CHECKLIST

- Contact Short's Travel Management, the NCAA travel service, at 866-655-9215 to make air travel arrangements. Teams located within 500 miles of the competition site are required to travel via ground transportation. If extraordinary circumstances warrant an exception to the established travel policies, you must contact the NCAA's travel department at 317-917-6757 or travel@ncaa.org for approval prior to making any travel arrangements. All travel policies, including information on travel party numbers, are located on the [NCAA website](#).
- **REMINDER:** Advancing teams may update their lineup order of strength before finals site competition (but they may not change the 15 student-athletes on their lineup form, solely the order, according to ITA rules). This is optional; if no changes are made, the original line up will carry forward. Coaches can start making changes to their lineups for the finals site beginning at 9 a.m. Eastern time, Wednesday, May 13. Final site lineup submission deadline is **6 p.m. Eastern time, Friday, May 15**
- Coaches can review other finals teams' lineups and submit any challenges to the NCAA national office beginning at 9:15 a.m. Eastern time, Thursday, May 14. The deadline for challenge submissions for the finals site is 11 p.m. Eastern time, Thursday, May 14.

Elite Scholar-Athlete Award

The NCAA Elite Scholar-Athlete award honors the exceptional achievements of student-athletes. This prestigious accolade is given to those who have not only excelled at a national championship level in their sport but have also achieved the highest academic standards among their peers. The Elite Scholar-Athlete award is proudly awarded to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative GPA at the finals site for each of the NCAA's championships.

COACHES MEETING

The NCAA coaches meeting will be held virtually on Wednesday, May 13, at 1 p.m. Eastern. A Microsoft Teams link will be provided to all teams in advance of the call. All head coaches are required to attend.

DRUG TESTING

The drug-testing program involves collecting urine specimens from student-athletes at various times throughout an NCAA championship. Student-athletes may be selected for drug testing based on their place of finish, position and/or an approved random selection method. A student athlete may be selected for drug testing on more than one occasion during the championship event. All urine specimens provided by student-athletes are analyzed by a World Anti-Doping Agency accredited laboratory and the results are then reported to the institution's director of athletics.

The WADA laboratory analyzes each urine specimen for substances and related compounds from a list of banned-drug classes developed by the NCAA Executive Committee. Refer to the 2025-26 NCAA Drug-Testing Program booklet on the [NCAA website](#) for the published list of banned drug classes and the procedural guidelines for testing. Athletic administrators are urged to review the NCAA Drug Education and Testing video, the NCAA Banned Drug Classes List as well as the NCAA Drug-Testing Program booklet with all coaches and student-athletes in advance of any NCAA championship or postseason certified event. Student-athletes who test positive as a result of a drug test administered by the NCAA or who breach the NCAA drug-testing program protocol shall lose one year of eligibility and shall be charged with the loss of a minimum of one season of competition in all sports.

At team championships, student-athletes who are selected for drug testing must fulfill all media obligations before reporting to the drug-testing area.

Participant notification – Announcing in advance whether drug testing will be conducted at a championship is strictly prohibited. All coaches and student-athletes should presume that post event NCAA drug testing will occur at the championship event. Couriers will notify student athletes of selection for drug testing.

LINE-UPS

Teams advancing to the championship's finals site, may change the nine (9) student-athletes on their lineup as long as they are part of the twelve (12) student-athletes listed on the team's original lineup form. All lineups must comply with ITA order-of-ability rules, and the Games Committee serves as final authority on all lineup decisions.

Lineups will be available for changes beginning Wednesday, May 13 at 9:00 a.m. ET, with a submission deadline of Thursday, May 14 at 9:00 a.m. ET. Lineups will be posted at 9:15 a.m. ET on the [NCAA Tennis Championship Administration webpage](#). The challenge deadline is Thursday May 14 at 11:00 p.m. ET, with written responses due Friday, May 15 at Noon ET. The Committee will review challenges at 2:00 p.m. ET, and final lineups will be posted by 6:00 p.m. ET on Friday, May 15.

A final lineup confirmation call will take place on Monday, May 18 at 3:00 p.m. Mountain time to address injury, illness, or extenuating circumstances, subject to Games Committee approval. Following this call, lineups will be considered final.

LODGING

EACH PARTICIPATING TEAM WILL BE ASSIGNED TO ONE OF THE TEAM HOTELS.

Blocks of rooms (five doubles and two kings per team) have been reserved for each of the teams advancing to the finals site at the hotels listed below. When making your reservation, please identify which rooms will be designated for student-athletes and which be assigned to coaches. Additional rooms may be available after all teams have made housing arrangements but are not guaranteed. Teams needing more hotel rooms than the allotted number will need to reach out to the hotels specifically after **5 p.m. Eastern time, on Thursday, May 14.**

A final list of teams will be sent to the hotels once both Rounds of 16 participants have been determined. After the preliminary rounds for both genders, advancing teams will receive an email that will include their hotel assignment for the finals site. Advancing institutions are responsible for contacting their assigned hotels on **Wednesday May 13** to make all payment arrangements and provide the hotel with a rooming list by no later than **5 p.m. Eastern time, Thursday May 14.**

Breakfast at each hotel will start at 6:00 a.m. (local time) for the duration of the championships.

It is mandatory for participating institutions to stay at the designated team hotel they are assigned to.

OFFICIALS

Officials are selected by the NCAA Division II Men's and Women's Tennis Committee and are supervised throughout the tournament by the co-chief umpires. The co-chief umpires will meet with the officials daily and make arrangements accordingly. These will be closed meetings.

PARKING

Free parking is available at the Surprise Tennis & Racquet Complex. Drivers are requested to assume only one space per vehicle. Please be courteous to all the participants by refraining from playing loud music once entering the park. Overflow parking will be in the gravel lot adjacent to the facility.

The NCAA will provide a student-athlete memento for participants in NCAA championship competition. PRACTICE SCHEDULE AND POLICIES

Practice policies:

Practice times and courts will be assigned according to the brackets and seeding. Practice time frames can be found in the Schedule of events on page 14-15. **Practice on the competition courts is not permitted outside of scheduled assignments. Practice balls must be provided by the participating teams and individuals.**

Women’s team practices will take place between 8:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. Eastern Time on Monday, May 18 at Surprise Tennis and Racquet Center, the day prior to competition. Courts will be available to women’s competing student-athletes only. Courts and times will be assigned by the committee following selections and advancements.

Men’s team practices will take place between 3:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Practices cannot start before the women’s first round of competition concludes on Tuesday, May 19. The committee will communicate with men’s coaches if practices need to be pushed back due to the women’s first round matches. Courts will be available to men’s competing student-athletes only. Courts and times will be assigned by the committee following selections and advancements.
