



**REPORT OF THE
NCAA DIVISION I COUNCIL
APRIL 12-13, 2023, VIDEOCONFERENCE**

In an effort to connect NCAA Division I Council items to the NCAA pillars of academics, fairness and well-being, items included in this report have an identifying pillar. There is an additional pillar, operational, that is used to denote items that relate to maintaining a stable and efficient Division I.

KEY ITEMS.

1. **Holistic Model of Benefits for Student-Athletes.** (Academics/Fairness/Well-Being/Operational) The Division I Council took a positional vote and supported the adoption of legislation to establish a holistic benefits model for student-athletes. The result of the vote and additional feedback will be provided to the NCAA Division I Board of Directors for its consideration to adopt the proposal during its April 26 meeting. The model requires schools to provide specifically guided support under certain circumstances to enhance student-athletes' health and well-being.

2. **Legislative Actions.** (Academics/Fairness/Well-Being/Operational) The Division I Council adopted eight proposals from the 2022-23 legislative cycle and 10 other proposals as noncontroversial legislation. Additional information is included below. All legislative actions are detailed in Attachment A and voting results are available in Attachment B. [Note: Data for some of the roll call voting results was lost due to a technical issue. The overall results of those votes were recorded and preserved.]

[Note: Noncontroversial legislation is final at the conclusion of the Division I Council meeting. Noncontroversial legislation with an immediate effective date is effective April 12, 2023. Standard review legislation (other than noncontroversial and emergency legislation) adopted by the council is not final until the conclusion of the Board of Directors meeting (April 26), during which the board has the opportunity to review the legislation. Such legislation with an immediate effective date is effective April 26, 2023.]

- a. **Student-Athlete Voice in Institutional and Conference Decision-Making.** (Fairness/Well-Being/Operational) The Division I Council adopted NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2013-9, effective August 1, 2023, as noncontroversial legislation to implement the NCAA Division I Transformation Committee's recommendations regarding student-athlete voice in decision-making that were approved in concept by the Division I Board of Directors and additional recommendations that were refined by the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advisory Committee through discussions with the NCAA Division I Council Coordination Committee. The legislation will require student-athlete voices to be included in decision-making at the school and conference levels.

- b. **Football Recruiting Model.** (Fairness/Well-Being/Operational) The Division I Council adopted Proposal No. 2023-14 as noncontroversial legislation in football related to the recruiting calendar, recruiting materials, electronic correspondence, telephone calls, off-campus contacts, off-campus recruiting activities and, in the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision, on-campus evaluations. The model

includes four elements: (1) Revision of the Football Bowl Subdivision and NCAA Football Championship Subdivision recruiting calendars and reduction of the number of off-campus recruiting activities; (2) Modification of the first date to initiate recruiting materials, electronic correspondence and telephone calls to a prospective student-athlete and elimination of the frequency restrictions for telephone calls to a prospective student-athlete; (3) Modification of the first opportunity and frequency of off-campus contacts; and (4) In championship subdivision football, permitting on-campus evaluations for prospective student-athletes, provided certain conditions are met.

c. **Proposal No. 2022-32 – Recruiting – Official and Unofficial Visits.** In its consideration of Proposal No. 2022-32, the Division I Council amended the proposal as follows:

- 1) Reduced, from four to two, the number of individuals accompanying a prospective student-athlete on an official visit who may receive transportation expenses from the institution.
- 2) Specified that expenses may be provided to the stated number of family members who accompany a prospective student-athlete during a visit to campus, rather than to individuals who accompany the prospective student-athlete.
- 3) In men’s basketball, to specify that an institution may provide a prospective student-athlete one official visit from August 1 through July 31 of the prospective student-athlete’s junior year, one official visit from August 1 through October 14 of a prospective student-athlete’s senior year and one official visit beginning October 15 after the completion of high school.

The council then adopted the elements of the proposal related to (A) Changes to the length of an official visit and changes related the limit on the number of official visits a prospective student-athlete may take; (B) Changes related to providing round-trip expenses to up to two family members accompanying a prospective student-athlete on an official visit; and (C) Changes related to entertainment and complimentary admissions during official visits. The council tabled the proposed changes related to unofficial visits.

3. **Moratorium for the 2023-24 Legislative Cycle.** (Operational) The Division I Council established a moratorium on conference-sponsored, council-governance legislative proposals during the 2023-24 legislative cycle. A moratorium on conference-sponsored legislative proposals will allow the membership to focus on the consideration and implementation of the Transformation Committee’s recommendations, including a new decision-making structure and legislative process. Conferences are permitted to submit potential legislative concepts for consideration to council standing committees.

ACTION ITEMS.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

1. **Discussion and Feedback Regarding Division I Transformation Committee Referrals and Recommendations.** (Academics/Fairness/Well-Being/Operational) In addition to actions noted above, the council discussed and offered feedback on the following referrals and recommendations from the Transformation Committee.
 - a. **Roadmap to Transformation.** The Division I Council reviewed a document summarizing the actions taken to date by the Division I Board of Directors based on the Transformation Committee's final report, the entities responsible for executing the actions and the anticipated timeline and preliminary effective dates for implementation. The document will be updated as actions are taken and adjustments are made.
 - b. **Decision-Making Structure.** The Division I Council received updates and discussed the following components of recommendations regarding a revised decision-making structure: (1) Potential development of a sport management committee structure for Division I and National Collegiate Championship sports; (2) Composition and duties of sport championship committees; and (3) A report from the NCAA Division I Legislative Committee Legislative Process Subgroup.
 - c. **Membership Expectations.** The Division I Council received reports from the subgroups working with the NCAA Division I Strategic Vision and Planning Committee to formalize recommendations regarding membership expectations.
 - d. **Expectations Related to Compliance.** The Division I Council received an update on the development of recommendations pertaining to establishing new Division I membership requirements around compliance operations. The recommendations include a periodic review of institutional compliance operations, as well as educating individuals whose responsibilities intersect with NCAA rules compliance.
 - e. **Championships Concepts.** The Division I Council received a report from the NCAA Division I Competition Oversight Committee, which during its April 11 videoconference, reviewed bracketing/seeding concepts that fall within the Transformation Committee's recommendations supported by the Division I Board of Directors in January.

Given a successful pilot initiative conducted for women's soccer and women's volleyball in which 50% of the bracket was seeded, the Competition Oversight Committee recommends that revised bracketing and seeding policies be

implemented for the 2023-24 championships and that each team sport committee choose among the following options that either retain or expand on the pilot's principles:

- **Option A:** The original principles implemented in 2022 for women's soccer and women's volleyball (seed 50% of the bracket).
- **Option B:** Seed 75% of the bracket and keep the remaining teams from returning to the same site in consecutive years.
- **Option C:** Seed 50% of the bracket, divide the remaining teams into pods of three seeds and four seeds, and assign each site a team from each of those pods. In addition, keep the teams in those pods from returning to the same site in consecutive years.

Sport committees have selected the following options based on what they believe is in the best interests of their sports:

The NCAA Women's Gymnastics Committee and the NCAA Division I Women's Lacrosse Committee will use a version of Option B to seed 66% and 55%, respectively, of their brackets due to their structures. The NCAA Division I Football Championship Committee recommends seeding between 50-75% of its bracket and will submit a proposal to the NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committee.

The NCAA Division I Men's Golf Committee and Division I Women's Golf Committee recommend staying with their current policy of seeding 25% of the bracket as it provides the necessary flexibility when assigning teams to sites.

The seeding principles do not apply to men's volleyball, men's and women's water polo, women's beach volleyball, and men's and women's ice hockey. These sports operate outside of the current policy of seeding 25% of the bracket.

The estimated budget impact of implementing these options ranges from \$2-\$4 million due to the availability of charter versus commercial flights, time of year for championship travel, and the number of championships that overlap with travel needs. This recommendation will be forwarded to the NCAA Division I Board of Directors Finance Committee for funding consideration.

- f. **Decentralization Concepts.** The Division I Council offered feedback on concepts the NCAA Division I Legislative Committee Modernization of the Rules Subcommittee is considering related to professional drafts and professional opportunities before and during a student-athlete's collegiate enrollment, as well as concepts regarding the use of agents and team financial aid limits.
2. **NCAA Division I Council Transfer Advisory Group Recommendations.** (Fairness/Well-Being/Operational) The Division I Council approved a recommendation that three Transfer Advisory Group members serve in an advisory capacity to the NCAA Division I Committee for Legislative Relief related to the updated waiver guidelines until the transition to the new Division I governance structure is finalized. Transfer Advisory Group members will engage with the staff and the Committee for Legislative Relief on an as-needed basis as questions of application of the guidelines arise. This action reflects a recognition of the significant changes to the four-year undergraduate transfer waiver guidelines and supports alignment with the intent of the updated guidelines.
3. **Federated Playing Rules Processes.** (Operational) The Division I Council adopted noncontroversial legislation to eliminate the requirement that playing rules shall be common for all divisions of the Association and adopted policies and procedures for rules committees to consider federated rules. The NCAA Constitution allows the divisions to establish playing rules for sport competitions and participation. The policies and procedures follow the previously established process for establishing common rules but allows Division I members of rules committees to consider division-specific input and recommend and vote on division-specific rules proposals. The proposals are reviewed by the NCAA Playing Rules Oversight Panel before becoming final.
4. **Football Reclassification Waiver Request.** (Fairness/Operational) The Division I Council considered and denied an institution's request to waive the second year of the two-year process for reclassifying from the Football Championship Subdivision to the Football Bowl Subdivision.
5. **NCAA Division I Council Working Group on Name, Image and Likeness Update.** (Operational) The Division I Council received an update from the working group, which is discussing whether a meeting with stakeholders in the NIL space is merited to help inform discussions with state and federal legislators.

- 6. Reports from Division I Council Committees.** The Division I Council received reports from its standing committees that included action and informational items. Roll-call vote results of legislative actions are included in Attachment B.
- a. NCAA Division I Men’s and Women’s Basketball Oversight Committees.**
- **Summer Basketball Initiatives.** (Academics/Fairness/Well-Being/Operational) The Men’s and Women’s Basketball Oversight Committees provided presentations regarding their ongoing discussions related to initiatives being considered to increase the presence of college basketball during the summer.
- b. Division I Football Oversight Committee.**
- 1) **Composition of the Football Management Committee.** (Operational) The Football Oversight Committee endorses a future structure that would adequately support Division I football while addressing the unique needs of each subdivision. There is consensus within the Football Oversight Committee for a structure that allows each subdivision to discuss and manage its own subdivisional legislation while continuing to collaborate on issues that impact Division I football. There are unique needs for each football subdivision that may not impact the other subdivision, and it remains important to continue the collaboration between the subdivisions to ensure the overall growth of college football.
 - 2) **April 2023 Survey.** (Operational) The Football Oversight Committee will solicit membership feedback and institutional data on topics such as annual signing and initial counter limits; seasons of competition; institutional limits on official visits; and the individual associated with a prospective student-athlete legislation (FBS only). Responses to guide the review of the 2022 blanket waivers related to annual signing and initial counter limits for a two-year period and increased institutional limits on official visits during the 2022-23 recruiting cycle.
 - 3) **Postseason Football Bowl Framework.** (Operational) The Football Oversight Committee supports maintaining the current football bowl certification framework established in 2017 for slotting postseason bowl opportunities for the FBS conferences, noting that in recent years, the current structure has accommodated all bowl-eligible programs with a postseason bowl opportunity; there continues to be significant transition within bowl subdivision football (e.g., conference realignment, reclassification); and the postseason bowl structure will continue to be evaluated.

c. NCAA Division I Committee on Academics.

- 1) **Transfer Eligibility Requirements.** (Academics/Fairness/Well-Being/Operational) The Division I Council introduced a proposal into the 2023-24 legislative cycle to require a student-athlete to meet all eligibility requirements, including percentage-of-degree requirements, at the previous institution at the time of transfer in order to be eligible to use the one-time transfer. The proposal would be effective August 1, 2024 (applicable to transfer student-athletes seeking eligibility during the 2024-25 academic year and thereafter).

Rationale. This proposal, which is a result of a referral from the Division I Board of Directors, will help ensure that student-athletes continue to focus on academics after they have decided to transfer by requiring that they meet all progress-toward-degree standards, including percentage-of-degree benchmarks. Also, when a student-athlete leaves an institution meeting all progress-toward-degree requirements except the percentage-of-degree benchmark, the institution they are leaving loses the NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate eligibility and retention points. Requiring completion of the percentage-of-degree benchmark would eliminate this inconsistency.

- 2) **Comprehensive Review of the NCAA Division I Academic Performance Program.** (Academics/Fairness/Well-Being/Operational) The Committee on Academics received the final report and approved the recommendations from the ad hoc group charged with conducting a comprehensive review of the APP. The Committee on Academics agreed the APP, in its entirety, has dramatically and positively enhanced the academic success of student-athletes and has been successful in addressing academic underperformance. Accordingly, the Committee on Academics confirmed the value of the APR formula of eligibility and retention in predicting graduation and agreed the current penalty and postseason access model is effective in addressing academic underperformance.
- 3) **Return to Normal APP Operations.** (Academics/Fairness/Well-Being/Operational) The Committee on Academics also finalized the details of the return to normal APP operations after portions of the program were suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The restart will include a four-year average of APR data from 2019-20 through 2022-23. The minimum score for each team to avoid penalties and to be eligible for postseason competition remains 930. The return to normal operations will include the public recognition of high-performing teams. Program penalties and the possible loss of access to postseason competition will resume based on the four-year-cohort scores released in spring 2024. Teams that score below the

benchmark will face penalties that encourage an increased emphasis on academics. Penalties and the loss of access to postseason competition will be announced in spring 2024, and both will be imposed in 2024-25.

- 4) **Impact of Transfer and Name, Image and Likeness.** (Academics/Fairness/Well-Being/Operational) The Committee on Academics continues to monitor the impact of transferring and NIL on student-athlete academic performance. With NIL in particular, there has been an increase in attention given to the types of opportunities being provided to student-athletes in this space. The committee continues to be interested in examining the academic impact, if any, these types of opportunities have on student-athletes moving forward.
- 5) **Feedback on Referrals from the Transformation Committee.** (Operational) At the request of the Board of Directors, the Committee on Academics reviewed and provided its feedback on three concepts.
 - a) **Membership Expectations Around Academic Support.** The Board of Directors asked the committee to consider an APR score that could be used as a benchmark for meeting membership expectations around academic support. The committee did not support implementing a new APR score at this time and is committed to revisiting this in the future when the athletics landscape has stabilized.
 - b) **Transfer Graduation Metric.** The Board of Directors asked the Committee on Academics to consider a legislative concept that would require schools to satisfy a separate graduation metric for a school's cohort of transfer students, which if not met would impact the institution's revenue distribution and/or preclude it from adding transfer student-athletes to its rosters for a specific period. The Committee on Academics did not support the concept and noted the current APR metric accounts for transfer activity and movement. The current APR penalty structure provides the appropriate guardrails and institutional accountability for the academic success of its transfers.
- 6) **Reporting Lines.** (Operational) The Committee on Academics expressed strong support for maintaining its current reporting line to the Board of Directors rather than the proposed shift in the new governance structure in which it would report to the Oversight Council. The committee believes it is important for it to continue to report to the Board of Directors in order to continue emphasizing the primacy of academics.

7. **NCAA Media Rights Update.** (Operational) The Division I Council received a media rights update.
8. **Update from the NCAA President.** (Operational) NCAA President Charlie Baker joined the Division I Council formally for the first time and noted that even several months before officially beginning his tenure on March 1 he has been meeting with many groups within the NCAA membership to hear input on the primary issues facing the Association.
9. **Legal Update.** (Operational) The Division I Council received an update on litigation affecting Division I and the Association overall.
10. **Report of the February Council Videoconference.** (Operational) The Division I Council approved the report of its February 15 videoconference.
