



**REPORT OF THE
NCAA DIVISION I CABINET
JUNE 23-24, 2026, VIDEOCONFERENCE**

KEY ITEMS.

1. **NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2026-44 – Athletics Eligibility – Age-Based Eligibility Model.** The NCAA Division I Cabinet [adopted Proposal No. 2026-44](#) as emergency legislation. The proposal establishes that individual's period of eligibility for practice and competition shall be limited to five years. An individual's five-year period of eligibility begins with the earlier of the following:

- (a) The regular academic term (semester or quarter) of an academic year in which the individual enrolls in a collegiate institution (domestic or foreign; see NCAA Bylaw 14.02.4) in a minimum full-time program of studies and attends a class in that term while enrolled full time; or
- (b) The beginning of the regular academic year immediately after the individual's 19th birthday.

Timing of 19th Birthday. The cabinet determined that for an individual who turns 19 years old on or after September 1, the period of eligibility begins at the start of the subsequent academic year, unless the individual enrolls full time in a collegiate institution earlier.

Effective Date. August 1, 2026; may be applied to student-athletes with eligibility remaining (seasons and period of eligibility) who initially enrolled full time in any collegiate institution before August 1, 2026. May be applied to student-athletes who initially enroll full time in any collegiate institution in the 2026-27 academic year (Current rules may be applied to student-athletes who enrolled before or enroll during the 2026-27 academic year; however, no waivers will be available.) Applicable to student-athletes who initially enroll full time in any collegiate institution in 2027-28 and thereafter.

2. **Proposal No. 2026-27 – Playing and Practice Seasons – Men's Soccer – Redistribution of Men's Soccer Playing Season Model.** The Division I Cabinet remanded Proposal No. 2026-27 to the NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Oversight Committee for further review. The cabinet acknowledged the Men's Soccer Oversight Committee's efforts to modernize the sport's calendar in a way that supports the growth of the sport as well as the historical support by men's soccer student-athletes. However, the cabinet charged the oversight committee to provide clarification of the impact of the redistributed playing season model in certain areas. Specifically, the cabinet requested additional clarity on the impact of midyear enrollees on the redistributed playing season, and how broad institutional scheduling flexibility will impact championship selection criteria, particularly for institutions that limit regular season competition to one term. Additionally, the cabinet requests more information on the model's impact on institutional media agreements.

ACTION ITEMS.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

1. **Preenrollment Professional Participation.** The cabinet discussed issues related to the review of preenrollment professional participation legislation. The cabinet supports the establishment of consistent and objective standards for participation in Division I intercollegiate athletics. The cabinet will continue to discuss the issues and potential legislative concepts during future meetings.
2. **Eligibility of Initial Midyear Enrollees.** The cabinet reviewed issues related to the eligibility of student-athletes who initially enroll midyear. The cabinet will continue to discuss issues related to midyear enrollees during its upcoming meetings.
3. **Policies Related to the Use of Commercial Trademarks and Logos in NCAA Championships Competition.** The cabinet received an update on the development of the policy for use of trademarks or logos on student-athletes' uniforms and apparel during NCAA championships. The cabinet continues to emphasize the importance of establishing a flexible policy.
4. **Division I and Football Bowl Subdivision Reclassification Decisions.** The cabinet approved active Division I membership and FBS membership status for institutions that successfully completed the applicable reclassification process, as recommended by the NCAA Division I Membership Committee and NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision Oversight Committee.
5. **Proposal No. 2026-45 – Governance Structure and Committees – Updated Division I Legislative Processes.** As recommended by the NCAA Division I Legislative Processes Subgroup, the cabinet introduced Proposal No. 2026-45 into the October 2026 legislative cycle to establish a legislative process that supports the goals of the new Division I governance structure.

Rationale: The NCAA Division I Decision-Making Working Group referred to the Division I Cabinet the development of the legislative processes necessary to support the new Division I governance structure. The new structure necessitated a review of the governance pilot processes that had been in place since the 2023-24 academic year. The enhancements in this proposal maintain several components of the pilot process, while incorporating elements intended to increase efficiency and effectiveness of the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advocacy Committee, NCAA Division I Athletics and Eligibility Committee, Division I Membership Committee and the NCAA Division I sports oversight committees.

Effective date: Immediate, starting with the January 2027 legislative cycle.

6. **Proposal No. 2026-46 – Governance Structure and Committees – National Collegiate Championship Sports Committees – Composition Requirements.** The cabinet introduced Proposal No. 2026-46 into the October 2026 legislative cycle to amend the

composition requirements of National Collegiate Championship sports committees as follows:

- (a) Conference Representation. Each committee shall include a voting member from each of the conferences named in Bylaw 21.2.1-(a) that sponsors the sport.
- (b) Division I Student-Athlete Representation. Each committee shall include one Division I student-athlete as a nonvoting member.
- (c) Nonvoting Members. Each committee may include additional nonvoting members, as determined by the committee (e.g., coaches association representative, secretary rules editor, national coordinator of officials).

Rationale: The Division I Decision-Making Working Group referred to the Division I Cabinet the review of the composition and areas of authority of National Collegiate Championship sports committees in the new Division I governance structure. A cross-divisional review of National Collegiate Championship sports committees found changes to the committees' composition would be beneficial in the new Division I governance structure.

Effective date: Immediate.

- 7. **Other Legislative Actions.** Other proposals addressed and legislative actions taken by the cabinet are listed below, effective on the dates specified. Additional Legislative actions are detailed in Attachment A and voting results are available in Attachment B.
 - a. **Proposal No. 2026-37 – Playing and Practice Seasons – Bowl Subdivision Football – First Contest Date and End of Playing Season.** The cabinet adopted Proposal No. 2026-37 as expedited legislation to specify that, in bowl subdivision football, an institution shall not play its first contest with outside competition before the Thursday preceding the Saturday that is 14 weeks before the first Saturday in December and to eliminate all first contest date exceptions. The proposal is effective August 1, 2027.
 - b. **Proposal No. 2026-38 – Recruiting – Notification of Transfer – Field Hockey - Undergraduate Window.** The cabinet adopted Proposal No. 2026-38 as expedited legislation to specify that, in field hockey, an undergraduate student-athlete may initiate the notification of transfer process during a 30 consecutive-day period beginning the Tuesday after the Division I Field Hockey Championship game, or May 1-15. The proposal is effective immediately.
 - c. **Proposal No. 2026-40 – Athletics Eligibility – Two-Year College and 4-2-4 Transfer Requirements.** The cabinet adopted Proposal No. 2026-40 as expedited legislation to revise the eligibility requirements for a two-year college and 4-2-4 transfer student-athlete. The proposal is effective immediately.

- d. **Proposal No. 2026-41 – Playing and Practice Seasons – Men’s Wrestling – First Date of Competition – 20 Weeks Prior to Championships Finals.** The cabinet adopted Proposal No. 2026-41 as expedited legislation to specify that, in men’s wrestling, an institution shall not engage in its first date of competition (game or scrimmage) with outside competition before the Friday of the 20th week prior to the Division I Men’s Wrestling Championship finals. The proposal is effective immediately.
- e. **Proposal No. 2026-42 – Playing and Practice Seasons – Women’s Volleyball – First Contest Date.** The cabinet adopted Proposal No. 2026-42 as expedited legislation to specify that, in women’s volleyball, an institution shall not play its first contest with outside competition until the Thursday preceding the Saturday that is 15 weeks before the first Saturday in December, and to eliminate the first contest date exception for the AVCA Showcase. The proposal is effective immediately.
- f. **Proposal No. 2026-43 – Recruiting – Women’s Lacrosse – First Opportunity for Recruiting Activities.** The cabinet adopted Proposal No. 2026-43 as expedited legislation to establish, in women’s lacrosse, 12:00 pm Eastern time on September 1 of an individual’s junior year of high school as the time for recruiting activities to begin on the first permissible date. The proposal is effective immediately.
- g. **Proposal No. 2026-62 – Governance Structure and Committees – Association-Wide Committees – Awards Committee.** As recommended by the NCAA Board of Governors, the cabinet introduced Proposal No. 2026-62 into the October 2026 legislative cycle to eliminate the NCAA Awards Committee. The proposal’s effective date is immediate.
- h. **Proposal No. 2026-50 – Recruiting – Women’s Gymnastics – Undergraduate Notification of Transfer.** As recommended by the NCAA Women’s Gymnastics Committee, the cabinet introduced legislation into the October 2026 legislative cycle to specify that an undergraduate women’s gymnastics student-athlete may initiate the notification of transfer process during a 15-day period beginning the Monday following the conclusion of the NCAA Women’s Gymnastics Championships. The proposal’s effective date is immediate.
- i. **Championships and Postseason Football – National Collegiate Championships – Women’s Flag Football.** As recommended by the NCAA Committee on Access, Opportunity and Impact, the cabinet introduced legislation into the January 2027 legislative cycle to establish an NCAA National Collegiate Women’s Flag Football Championship and the NCAA Women’s Flag Football Committee. The proposal’s effective date is immediate. The Women’s Flag Football Committee would begin its work in January 2027 to prepare for the first NCAA National Collegiate Women’s Flag Football Championship in spring 2028.

8. **National Collegiate Championship Sports Committees Areas of Authority.** The cabinet amended its policies and procedures, to provide the National Collegiate Championship sports committees additional areas of authority for championship administration.
9. **Update on the Review of Legislative for Decentralization and Deregulation.** The cabinet received an update and provided feedback on the decentralization of Bylaw 17. The cabinet amended the timeline for introduction of the proposal to the January 2027 legislative cycle.
10. **Review of Communications with Student-Athletes Before the Opening of the Notification of Transfer Windows.** The cabinet reviewed a concept that would permit institutions to discuss opportunities with “contactable” student-athletes and their authorized representatives during a defined window immediately before a notification of transfer window opens. The cabinet will continue to discuss the concept during future meetings.
11. **Review of Issues Related to Agents.** The cabinet reviewed and provided guidance to staff on issues related to the regulation of agent activities.
12. **NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advocacy Committee Update.** The cabinet received an update from the Student-Athlete Advocacy Committee.
13. **Updates and Discussion on Division I and Association-Wide Issues.** The cabinet received updates from NCAA President Charlie Baker, the NCAA office of legal affairs, and an update on congressional engagement efforts.
14. **Report Of the June 5 Cabinet Meeting.** The cabinet approved the report of its June 5 meeting.
