



NCAA SOCCER VIDEO REVIEW



REVIEWABLE PLAY SITUATIONS:

1. Determining whether the entire ball passed over the goal line, which includes end of period timing issues;
2. Correcting timing errors;
3. Determining whether a fight or violent behavior occurred and identifying all participants;
4. Correctly identifying players for disciplinary matters;
5. Determining if a direct free kick foul committed by the defending team took place in the penalty area;
6. Determining if an offense punishable by a penalty kick has occurred;
7. Determining whether a straight red card (not a second caution) should have been issued (the referee can upgrade the call to a straight red card or downgrade it to a yellow card or a free kick);
8. Determining the proper punishment in cases of stopping a promising attack or denying an obvious goal scoring opportunity (the referee can examine the validity of the decision to call a foul or not and whether the play meets the criteria for denial of an obvious goal scoring opportunity or stopping a promising attack);
9. Determining whether a goal should have been disallowed for an offside offense. This includes plays where the call on the field resulted in an offside call or a goal being awarded(*Note: If the referee has blown the whistle for an offside offense before the ball enters the goal, the play is then not reviewable*);
10. Determining whether the attacking team committed an offense, including offside, prior to or in the process of scoring a goal(*Note: A ball going out of bounds in the build up to a goal is not reviewable*); and
11. Determining whether the attacking team committed an offense, including offside, prior to the award of a penalty kick or a red card for Denial of an Obvious Goal Scoring Opportunity (*Note: A ball going out of bounds in the build up to the penalty kick or red card for DOGSO is not reviewable.*).

During a video review, the referee may only review and change calls involving the reviewable aspects of the play. Calls involving a non-reviewable aspect of the play may not be changed.

NOTIFICATION:

The head coach shall indicate to the nearest official that a coach's challenge is desired by verbally requesting a challenge and signaling by twirling their index finger in a circular motion with the index finger pointing upward. If the notification to challenge is made to one of the officials prior to the restart of play, the challenge shall be permitted even if the officials are not able to stop the game prior to the restart of play
