

REPORT OF THE NCAA WOMEN'S WRESTLING COMMITTEE JULY 7, 2025, VIDEOCONFERENCE

ACTION ITEMS.

- 1. Legislative items.
 - None.
- 2. Nonlegislative items.
 - Regional assignments.
 - a. <u>Recommendation</u>. Assign institutions to one of the six regions as specified in the Attachment.
 - b. Effective date. Immediate (to be established for the inaugural championship in 2026).
 - c. <u>Rationale</u>. With the recent approval of six regions, the committee discussed the model in which teams will be assigned to a region. Among the committee's goals was to balance the number of teams per region as closely as possible while adhering to geographical proximity. The committee will review these assignments annually as sport sponsorship grows, but members believe this recommendation represents a good starting point.
 - d. <u>Estimated budget impact</u>. For women's wrestling regionals, institutions are responsible for all travel (this includes transportation, food and lodging), so the only budget impact would be for each individual school to travel to their respective regional, which in some cases may mean a flight. The committee will continue exploring ways to increase the number of qualifiers, which could increase the number of regions, which in turn could create fewer teams per region and help create smaller geographic regions, subsequently reducing travel for some of the participating institutions along with lower travel costs.
 - e. <u>Student-athlete impact</u>. The regions are proposed with the intent to mitigate travel as much as possible. In some cases there will be flights, but overall it keeps a good balance of the teams across the regions. This format would allow for more opportunities for student-athletes and continued growth of the sport.


