-athletes be available for interview requests by any media in attendance. These interviews, of course, will be conducted at appropriate times before or after competition times, or during break periods. The requests will be handled through the WVU Athletic Communications office. The requested coach and/or athlete will be contacted to set up a time.

Photos will be taken immediately after the awards ceremony on Saturday of the teams and individuals receiving awards.

<u>Internet Access</u>. Wireless access is available at the Coliseum using the network WVU Press (password = We\$tVirgini@). Access to this network is limited to coaches, student-athletes and media.

<u>Media Credentials</u>. The NCAA shall control the issuance of media credentials for each of its championships. Subject to limitations of space, media credentials shall be assigned in accordance with the following priorities:

- 1. Campus media certified by the director of athletics and/or sports information director of each participating and host institution; and
- 2. Certified media from the immediate locale of the championship or the immediate locale of the competing teams, and other certified media.
- 3. Those interested in receiving a media credential should submit an application online at ncaa.com/media.

<u>Game Programs</u>. IMG College will develop the championships program in a digital format. The digital programs are designed to be accessed on smart phones, tablets and computers. At the conclusion of the championship, the digital programs will be updated to reflect the results of the competition and hard copies can be purchased as a keepsake from the championship. Results. Game stories, results and other information as it pertains to the championships, will be located on NCAA.com.

Medical/Athletic Training Information

The athletic training room, located inside WVU Coliseum, will be open 45 minutes prior to the first practice/competition each day and close approximately 30 minutes after the last practice/competition. If necessary, additional arrangements may be made by contacting the host athletic trainer, Amelia Adams at 304-293-3372 or adams18@mail.wvu.edu.

The athletic training room is fully equipped with electrical stimulation, hydrocollator packs, and warm/cold whirlpool. If you are traveling without an athletic trainer, a physician's prescription or a note from the head athletics trainer will be required for the use of electronic stimulation or ultrasound. Ice will be provided. A certified athletic trainer will be on site throughout the weekend. Sideline water and emergency equipment will be available.

Misconduct/Failure to Adhere/Sportsmanship/Sports Wagering

<u>Misconduct Statement</u>. Misconduct in an NCAA championship is any act of dishonesty, unsportsmanlike conduct, unprofessional behavior or breach of law, occurring from the time the championship field is announced through the end of the championship, that discredits the event or intercollegiate athletics. Each games committee shall hold an administrative meeting with the representatives of participating institutions to review and explain the policies related to misconduct.

<u>Failure to Adhere to Policies and Procedures</u>. A governing sport committee may assess a financial penalty against an institution for failure of any of its representatives to adhere to the policies and procedures governing the administration of the competition. This includes, but is not limited to, failure to comply with the procedures and deadlines for submitting scores, score sheets, schedules, rosters and entry/march-in forms for qualification and other materials necessary for the efficient administration of the competition.

<u>Hearing Opportunity</u>. An act of misconduct may be found upon an administrative hearing granted to the student-athlete or the institutional representative involved by the governing sports committee or the games committee authorized to act for it.

Misconduct Incident to Competition. If the act of misconduct occurs during the competition, under normal circumstances the individual shall be allowed to complete the competition in which he or she is participating at the time of the incident. An administrative hearing shall be held at the conclusion of the day's competition, during a break in the continuity of the championship (e.g., between rounds of a basketball tournament) when no competition is being conducted or at the conclusion of the championship. However, if the act of misconduct is so flagrant that it obviously violates the principles of fair play and sportsmanship, the games committee may immediately withdraw the student-athlete or institutional representative from the competition and conduct the hearing after this action. Other acts of misconduct may be dealt with at the governing sports committee's convenience.

Sportsmanship. The primary goal of the rules is to maximize the safety and enjoyment of the student-athlete. Sportsmanship is a key part of that goal. Sportsmanship should be a core value in behavior of players and bench personnel, in crowd control by game management and in the officials' proper enforcement of the rules governing related actions.

<u>Sports Wagering</u>. The NCAA defines sports wagering as putting something at risk – such as an entry fee or a wager – with the opportunity to win something in return. The NCAA opposes all forms of legal and illegal sports wagering on college sports. Student athletes and athletics administrators cannot place a sports wager for any NCAA-sanctioned sport. This includes wagering on the intercollegiate, amateur or professional level.

A student-athlete involved in sports wagering on the student-athlete's institution permanently loses all remaining-regular season and postseason eligibility in all sports. A student-athlete who is involved in any sports wagering activity that involves college sports or professional athletics, through Internet gambling, a bookmaker, a parlay card or any other method employed by organized gambling, will be ineligible for all regular-season and postseason competition for at least one year.

In championships in which a bracket format is used, student-athletes, coaches and administrators may not participate in bracket competitions where there is both a required entry fee and an opportunity to win a prize. Student-athletes and administrators may participate under current NCAA rules, in bracket contests where there is no entry fee but a possibility of winning a prize. Some NCAA member schools, however, have chosen to ban student-athletes from participating in these types of bracket contests.

Meetings

<u>Coaches Meeting</u>. The NCAA Rifle Committee and host personnel will conduct a mandatory meeting with coaches and athletic administrators of the participating institutions. The meeting will be held at 12:15 p.m. Thursday, March 7, in room 251 of the Coliseum. This meeting will serve to review tournament procedures.

Parking

Parking will be available for free to all participants, working personnel and guests in the lots surrounding the WVU Coliseum.

Patches

Each participant will receive one NCAA blue disk patch. The preferred location for the patch is on the upper arm sleeve of your dominant hand. Use of the NCAA patch for NCAA championship participants has been endorsed by the NCAA Division I Competition Oversight Committee as a way to recognize the elite level of play that your student-athletes have attained.

Souvenir Merchandise

Championship merchandise, provided by Event 1, will be on sale in the main concourse throughout the tournament. Items will be sold Thursday – Saturday during the championships. The deadline to submit preorder for championship apparel is 11 p.m. Eastern time, Thursday, March 7.

For 2018-2019, an online gift-suite will serve as the participation awards provided to members of the official travel party of institutions that advance to the championship final sites.

After the championship, MainGate will send the head coach an email providing ordering process details, along with a unique Certificate Code (valid for one participation award per member of your official travel party) that can be redeemed only at www.NCAA-Awards.com. In order to ensure that each participant receives his or her award, a member of your administration must place your team's order, including size information, at NCAA-Awards.com using your Certificate Code.

Your institution may select different items per participant; men's and women's sizes are available for apparel items. If you would like to purchase additional awards, you will have the opportunity to do so online via personal credit card at the end of the checkout process.

Participation award items will be sent to your institution for distribution to your student-athletes within four to six weeks after your order is placed. Team Equipment

Storage.

Equipment will be stored for each team and each individual qualifier in WVU Coliseum in the team locker rooms. This area will be monitored during the day and locked and guarded by overnight security personnel beginning on Thursday, March 7.

Transportation/Travel Information/Reimbursement

<u>Transportation</u>. All transportation needs will be the responsibility of the participating teams.

<u>Travel Information</u>. Please review the NCAA travel polices <u>here</u>.

Reimbursement. Transportation and per diem will be paid for the official travel party of teams and individuals at the championships finals site. Travel reimbursement, per diem rate and allowable days are outlined in the NCAA travel policies.

Team expense reports should be filed online through the NCAA Travel Expense System (TES). The login information for the system is the same as that used for the Short's travel portal. The system can be accessed at https://web1.ncaa.org/TES/exec/login?js=true

All institutions, including hosts, must complete the online reimbursement process in order to receive the appropriate reimbursement.

Uniforms

All uniforms must meet the provisions of Bylaw 12.5.4(b) regarding commercial identification. All uniforms must conform with USA Shooting rules as well as NCAA Rifle Rules Modifications.

Logos. An institution's official uniform and all other items of apparel (e.g., socks, headbands, T-shirts, wristbands, visors or hats, and towels) that are worn by student-athletes in competition may bear a single manufacturer's or distributor's normal trademark, not to exceed 2½ square inches, including any additional material (e.g., patch) surrounding the normal trademark or logo.

The logo or trademark must be contained within a four-sided geometrical figure (i.e., rectangle, square or parallelogram). In addition, an institution's official uniform cannot bear a design element similar to the manufacturer's that is in addition to another logo or that is contrary to the size restriction.

A student-athlete representing an institution in intercollegiate competition is limited to wearing apparel items that include only the logo (not to exceed 2½ square inches) of an apparel manufacturer or distributor. The student-athlete may not wear any apparel that identifies another entity other than the student-athlete's institution. These restrictions apply to all apparel worn by student-athletes during the conduct of competition, which includes any pregame or postgame activities.

This bylaw will be strictly enforced at all NCAA championships and the names of individuals and institutions that are not in compliance with this bylaw shall be forwarded to the NCAA enforcement staff.

The logo restriction on student-athletes' apparel set forth in 12.5.4 shall apply during NCAA championships to all personnel (e.g., coaches, trainers, managers) who are on the team bench or competition area for practices and games or who participate in news conferences.

Also, the logo restriction on student-athletes' apparel as set forth in 12.5.4 shall apply to commercial logos on uniforms worn by band members, cheerleaders, dance team members and the institution's mascot during NCAA championship events.

Venue

Competition will take place at WVU Coliseum on the campus of West Virginia University in Morgantown, West Virginia.







APPENDIX F – RANDOM EQUIPMENT CHECK PROCEDURES

The NCAA Rifle Committee will perform random equipment checks during the 2019 NCAA Rifle Championships in Morgantown, West Virginia. Student-athletes are highly encouraged to take advantage of the pre-match equipment check.

<u>Goal</u>: To ensure student-athletes are in compliance with current equipment and clothing standards as established by the NCAA.

Process:

- 1. A minimum of 25% of the student-athletes participating will be randomly selected for equipment re-check once a schedule relay of competition has concluded.
- 2. The NCAA liaison or his designee will draw random point numbers amounting to a minimum of 25% of the student-athletes on the firing line.
- 3. The secretary rules interpreter will select an appropriate number of items to be re-checked from the list on the match equipment control form.
- 4. After a competition relay has started the designated NCAA committee representative will present to the chief range officer a list of firing points of student-athletes selected for inspection.
- 5. As soon as the student-athlete on the selected firing points have completed the competition, a range officer (or designee) will immediately escort that student-athlete along with their shooting equipment to the designated area for post competition exam.
- 6. If a student-athlete is found to be using equipment which does not pass the post competition equipment check, a minimum of three jury members will convene to determine the extent of the violation and the penalty to be levied against the student-athlete found in violation.
- 7. It is the intent of the NCAA rifle committee that should the jury determine a student-athlete is in violation they should be disqualified from the match.
