



**INFORMATIONAL ITEMS OF THE
NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE
JUNE 26-27, 2023, MEETING**

Note: This document does not include items incorporated in the NCAA Division I Council report.

KEY ITEMS.

1. **Role of football in NCAA Division I (FBS/FCS).** The Football Oversight Committee continued its discussion from January 2023 on the role of football in NCAA Division I (FBS/FCS). The Football Oversight recommended the Council create the NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision Oversight Committee and NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision Oversight Committee. In addition, the committee discussed the composition and structure of the two football committees that would best reflect the unique needs of each subdivision. Further, the Football Oversight Committee expressed support for the two oversight committees meeting jointly at least twice annually to discuss issues impacting both subdivisions (e.g., recruiting, playing and practice seasons).
2. **Blanket waiver of the annual signing and initial counter limits.** The Football Oversight Committee directed the NCAA staff to extend, through the 2024-25 academic year, the May 18, 2022, blanket waiver that suspended the annual signing (FBS) and initial counter limits (FBS/FCS).
3. **Blanket waiver of football season-of-competition rule.** The Football Oversight Committee directed the NCAA staff to extend, for Football Bowl Subdivision institutions, the December 2022 blanket waiver that permitted student-athletes to participate in up to four contests during the regular season and in postseason competition (conference championship, bowl game, postseason competition, CFP) without using a season of competition through the 2023-24 academic year. The Football Oversight Committee agreed that the newly created NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committees will continue to review football's season-of-competition rule.
4. **Blanket waiver of institutional official visits limit.** The Football Oversight Committee directed NCAA staff to issue a blanket waiver to increase the institutional official visits limit by 14 (from 56 to 70) during the April 1, 2023, to March 31, 2024, recruiting cycle.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

1. **Future initiatives from external football organizations.** The Football Oversight Committee invited the National Football League (NFL) and USA Football representatives to discuss the status of football and the organization's future initiatives.
 - a. **National Football League update.** Troy Vincent, executive vice president of the National Football League, provided an update on current and future initiatives of the NFL, including flag football.
