DIVISION I MEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE  
APRIL 17, 2023, VIDEOCONFERENCE

**ACTION ITEMS.**

- **Legislative Items.**
  - **Number of Official Visits an Institution May Provide a Prospective Student-Athlete.**
    - 1) Recommendation: That the NCAA Division I Council adopt noncontroversial legislation to specify in men's basketball that an institution may provide a prospective student-athlete one official visit before October 15 following completion of high school and one visit beginning October 15 following completion of high school, including a visit related to a possible transfer.
    - 2) Effective date: July 1, 2023.
    - 3) Rationale: The Division I Council modified Proposal No. 2022-32 to continue to permit an institution, in men's basketball, to provide a prospective student-athlete one official visit from August 1 through July 31 of the prospective student-athlete's junior year, one official visit from August 1 through October 14 of a prospective student-athlete's senior year and one official visit beginning October 15 after the complete of high school and requested that the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee review this application to determine whether such an approach is best for men's basketball. The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee determined that the provision of official visits to prospective student-athletes in men's basketball should align with the legislation applicable to all other sports. This recommendation emphasizes the importance of the singular high school official visit experience in the recruiting process by ensuring the visit experience is used to enhance the decision-making process. This proposal is recommended as noncontroversial legislation, inasmuch as broader consultation and debate are unlikely to improve the proposal in any substantial way, significant disagreement or alternative points of view will not be generated and there does not appear to be a significant impact on existing or proposed legislation.
    - 4) Estimated budget impact: None.
    - 5) Student-athlete impact: Potential reduction in time demands associated with hosting a high school prospective student-athlete more than one time.

**INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.**

1. **Update on National Association of Basketball Coaches feedback on College Basketball Summer Initiative draft concept.** The committee received an update on head and assistant coaches' feedback on the College Basketball Summer Initiative draft concept provided at the 2023 NABC Convention at the Men's Final Four. The coaches' feedback was supportive and encouraged the Summer Basketball Initiative Working Group to maintain its approach with a flexible concept. A formal concept survey will be sent to Division I conferences at the beginning

of May 2023 seeking broader membership feedback on the men's and women's summer basketball initial draft concepts. Conferences will be asked to seek feedback from men's and women's basketball student-athletes, coaches and administrators from within their respective conferences. The oversight committee will continue to be updated on membership feedback gathered in the next several months before recommending a final concept to the Council. The committee also received an update on the women's initial summer basketball concept.

- 2. Update from April 12 NCAA Division I Council meeting.** The committee received an update from the April 12 Council meeting on NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2022-6 (Contact Restrictions at Prospective Student-Athlete's Educational Institution When Classes Are in Session), Proposal No. 2022-30 (Limitations on the Number of Coaches and Off-Campus Recruiters – Basketball) and Proposal No. 2022-32 (Recruiting -- Official and Unofficial Visits). The committee also received an update on the NCAA federated playing rules processes.
- 3. NCAA Division I Transformation Committee update.** The committee received an update on the Division I Transformation Committee recommendations, including the Council's support of the adoption of legislation to establish a holistic benefits model for student-athletes and adoption of legislation related to the student-athlete voice in decision-making. The NCAA Division I Council Coordination Committee also continues its discussion regarding the implementation of the Division I decision making structure.
- 4. NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championships and National Invitational Tournament update.** The committee received an update regarding the 2023 Division I Men's Basketball Championships including attendance, television viewership numbers, social engagement, live streams and community engagement events. The committee also received updates from the latest Division I Men's Basketball Committee meeting and the 2023 National Invitation Tournament.

5. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Competition Committee and playing rules update.** The committee reviewed and supported the Division I Men's Basketball Competition Committee's recommendations in the following areas: (1) Uniforms; (2) Altercation protocols and procedures; (3) Made basket followed by an off-ball foul; (4) Live music during dead-ball situations; and (5) Live video on the bench. These recommendations will be provided to the NCAA Men's Basketball Rules Committee during its May 3-5 annual meeting.

The oversight committee also received an update on 2023-24 experimental rule considerations including advancing the ball and a standard media timeout format. Finally, the committee received an update on the continued discussion regarding legal guarding position of a secondary defender, disqualification rules, flopping, shot clock issues, rim testing and permitting religious headgear without a request for a waiver.

6. **NCAA Division I Men's basketball officiating update.** The committee received an officiating update including the officiating performance during the 2023 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament and future areas of emphasis for officials.
7. **NCAA College Basketball Academy update.** The committee received an update on the 2023 NCAA College Basketball Academy including the upcoming May 8 deadline for prospective student-athlete self-nomination. Currently, there are over 1600 prospective student-athletes who have self-nominated for the 2023 Academy. Prospective student-athlete selection for the Academy is done primarily through a NCAA Division I head coach voting process. Conference commissioners and conference men's basketball administrators will receive a letter to send out to coaches encouraging them to vote for nominated prospective student-athletes. Additionally, as part of the Academy's goal to educate and engage participants, various life skills sessions have been identified for participating prospective student-athletes and parents/chaperones. Specifically, NCAA staff and outside stakeholders will conduct two 30-minute life skills sessions for the prospective student-athletes and two 45-minute life skills sessions for the parents/chaperones each day. Topics for the life skills sessions include, but are not limited to, the national letter of intent program, recruiting process, NBA pre-draft process, use of agents and NCAA policy on name, image and likeness.

During the April 21 joint basketball oversight meeting, the men's and women's oversight committees will be asked to review 2024 Academy dates in an effort to move forward with bid specifications from potential host cities.

8. **NABC Convention update.** The committee received an update from the 2023 NABC Convention that was held in Houston at the Men's Final Four. It was noted that the number of registrants increased this year and that sessions were generally well-attended.
9. **Identification of discussion topics for upcoming NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees' joint meeting.** The committee chair noted the upcoming joint Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees' meeting on April 21.
10. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee March 3 videoconference report.** The committee reviewed and approved the committee's March 3 videoconference report.
