ENTRY INFORMATION

Diving Entries

- Qualification for a diving event must be achieved in bona fide competition. The definition and requirements for meeting bona fide competition is detailed in Rule 9 for the 2021-22 and 2022-23 NCAA Swimming and Diving Rules Book.
- In order to qualify for the diving events at the championships, a diver must participate in his or her respective zone-qualifying meet. In order to qualify to compete in a zone-qualifying meet, the diver must have achieved the qualifying standards for minimum point totals in bona fide competition in each event they want to participate in. The qualifying standards for divers are available online at ncaa.org.
- [DiveMeets](#) will be used at each of the zone diving championships and divers must register online for their respective zone meet in order to be eligible for selection.
- All coaches wishing to enter a diver for consideration for selection to their respective zone diving championship must submit the zone diving entry form by 11:59 p.m. Eastern time, Monday, Feb. 28. Late and/or incorrect submissions will result in a fine of \$500.

Procedures

- All springboard diving events will consist of a preliminary round of six optional dives, including one from each of the five groups plus an additional dive that may be selected from any group. The top 18 finishers from the preliminary round will advance to the final round and will perform a second list of six optional dives, including one from each of the five groups plus an additional dive that may be selected from any group. All dives will be performed in any order without limit on degree of difficulty. Scores on all dives performed by each of the divers in the prelims and the finals shall be used to determine finals placing.
- For platform prelims, each diver will do six optional dives (men), including one from each of six groups, or five optional dives (women), including one from each of five groups, from any competitive platform level (i.e. 5, 7.5 or 10 meters), in any order, without limit on degree of difficulty. The top 18 finishers from the preliminary round will advance to the final round and will perform a second list of six optionals (men) including one from each of the six platform groups or five optionals (women) including one from each of five groups. All dives will be performed from any competitive level in any order without limit on degree of difficulty. Scores on all dives performed by each of the divers in the prelims and the finals shall be used to determine finals placing.
- Divers in the finals are allowed to practice during the 10-minute break. The diving order for finals will remain the same, with the non-qualifying divers being removed from the starting order.

SCORING

In all events, preliminary scores will carry forward and be added to the scores in the finals to determine final placement.

Tie-Breaking Procedures at Zone Qualification Meets

In the event of a tie between two or more divers who are vying for a final selection spot from a zone qualifying meet, the tie will be broken by comparing each of the diver's highest score from both their two lists (preliminary and finals). The diver with the highest score would advance to the championships, and the other diver will become the first alternate from that respective zone.

Judges

Panels of judges shall be drawn by the NCAA Diving Sub-Committee members in attendance before the coaches meeting. Panels should be drawn so that all conferences are represented equally, if possible. The panels of judges shall then be presented to all coaches for final approval at the coaches meeting. Any coach wanting to observe the drawing of panels may do so.

RESULTS

Divers will qualify for the NCAA championships based on performances at their respective zone meet.

Qualifying Procedures

The top five female and top four male divers from each event at their respective zone diving championship will be eligible to compete at the NCAA Championships. Additional place finishers in each event at each zone will be eligible based on the number of student-athletes from that zone who finished in the top 16 in

that event at the previous year's contested or completed NCAA Championships. All eligible divers must have achieved the zone qualifying score prior to the NCAA championships in all events they wish to participate.

Optional Entry

Any diver that is eligible to compete as noted above will be allowed to optionally enter any other event(s) at the championships, provided that the diver finished in the top 12 at the same zone meet and has achieved the zone qualifying score for that event prior to the NCAA Championships.

Example

Zone A had two divers finish in the top 16 on 1-meter at last year's NCAA women's championships; therefore, the top seven divers (5+2) would then be eligible to compete at this year's NCAA championships in the 1-meter event. Additionally, those seven divers may dive the 3-meter and or platform events provided they have met the requirements noted above.

Reimbursement Procedure

The reimbursement system for divers who are eligible to compete in the NCAA championships will remain the same as the 2020-21 season qualifying system. Divers will be eligible for reimbursement based on performances at their respective zone meet. The results from the previous year's NCAA championships, along with a priority-placement grid (Figure 1) will be used to determine the total allocated reimbursement spots for each zone. Each zone will receive a minimum of four reimbursements for men and women. These guaranteed reimbursements will fill 20 of the 41 and 20 of the 35 allotted for women and men respectively. The priority-placement grid will then be used to fill the remaining 21 spots for women and 15 for men. All remaining eligible divers that do not receive reimbursement will be allowed to attend the NCAA championships as an institutionally-funded participant.

FACILITY INFORMATION

The University of Michigan athletics department’s Canham Natatorium was originally constructed in 1988, and is home to the University of Michigan men’s and women’s swimming and diving programs, as well as Michigan women’s water polo program. The facility is located at 500 E. Hoover Street, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48104.

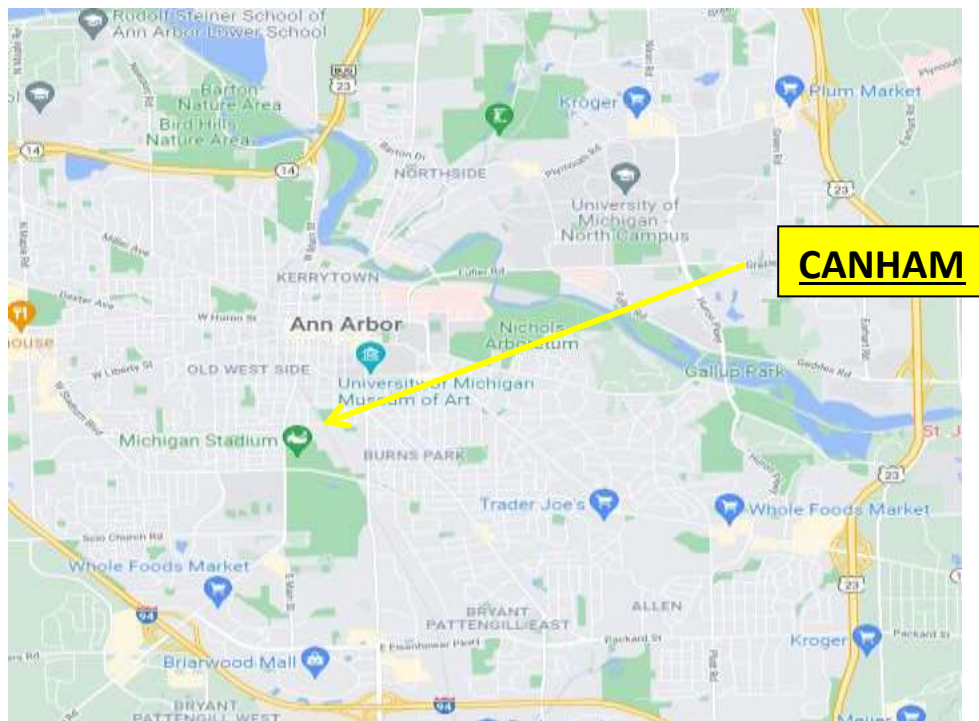
The Dick Kimball Diving Pool is located at the west end of the facility. The diving well is 17 feet deep and has two 1-meter springboards, two 3-meter springboards, as well as 1, 3, 5, 7.5, and 10-meter platforms, water surface sprayers, and a Pulse Air Sparger System.

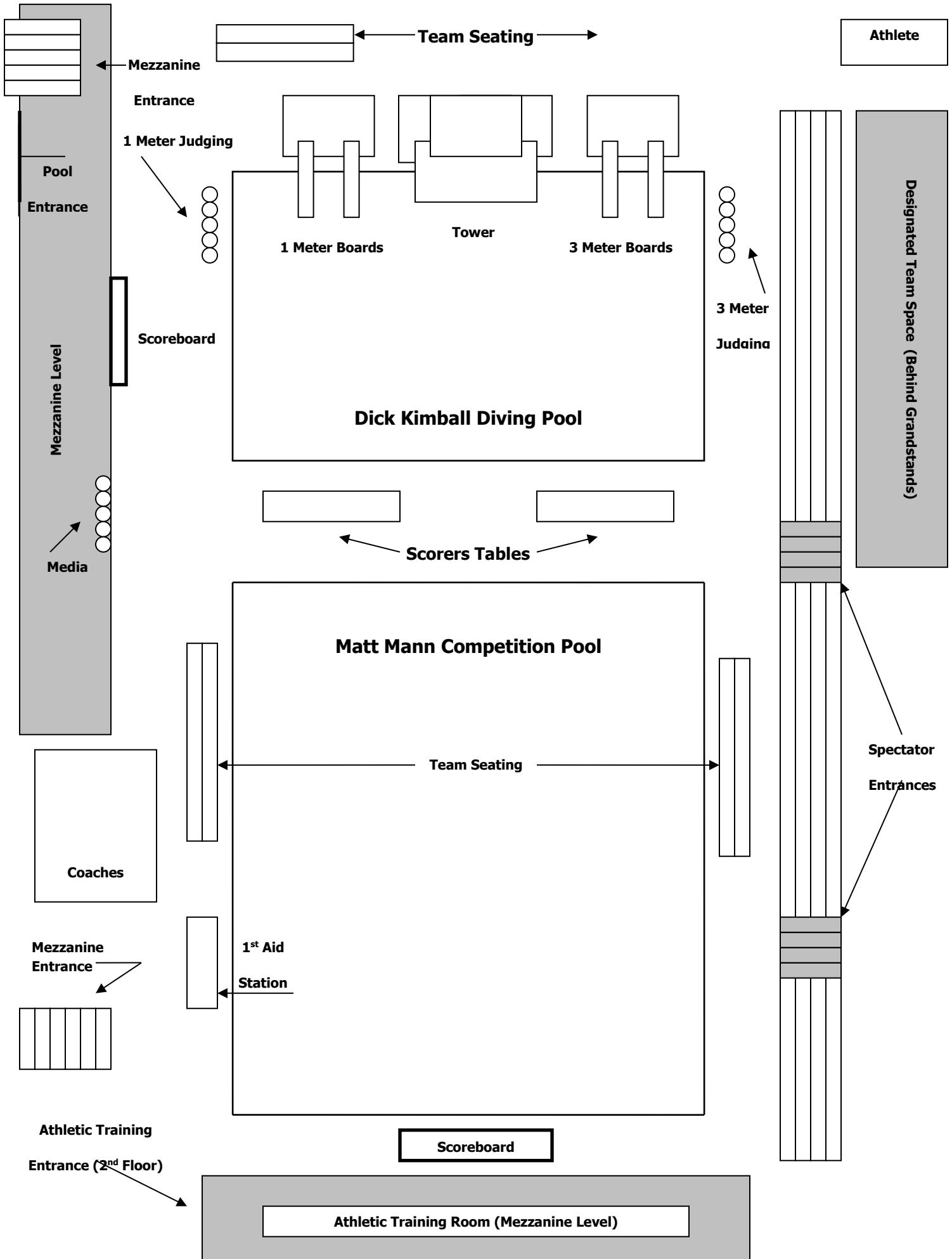
DIRECTIONS TO FACILITY

From Detroit Metro Airport and points east: Take I-94 west to State Street (exit 177). Turn right. Travel north approximately 2 1/4 miles through two stoplights. Turn left just past Yost Ice Arena into parking lot. Canham Natatorium is located at the northwest end of the parking lot, next to the Intramural Sports Building. Canham Natatorium is also accessible from Hoover Street.

From Chicago and points west: Take I-94 east to State Street (exit 177). Turn left. Travel north approximately 2 1/4 miles through three stoplights. Turn left just past Yost Ice Arena into parking lot. Canham Natatorium is located at the northwest end of the parking lot, next to the Intramural Sports Building. Canham Natatorium is also accessible from Hoover Street.

From Toledo and points south: Take U.S. 23 north to I-94 west. Follow directions from Detroit Metro Airport.

Team Parking

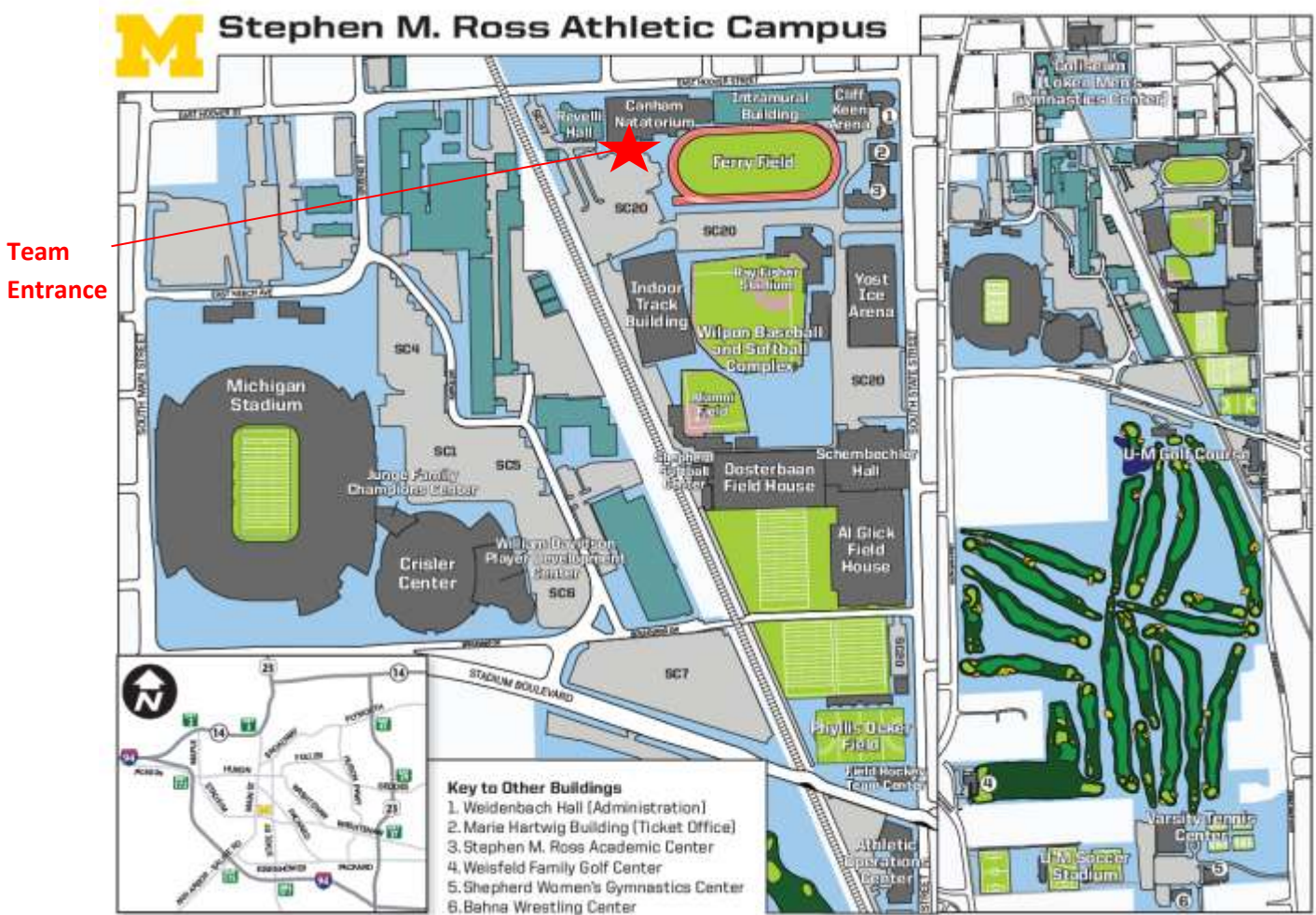
The team entrance to Canham Natatorium is located on the southwest corner of the building. Teams will be directed to Lot SC-20 for parking.

Credentials will gain staff and student-athletes access to areas closed to spectators, such as the pool deck. **Credentials must be worn at all times while on-site.**

MEDICAL INFORMATION

On behalf of the University of Michigan and our athletic medicine staff, we would like to welcome you and your team to Ann Arbor. To assist you with your visit, the following facilities and accommodations will be available.:

The Donald Canham Natatorium Athletic Training Room is located on the second floor of the Natatorium, located directly behind the scoreboard. During the championships, the athletic training room hours will coincide with the hours the pool is open and available for divers.

Pre-Event Medical Briefing:

The University of Michigan holds a Pre-Event Medical Briefing prior to every home athletic event to ensure that all key members of the emergency action plan team are introduced to one another, as well as help produce a decisive, coordinated emergency response and outcome.

Your medical staff's participation in this briefing is expected. The Pre-Event Medical Briefing will take place 30 minutes prior to the beginning of the meet on Monday in front of the control room near the diving well.

Medical Staff Schedule/Availability

- A certified athletic trainer will be in attendance for all practices and competitions. The staff is on call from the arrival of teams to campus and until their departure.

- Primary care physicians will be on call during competition times. They will be available at our athletic medicine clinic. If a physician consultation is needed, please contact the championship medical director .
- EMS will be on site for ALL practice sessions and competition sessions.
- All medical emergencies will be transported to the University of Michigan Hospital Emergency Department.

Medical Services for Teams without an ATC

If your team will be traveling without a certified athletic trainer, your student-athletes requiring treatment must provide written documentation of the desired modality treatment they need signed by either an athletic trainer or team physician. Please contact Dan Meier if your team is not traveling with an ATC, danmeier@umich.edu

Medical Supplies and Equipment

We will have the following medical supplies and services available to you throughout your visit:

- Gatorade and water coolers spaced out throughout the pool deck.
 - Please be sure athletes use their own water bottles. Cups will not be used in an effort to reduce touch points.
- Injury ice, bags, and wrap will be available on the pool deck for your convenience.
- Modalities will be available in the athletic training room located on the second floor behind the main scoreboard .
- We will NOT be having cold ice tubs due to Covid-19 policies.

Injured Athletes

All personnel associated with the medical staff have training in proper use of an automatic external defibrillator and current certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation, training in first aid, and prevention of disease transmission.

Available medical personnel on site:

- Championship medical director;
- Certified athletic trainer;
- Athletic training students ;
- Huron Valley ambulance EMT; and
- Lifeguard.

Student-Athlete injured in the water:

- Natatorium lifeguard staff provides the initial care while the student-athlete is in the water. Lifeguard will perform water extraction as indicated.
- When student-athlete is out of water, the injured student-athlete's athletic trainer will handle care.
- Assistance will be provided by the Championships Medical Director, or designee, as needed.

Emergency Equipment:

- AED Location. There is an AED on deck in the glass control room near dive well. HVA will also have an AED with them as well.
- Splint Bag. There is a splint bag hanging on the wall near the glass control room for appropriate splinting of extremities as needed.

- Spine Board. There is a spine board hanging on the wall near the glass control room for appropriate spine boarding/water extractions as needed.

In the Event of an Emergency:

- EMS will be present throughout all practice and competition sessions.
- EMS will be summoned by the Championship Medical Director or their designee.
- A copy of EAP is located at the end of this informational packet.

UM ATHLETICS COVID-19 POLICIES

Overview:

The University of Michigan adheres to the Covid-19 policies as set forth by the NCAA, Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, and the Washtenaw County Health Department. It is expected that during your stay in Ann Arbor, all student-athletes and staff in your travel party will also adhere to these policies for the safety, health, and welfare of all participants and staff at the NCAA Diving Zones Meet.

Masking Protocols:

Masks must be worn AT ALL TIMES inside the University of Michigan Athletic Facilities. Athletes must wear their masks while on the pool deck and while waiting in line to get up to dive. Masks may then be removed before climbing up onto diving platforms and spring boards.

Testing:

Prior to travel, please follow NCAA guidelines for pre-travel testing of unvaccinated individuals. There will be no requirement for asymptomatic/surveillance testing during your stay in Ann Arbor. If any student-athlete has symptoms related to Covid-19 that develop during the day, we will assist in identifying testing for visiting teams. This will be determined on a case-by-case situation. Close contacts will be referred to other testing locations as needed. Community resources such as IHA Urgent Care, Dominos Farms and/or Ann Arbor Urgent Care may be available to arrange urgent rapid testing. Please communicate with the Championship Medical Director (Dan Meier) via text or call if the need to test arises while in Ann Arbor.

Positive Individuals:

UM Athletics policy aligns with the CDC Covid-19 guidelines. For individuals testing positive, they need to isolate for a minimum of 5 days post-positive test. Positive individuals may end their isolation, in consultation with a member of their respective sports medicine staff, if they are asymptomatic per CDC guidelines. We expect our visiting teams to follow these guidelines or your local public health guidelines. If any positive individual is within their 5 day isolation period, please do not travel him/her. If they are in their day 6-10 isolation timeframe, they should be evaluated and approved by your Team Physician to travel with the team prior arrival in Ann Arbor. Proper masking precautions should be in place for these individuals when out of the pool. We expect all coaches, supporting staff, and athletes to be masked when inside the Donald Canham Natatorium. This is to ensure the safety and health of everyone during the Championship.

Participation of Symptomatic Student-Athletes:

Symptomatic individuals may not have access to our facilities, will not participate, and should follow proper isolation or quarantine guidelines. Please notify the Championship Medical Director of individuals that develop symptoms related to Covid-19 as soon as possible. The Championship Meet Director will assist in coordinating proper care and/or Covid-19 Testing. During your stay in Ann Arbor, the symptomatic individual MUST stay back at the team's respective hotel until a plan for testing has been determined.

MERCHANDISE

Event1 is the official merchandiser for NCAA championships. Merchandise will be available in the Canham Natatorium Lobby. It will remain open throughout the championship.

PROTEST PROCEDURE

- At the coaches meeting, a meet committee must be designated who will hear and decide all protests.
- The diving sub-committee members for each region are automatically on the meet committee; the additional members must be nominated or can volunteer to be part of the meet committee; however, there should be no more than five total meet committee members. If there are more nominations or

volunteers than necessary, names will be drawn out of a hat. The meet committee shall have fair representation (i.e., two coaches from the same conference should not be allowed if there are more than five conferences in the zone, etc.).

- If a protest should occur, the protesting coach should find a member of the meet committee to turn in the protest form.
- Protests must be received within 30 minutes of the final diving results of that particular event. (See the protest form at the back of this manual.)
- A member of the meet committee must call Michelle Perry (317-460-4680 or John Bugner (317-522-7220) to communicate what the protest entails.
- The meet committee will review and vote on the protest; if a protesting coach is involved with the meet committee, they should remove themselves from discussion and voting. (Determine if there should be an alternate selected for the meet committee in case this situation occurred so there would always be five total members and eliminate opportunity for a tie vote?)
- The meet committee will communicate back to the protesting coach what action they agreed upon. All protests are final once action has been taken.

UNIFORMS

Regulations regarding uniforms for divers are detailed in Rule 3 of the 2021-22 and 2022-23 NCAA Swimming and Diving Rules Book. **If a student-athlete competes in an illegal swimsuit, that student-athlete shall be disqualified from that event.**

VIDEOTAPING

Videotaping for personal use is permitted if it does not interfere with spectators or media. Each participating team is permitted to have one person tape competition with a single camera for institutional purposes only. Flash photography is prohibited.
