SUBJECT: Diving Results Reporting Process and Championships Entries for the 2023-24 Season.

**Swimming coaches, please pass this information on to your diving coaches.**

The NCAA Division II Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving Committee is providing this memorandum to outline for diving coaches information specific to submission of regular-season qualifying diving results and championships entries for the 2023-24 season.

The results reporting process for diving during the 2023-24 season will be as follows: Each diving coach will be required to complete and email the official qualifying diving results form along with dive sheets within 72 hours after conclusion of the diving competition at which the qualifying score was achieved to Kerstin Hunter, NCAA coordinator, at [khunter@ncaa.org](mailto:khunter@ncaa.org). The official diving results form may be accessed on the Division II swimming and diving page of the [NCAA website](#). **Reminder: For a diver to qualify for the qualification meet, two qualifying scores from separate meets must be submitted over the course of the season. One of these scores must be for 6 optional dives, the other for 11 dives.** Additionally, coaches must verify all calculations on handwritten or hand typed dive sheets before submitting them to the NCAA. **Dive sheets containing calculation errors or missing signatures will not be included in the top diving report used for entry into the qualification meet.** On review of the diving results form and corresponding dive sheets, Kerstin Hunter will acknowledge receipt by return email.

To participate in the qualification meet and the national championships on one-meter and/or three-meter boards, a diver must have achieved the minimum point total along with the established minimum degrees of difficulty in the prescribed format within the qualifying period in bona fide competition, per the 2023-24 qualifying standards. The acceptable methods for qualifying are limited to the 11-dive and 6-optional-dive formats for both boards. In addition, there is a minimum degree of difficulty on the 6 optional dives for each board and each gender. This requirement applies to both 11- and 6-optional-dive formats.

Fines/Penalties. Failure to follow the meet results reporting procedures could jeopardize a team's or an individual's eligibility for championships selection. Institutions that do not adhere to the procedures outlined above for the submission of regular-season results may be assessed a financial penalty of \$400 per team/individual. The maximum penalty amount is up to the swimming and diving committee's discretion, subject to approval by the NCAA Division II Championships Committee. An institution assessed such a financial penalty must make payment to the NCAA national office before the institution's team or individual(s) will be allowed to compete in the national championships.

Diving Qualification Meet. To advance to the national championships, a diver must participate in the qualification meet, which will be conducted Tuesday, March 12, at the SPIRE Institute in Geneva, Ohio.

Championships Diving Competition Format. As a reminder, the championships preliminary round will use the 11-dive format only; in the final round, the format will continue to include 6 optional dives and 11 dives.

In addition, a consolation final will be conducted to ensure that those who placed 9-16 after the preliminaries have the opportunity to place higher than their first-round result.

The [www.divemeets.com](http://www.divemeets.com) diving management system will again be used for the qualification and championships meets. Each qualifying diver must register online with divemeets.com by the entry deadline which is 11:59 pm, Eastern time, Monday, Feb. 26. More information will be posted on the [NCAA Division II swimming and diving web page](#) in January regarding the DiveMeets registration process.
