a. <u>Recommendation</u>. That the NCAA Division I Legislative Committee archive the official interpretation [Reference: 4/16/14, Item No. 10-b] and issue the following official interpretation:

Title: Determination of a Scholastic Team

Date Issued: June XX, 2020 **Date Published:** June XX, 2020

Item Ref:

The Legislative Committee determined that a team of prospective student-athletes is scholastic if:

- a. Its secondary institution has an NCAA Eligibility Center status of "cleared" or "extended evaluation"; or
- b. It is identified on the NCAA Eligibility Center website as having a formal affiliation with a secondary institution that has an NCAA Eligibility Center status of "cleared" or "extended evaluation".

<u>Rationale</u>. During its January 2020 meeting, the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee confirmed the current distinction between scholastic and nonscholastic recruiting periods should be maintained based on the Commission on College Basketball recommendations and longstanding

membership concerns regarding harmful third-party influences in the men's basketball recruiting environment. In response to membership confusion and challenges related to applying the current scholastic team interpretation, the recommended interpretation provides clearer direction and enables the membership to more easily determine whether or not a team of prospective student-athletes is a scholastic team. Finally, the recommended interpretation applies to all sports, providing a consistent approach for the membership when applying the scholastic team legislation and when determining whether or not a coaching staff member is permitted to evaluate a team of prospective student-athletes.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

- 1. **Review of educational column.** The Interpretations Committee reviewed and approved an educational column (determination of a scholastic team) regarding determination of a scholastic team. The educational column will be published provided the NCAA Division I Legislative Council approves the determination of scholastic team official interpretation.
- 2. The Interpretations Committee reviewed a staff Review of staff interpretation. interpretation (athletics staff member involvement in athletics fundraising for high school attended by family member (I)) and agreed to publish an official interpretation. The committee agreed to finalize the official interpretation on a future call. The committee agreed that the interpretation will be clear that it applies to a high school the athletics staff member attended and to a high school that a family member of the athletics staff member currently attends. Further, that the interpretation does not permit an athletics department staff member to fundraise for a high school where a family member of the athletics staff member is employed.
