SUBJECT: Preseason Softball Playing Rules Reminders for the 2024 Season.

As a new playing season is rapidly approaching, we would like to remind you of a few important items for the 2024 season. The 2024 season will be the first year using the 2024 and 2025 NCAA Softball Rules Book, which can be downloaded as a PDF [here](#).

1. 2024 and 2025 Major Rules Changes. The major rules changes for the 2024 and 2025 seasons are available on the NCAA softball playing rules [website](#) under Updates and on the [NCAA Softball Home Plate](#) under NCAA Rules Information.
2. Updated 2024 and 2025 Case Book and Interpretations/Clarifications. The NCAA Softball Rules Committee recently updated the 2024 and 2025 Softball Case Book that contains approved rulings to use as a supplement to the official rules book. The updates reflect the most recent rules changes and game situations that better explain the application and adjudication of the official written rules. The online-only case book is available on the NCAA softball playing rules [website](#) under Competition Rules and on the [NCAA Softball Home Plate](#) under Publications. The NCAA Softball Rules Interpretations and Clarifications document also has been updated and includes guidelines on time between pitches, visible action clocks and one-way communication devices. This document is available on the NCAA softball playing rules website under Updates and the NCAA Softball Home Plate under NCAA Rules Information.
3. Ball Specifications. The requirement to use the new ball with a compression of 275-375 pounds during competition is effective with the 2024 season (January 1, 2024). This rules change was approved in Summer 2021 to standardize ball specifications with the NFHS and USA Softball.
4. Bat List. The current NCAA Approved Softball Bat List (December 11, 2023) is available on the NCAA softball playing rules [website](#) under NCAA Bat Information and on the [NCAA Softball Home Plate](#) under NCAA Bats. The next planned bat list distribution date is April 8.

5. Sideline and Home Run Fences (Rule 2.15). By January 1, 2027, sideline and home run fences constructed of wood, concrete or brick shall be padded. Padding must begin not higher than one (1) foot off the ground and extend to the top of the wood, concrete or brick or six (6) feet from the ground, whichever is shorter. This is required for any field hosting NCAA softball competition.
6. Registration on the NCAA Softball Home Plate Central Hub. The NCAA Softball Rules Committee will continue to utilize the NCAA Softball Home Plate central hub to distribute rules clarifications, announcements and interpretations. Umpiring updates and clarifications also are posted to Home Plate throughout the season.

The Home Plate central hub is now available at www.refquest.com. Head coaches should've received an email from RQ+ inviting them to join the Home Plate central hub and create a password. If you did not receive this email or have additional staff/coaches who would like access, please click the NCAA Softball Home Plate central hub link above and register as a coach at no cost.
