1. <u>2023-24 Committee Members.</u> Starting August 1, 2024, the composition will include ten members which must include one from the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12 and SEC; three members from the seven highest ranked conferences using the success factor (not including the previously mentioned four) and the final three slots will be from the remaining conferences. A minimum of 50 percent of the committee members must be administrators.

- 4. 2023 Championship. The championship provided for a 64-team tournament which was in the second year of a pilot program which allowed the committee to seed the top 32 teams. After seeding the top 32 teams, the committee ensured no teams from the same conference would play each other in the first two rounds. The teams are paired in the first round using geographic proximity of the top 32 teams versus the bottom 32 teams. All preliminary-round competition was held on the campus of one of the participating institutions.
