On behalf of Indiana University, we are thrilled to welcome all participating student-athletes, coaches, fans, and officials to the 2023 NCAA Zone C Diving Championship event on our beautiful Bloomington campus.

This year's event will be contested at the Counsilman-Billingsley Aquatics Center, one of the premiere swimming and diving facilities in the country. Opened in 1996, the facility has hosted some of the nation's most prestigious swimming and diving events, including nine Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championship competitions and three previous NCAA Zone C Diving Championships.

The facility is named after two of the most iconic names in the history of swimming and diving. Former IU Swimming Coach James 'Doc' Counsilman and legendary IU Diving Coach Hobie Billingsley combined to lead the IU program to six consecutive NCAA Championships from 1968-73 and a staggering twenty straight Big Ten titles from 1961-80. Each Hall of Fame coach also enjoyed tremendous coaching successes on the international level, with Counsilman coaching the U.S. Olympic team in 1964 and 1976 and Billingsley guiding the U.S. team in 1968, 1972, and 1976. Each revolutionized their sport, and their influence is still evident to this day.

Congratulations to all the participants for qualifying for the NCAA Zone C Diving Championships. I recognize the commitment that comes with competing at this level, and I applaud your dedication and effort in earning this opportunity. Indiana University welcomes you and wishes you, your teammates, and your coaches the best of luck in your pursuit of a spot in the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championship competitions later this month.

ENTRY INFORMATION

Diving Entries

- Qualification for a diving event must be achieved in bona fide competition. The definition and requirements for meeting bona fide competition is detailed in Rule 9 for the 2021-22 and 2022-23 NCAA Swimming and Diving Rules Book.
- In order to qualify for the diving events at the championships, a diver must participate in his or her respective zone-qualifying meet. In order to qualify to compete in a zone-qualifying meet, **the diver must have achieved the qualifying standards for minimum point totals in bona fide competition in each event they want to participate in.** The qualifying standards for divers are available online at ncaa.org.
- [DiveMeets](#) will be used at each of the zone diving championships and divers must register online for their respective zone meet.
- All coaches wishing to enter a diver into their respective zone diving championship must submit the zone diving entry form by 11:59 p.m. Eastern time, Monday, Feb. 27. Late and/or incorrect submissions will result in a fine of \$500.

Procedures

- All springboard diving events will consist of a preliminary round of six optional dives, including one from each of the five groups plus an additional dive that may be selected from any group. The top 18 finishers from the preliminary round will advance to the final round and will perform a second list of six optional dives, including one from each of the five groups plus an additional dive that may be selected from any group. All dives will be performed in any order without limit on degree of difficulty. Scores on all dives performed by each of the divers in the prelims and the finals shall be used to determine finals placing.
- For platform prelims, each diver will do six optional dives (men), including one from each of six groups, or five optional dives (women), including one from each of five groups, from any competitive platform level (i.e. 5, 7.5 or 10 meters), in any order, without limit on degree of difficulty. The top 18 finishers from the preliminary round will advance to the final round and will perform a second list of six optionals (men) including one from each of the six platform groups or five optionals (women) including one from each of five groups. All dives will be performed from any competitive level in any order without limit on degree of difficulty. Scores on all dives performed by each of the divers in the prelims and the finals shall be used to determine finals placing.
- Divers in the finals are allowed to practice during the 10-minute break. The diving order for finals will remain the same, with the non-qualifying divers being removed from the starting order.

SCORING

In all events, preliminary scores will carry forward and be added to the scores in the finals to determine final placement.

Tie-Breaking Procedures at Zone Qualification Meets

In the event of a tie between two or more divers who are vying for a final selection spot from a zone qualifying meet, the tie will be broken by comparing each of the diver's highest score from both their two lists (preliminary and finals). The diver with the highest score would advance to the championships, and the other diver will become the first alternate from that respective zone.

Judges

Panels of judges shall be drawn by the NCAA Diving Sub-Committee members in attendance before the coaches meeting. Panels should be drawn so that all conferences are represented equally, if possible. The panels of judges shall then be presented to all coaches for final approval at the coaches meeting. Any coach wanting to observe the drawing of panels may do so.

RESULTS

Divers will qualify for the NCAA championships based on performances at their respective zone meet.

Qualifying Procedures

The top five female and top four male divers from each event at their respective zone diving championship will be eligible to compete at the NCAA Championships. Additional place finishers in each event at each zone will be eligible based on the number of student-athletes from that zone who finished in the top 16 in that event at the previous year's contested or completed NCAA Championships. All eligible divers must have achieved the zone qualifying score prior to the NCAA championships in all events they wish to participate.

Optional Entry

Any diver that is eligible to compete as noted above will be allowed to optionally enter any other event(s) at the championships, provided that the diver finished in the top 12 at the same zone meet and has achieved the zone qualifying score for that event prior to the NCAA Championships.

Example

Zone A had two divers finish in the top 16 on 1-meter at last year's NCAA women's championships; therefore, the top seven divers (5+2) would then be eligible to compete at this year's NCAA championships in the 1-meter event. Additionally, those seven divers may dive the 3-meter and or platform events provided they have met the requirements noted above.

Reimbursement Procedure

The reimbursement system for divers who are eligible to compete in the NCAA championships will remain the same as the 2021-22 season qualifying system. Divers will be eligible for reimbursement based on performances at their respective zone meet. The results from the previous year's NCAA championships, along with a priority-placement grid (Figure 1) will be used to determine the total allocated reimbursement spots for each zone. Each zone will receive a minimum of four reimbursements for men and women. These guaranteed reimbursements will fill 20 of the 41 and 20 of the 35 allotted for women and men respectively. The priority-placement grid will then be used to fill the remaining 21 spots for women and 15 for men. All remaining eligible divers that do not receive reimbursement will be allowed to attend the NCAA championships as an institutionally-funded participant.

Once all of the zone diving championships have concluded, and not later than Sunday, March 12, the list of selected divers will be posted on ncaa.org. Institutions with divers selected to the championships will be notified by the NCAA national office. Additionally, for the full list of divers eligible to compete at the finals site that includes the institutionally-funded divers, please refer to the DiveMeets site.

FACILITY INFORMATION

Councilman-Billingsley Aquatics Center is located in the Student Recreational Sports Complex (SRSC) on Law Lane between Eagleson Avenue and Union Street.

The year 1996 marked the beginning of a new era with the opening of the Councilman-Billingsley Center in the Student Recreational Sports Center.

The Councilman-Billingsley Aquatics Center features an eight-lane Olympic-sized pool spanning 30,512 square feet with depth ranging from seven to eight feet to allow for greater speed. It is complete with one of the country's few indoor diving towers, features two one-meter and three-meter springboards as well as one-, three-, five-, seven- and 10-meter platforms.

Indiana also utilizes its outdoor pool for training purposes. The outdoor pool features a 10-lane, 50-meter pool along with a separate diving well. In addition to the outdoor pool, the Hoosiers' outdoor diving facility features two three-meter boards, one-, three-, five-, seven-and-a-half and 10-meter platforms and a hot tub.

The C-BAC features nearly 3,500-square feet of spectator seating provides optimum comfort and sight lines for fans. Also, locker rooms for Indiana's varsity water polo and swimming and diving squads, as well as the visiting team, are housed at the facility along with on-deck coaches' offices.

The facility has hosted a number of events including the 1996, 2001 and 2012 NCAA Zone C Diving competition, the 1997, 1999, 2002 and 2006 Big Ten Men's Swimming and Diving Championships, Junior Nationals and the 1998, 2001, 2005 and 2011 Big Ten Women's Swimming and Diving Championships. The Councilman-Billingsley Aquatics Center played host to the United States National Team during the 2004 season. The Hoosiers played the Olympic team as it traveled across the U.S. on a college tour.

The site has also hosted the 2000 and 2002 Water Polo National Championships. The facility played host to the College Water Polo Association (CWPA) Eastern Championship for the first time in 2005 when the Hoosiers advanced to the finals. Indiana has twice hosted the CWPA Western Division Championship. The Hoosiers played host to the championship in both 2006 and 2009.

1. Take the Indiana SR 45 North, Indiana SR 46 East, Bloomington Exit
2. Merge onto Indiana SR 45/46 and continue for approximately 3.4 miles.
3. Turn right onto 10th St and continue for approximately 0.4 miles.
4. Turn right onto N. Union Street and continue for one block.
5. Turn left onto N. Law Lane and continue for approximately 0.25 miles.
6. Turn right onto the driveway leading up to SRSC/CBAC parking lot.

From the Southeast via Interstate 65 (North Bound)

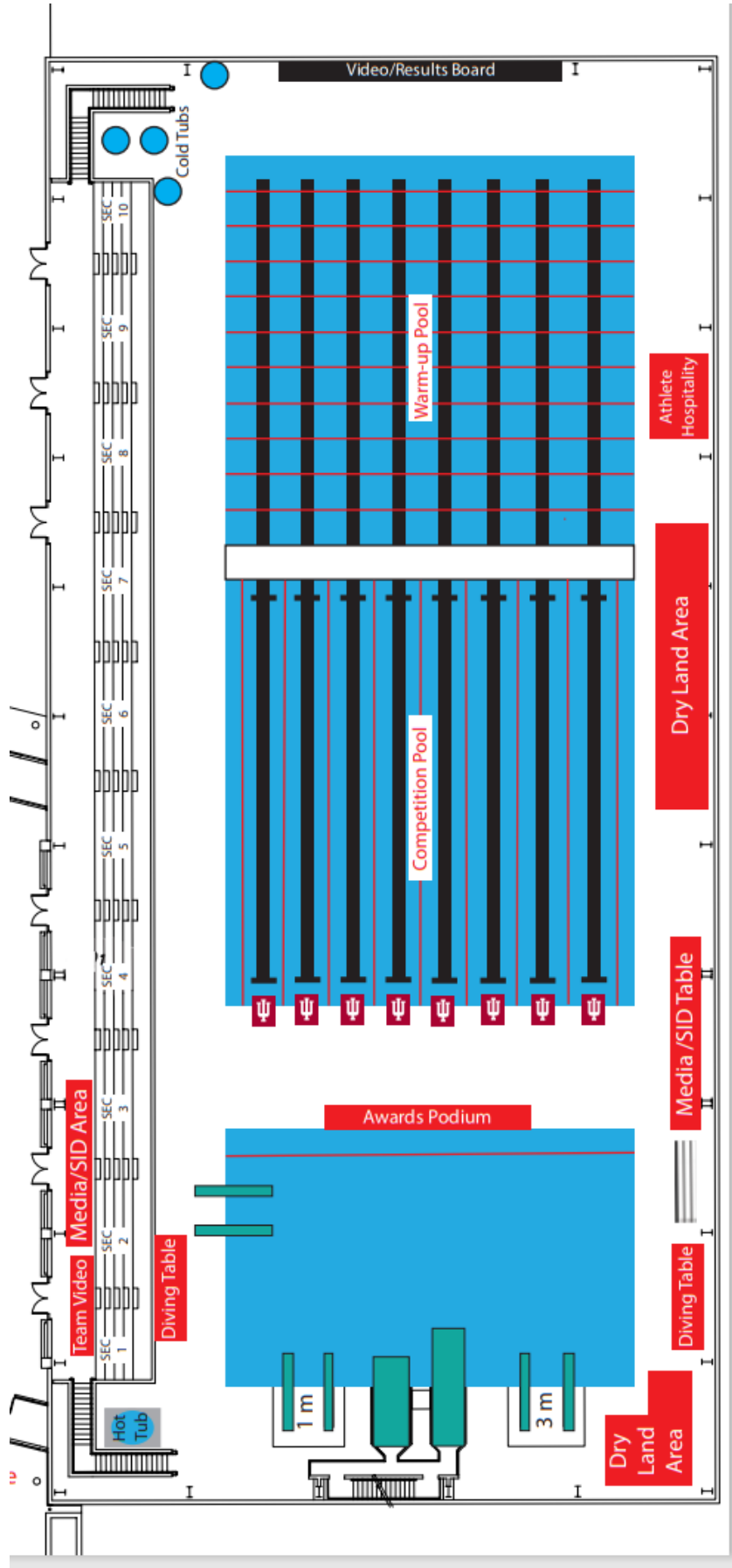
1. Take exit 68 towards IN-46 W / W Jonathan Moore Pike
2. Keep left at the fork, follow signs for IN-46 W / Nashville / Bloomington
3. Turn left onto IN-46 W / W Jonathan Moore Pike and continue to follow IN-46 W
4. Turn left onto IN-46 W / W Van Buren St and continue to follow IN-46W
5. IN-46 turns into E 3rd St .
6. Turn right onto IN SR 45/46
7. Turn left onto East 10th St.
8. Turn right onto N. Union Street and continue for one block.
9. Turn left onto N. Law Lane and continue for approximately 0.25 miles.
5. Turn right onto the driveway leading up to SRSC/CBAC parking lot.

From the Southwest via Interstate 69

1. Take I 69 into Bloomington, where it turns into IN SR 37.
2. Merge onto Indiana SR 45/46 and continue for approximately 3.4 miles.
3. Turn right onto 10th St and continue for approximately 0.4 miles.
4. Turn right onto N. Union Street and continue for one block.
5. Turn left onto N. Law Lane and continue for approximately 0.25 miles.
6. Turn right onto the driveway leading up to SRSC/CBAC parking lot.

From the West via Indiana 46 (East Bound)

1. Stay on Indiana SR 46 as it merges with Indiana SR 45 and continue for 3.4 miles.
2. Turn right onto 10th St and continue for approximately 0.4 miles.
3. Turn right onto N. Union Street and continue for one block.
4. Turn left onto N. Law Lane and continue for approximately 0.25 miles.
5. Turn right onto the driveway leading up to SRSC/CBAC parking lot.



TEAM PARKING / ENTRANCE

Participant Parking

There will be limited parking at the IU Counsilman-Billingsley Aquatic Center. Participants will also be able to park at the east end of the Eigenmann lot and the Avenue Garage.

Fan Parking

There will be both paid and free parking available for fans. Paid parking will be located at the SRSC parking lot off of Law Lane and in the East Parking Garage. Parking rate will be \$10 for the entire day. In addition, free parking will be available in limited amounts on the east end of the Eigenmann lot. Access to this lot is off of N. Jefferson Street. Fans will be able to park in any space unless it is marked 24-hour reserved.

Building Entrance

Teams will enter on the lower level through the loading dock entrance on the south side of the building off of Law Lane. Fans will enter through the main entrance on the south side of the building off of Law Lane. Handicapped fans can enter through the main entrance on the north side of the building. MEDICAL INFORMATION

The CBAC Athletic Training Room is located off the pool deck through the set of double doors and to the left on the bleacher/office side of the pool. Upon exiting the second set of doors, the athletic training room is to your left on the other side of the hallway. It will be available for your use during the championship meet (see hours below). It is equipped with a hydrocollator, ultrasound/stim units, ice/ice bags, taping supplies, and general athletic training supplies. There will be an IU Athletic Trainer available in the athletic training room during practice and competition sessions should you need any assistance. If your team will not be traveling with a Certified Athletic Trainer, our staff will only administer treatments when the athlete presents a written prescription from your staff athletic trainer and/or team physician.

Host Athletic Training/Physician Coverage

At least one Certified Athletic Trainer will be present throughout the entire meet (hours listed above). Our Head Team Physician, Dr. Michael LaGrange, or another Team Physician, will be available during competitions and on an on-call basis. We will have normal clinic hours in the South End Zone Sports Medicine facility (8:00 AM – 12:00PM and 1:00PM – 4:30PM). If an athlete needs to see Dr. LaGrange or other physician, please contact Aaron Mourey at (715) 571-5642 or Jordan Nash-Boulden at (623) 238-9615.

Host Emergency Medical Plan

First Responder:

- If athlete is still in the water/diving well, Lifeguard staff will act as first responder to remove the athlete from the water and onto the pool deck.
- Once the injured athlete is on pool deck, the Sports Medicine Team Athletic Trainer will be first responder.
- If additional care is needed, the trainer signals a game management staff member.
- Game Management, in conjunction with the SRSC staff will contact 911 and escort the EMT/Paramedic staff, into the building if not already present.
- Student Athletes will be transported to IU Health Bloomington Hospital on Discovery Parkway.

Home Athlete Injury:

- A representative from Indiana University will go with the student- athlete to the hospital.
- Parents may ride in the ambulance with the student-athlete at the discretion of the ambulance driver.
- The Indiana University Athletic Trainer will contact the Head Athletic Trainer and Team Physician once the athlete has been stabilized and transported.
- The Game Management Staff will contact Jeremy Gray, Sr. Associate Athletic Director and Sport Administrator.
- Jeremy Gray will contact Scott Dolson, Vice President and Director of Athletics, if needed.
- The Game Management Staff will assist parents in getting to the hospital as needed.

Visiting Athlete Injury:

- If a visiting team student-athlete is injured, the visiting team determines what representative, if any, will go with the student-athlete to the hospital.
- Parents may ride in the ambulance with the student-athlete at the discretion of the ambulance driver.

 - Physician kit (suture kit, etc.).
2. Telephone locations in/around the competition pools.
- Land-line telephones are found in five locations.
 - a. Pool deck offices.
 - b. Athletic Training Room office.
 - c. Meet Management room.
 - d. Wet Classroom.
 - e. Lifeguard Office located in the Leisure Pool.
3. Medical facilities available for the championships.
- Student-athlete health care is provided at IU Health Bloomington Hospital. For medical emergencies and urgent medical issues that may arise during the championships, IU Health Bloomington Hospital will be the contact hospital. This facility is located 0.6 miles from the Councilman-Billingsley Aquatic Center. IU Health Bloomington Hospital will be used for emergent and urgent medical care (x-rays, MRI, clinical examinations, laboratory work). IU Health Urgent Care is also available for less urgent medical concerns between the hours of 8:00 AM – 8:00 PM (6:00 PM on Saturday/Sunday).
- a. **Directions to IU Health Bloomington Hospital:**
 - (1) From the main entrance on Madison Street, turn LEFT onto Burlington Street, heading west.
 - (2) Continue heading west on Burlington St., passing through traffic lights and crossing Riverside Drive/Hwy 6.
 - (3) Burlington St. changes into Grand Ave. Proceed up Grand Ave. entering into traffic circle.
 - (4) Enter traffic circle and take the first exit, stay left and proceed toward parking attendant booth that will provide access to parking at the UIHC ETC. The Emergency Treatment Center will be straight ahead.
 - b. **Directions to IU Health Urgent Care - Bloomington:**
 - (1) From the main entrance on Madison Street, turn LEFT onto Burlington Street, heading west.
 - (2) Continue heading west on Burlington St., passing through traffic lights and crossing Riverside Drive/Hwy 6.
 - (3) Burlington St. changes into Grand Ave. Proceed up Grand Ave. entering into traffic circle.
 - (4) Enter traffic circle and take the second exit onto South Grand Avenue (in front of the UI Field House).
 - (5) Turn RIGHT onto Melrose Avenue, heading west. Stay on Melrose Ave. past the UIHC, Kinnick Stadium, through University Heights, past University Athletic Club and Finkbine Golf Course (1.5 mi.).
 - (6) At the corner of Melrose Ave. and Mormon Trek Blvd. turn RIGHT.
 - (7) Turn left onto Prairie Meadow Drive (0.2 mi.).
 - (8) The UI Sports Medicine Center will be straight ahead on the left (0.2 mi.)

MERCHANDISE

Event1 is the official merchandiser for NCAA championships. Merchandise will be available at South Lobby starting 90 minutes prior to the start of the day's events. It will remain open throughout competition.

PROTEST PROCEDURE

- At the coaches meeting, a meet committee must be designated who will hear and decide all protests.
- The diving sub-committee members for each region are automatically on the meet committee; the additional members must be nominated or can volunteer to be part of the meet committee; however, there should be no more than five total meet committee members. If there are more nominations or volunteers than necessary, names will be drawn out of a hat. The meet committee shall have fair representation (i.e., two coaches from the same conference should not be allowed if there are more than five conferences in the zone, etc.).
- If a protest should occur, the protesting coach should find a member of the meet committee to turn in the protest form.
- Protests must be received within 30 minutes of the final diving results of that particular event. (See the protest form at the back of this manual.)
- A member of the meet committee must call Paige Newman (317) 778-9808 or John Bugner (317) 522-7220 to communicate what the protest entails.
- The meet committee will review and vote on the protest; if a protesting coach is involved with the meet committee, they should remove themselves from discussion and voting. (Determine if there should be an alternate selected for the meet committee in case this situation occurred so there would always be five total members and eliminate opportunity for a tie vote?)
- The meet committee will communicate back to the protesting coach what action they agreed upon. All protests are final once action has been taken.

UNIFORMS

Regulations regarding uniforms for divers are detailed in Rule 3 of the 2021-22 and 2022-23 NCAA Swimming and Diving Rules Book. **If a student-athlete competes in an illegal swimsuit, that student-athlete shall be disqualified from that event.**

VIDEOTAPING

Videotaping for personal use is permitted if it does not interfere with spectators or media. Each participating team is permitted to have one person tape competition with a single camera for institutional purposes only. Flash photography is prohibited.
