REPORT OF THE NCAA DIVISION III MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SWIMMING AND DIVING COMMITTEE JUNE 7-8, 2022, MEETING

ACTION ITEMS.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

- **1. Review of agenda.** The committee reviewed the agenda for the meeting and made no adjustments.
- **2. Review of 2021 annual meeting report**. The committee reviewed and approved the 2021 annual meeting report as presented.
- **3. Review of Division III Championships Committee reports**. The committee reviewed reports from the past year and agreed that no follow-up discussion or action was needed.
- **4. Diving regional review**. The committee reviewed the diving regional setup for qualification, noting concerns and improvements that can be made. No actions will be taken prior to the 2023 diving regionals, but the committee will continue to look at improving the events. The committee noted concerns over practices taking place during competition, scoring panel setups, regional manuals, judging selections, hiring judges, waivers, flighted warm-ups, and securing sites interested and willing to host.
- **5. Review of championships.** The committee reviewed the championships in Indianapolis and discussed improvements and changes that should be carried over to Greensboro in 2023. Overall, the championship was a success after two straight canceled championships. Indianapolis did an amazing job, and the committee looks forward to returning in 2026.
- 6. Discussion of action plan for 2023 (Greensboro). As part of its preparations for the 2023 championships, the committee noted items implemented that helped improve the 2022 championships that it will want to continue for 2023, including the new seating process, improvements to the officials selection process, increasing the number of volunteers as compared to previous events at Greensboro, and minor changes to select operations that will be outlined in the participant manuals (cooldowns, backstroke flags, lane assignments for warm-ups, etc.).

7. Review selection process.

a. Number of individuals/relays. The committee continues to evaluate expanding the men's cap and is conducting a more comprehensive examination of the equity between the men and women. The committee took no action during the meeting but will continue considering a proposal for increasing the men's cap this year in anticipation of implementing the increase in 2023-24.

- **b. 2022-23 qualifying standards.** The committee reviewed and approved the 2022-23 qualifying standards.
- 8. Site review/future sites.
 - a. 2023, 2024, and 2025 Greensboro, North Carolina. The championships will take place at the Greensboro Aquatic Center on March 15-18, 2023; March 20-23, 2024; and March 19-22, 2025.
 - **b. 2026 Indianapolis, Indiana.** The championships will take place March 18-21.

9. Committee.

- **a. Annual meeting.** The 2023 annual meeting will be in person and is scheduled for June.
- **b. Selection of 2022-23 committee chair.** The committee elected Leslie Shelvin, Willamette University, as chair in 2022-23.
- **10. Manuals review**. The committee will review the pre-championships, participant and host operations manuals over the fall, and NCAA staff will incorporate the recommended modifications as necessary along with the regular yearly updates.
- **11. Sponsorship lists championships access ratio**. The committee discussed schools that are potentially adding men's and/or women's swimming and diving.
