



REPORT OF THE NCAA
DIVISION I MEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE
APRIL 21, 2026, VIDEOCONFERENCE

ACTION ITEMS.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

1. **NCAA legal update.** The Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee received a legal update on several items impacting Division I men's basketball.
2. **NCAA Division I Cabinet update.** The oversight committee received an update on key Division I governance issues impacting Division I men's basketball including the collegiate eligibility review, pre-enrollment athletics eligibility, ghost transfers and NCAA Division I Bylaw 17 decentralization.
3. **Individual associated with a prospective student-athlete discussion.** The oversight committee continued its discussion surrounding the individual associated with a prospective student-athlete (IAWP) legislation in men's basketball. The oversight committee discussed the application of IAWP legislation during its review of NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2026-2 (Athletics Personnel and Recruiting – Limitations on the Number of Coaches and Off-Campus Recruiters – Basketball). The committee supported maintaining the current legislation to continue to prohibit the employment of individuals whose primary value is tied to a prospective student-athlete.
4. **Scouting at conference tournaments.** As a result of media inquiries and interpretive questions submitted to the NCAA staff, the oversight committee discussed recent situations in which Division I men's basketball coaches attended other Division I men's basketball conference tournaments. The oversight committee provided its initial support for a legislative concept that would prohibit Division I men's basketball coaches from attending another Division I conference's men's basketball tournament unless an immediate family is participating in the event due to potential recruiting advantages associated with the visibility their attendance creates. The oversight committee will continue its discussion during its May videoconference and consider introducing a legislative proposal into the October 2026 legislative cycle.
5. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Student-Athlete Engagement Group update.** The oversight committee received an update on the recent Men's Basketball SAEG professional development trip to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Final Four in Indianapolis.
6. **National Association of Basketball Coaches update.** The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) provided an update from the NABC Convention, April 2-6, which occurred in Indianapolis during the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Final Four weekend.

7. **Identification of discussion topics for the upcoming NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees' joint meeting.** The committee identified decentralization of Bylaw 17 legislation and scouting at conference tournaments as topics to discuss at the next joint meeting.
8. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Administrative Subcommittee March 24 and April 13 meeting reports.** The oversight committee approved the March 24 and April 13 Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee Administrative Subcommittee meeting reports. In reviewing the reports, the oversight committee also noted its support for the recommendation from the Administrative Subcommittee to temporarily pause work on the review of the outside competition legislation in men's basketball due to the Cabinet's Bylaw 17 decentralization project.
9. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight February 26 meeting report.** The oversight committee approved the February 26 Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee meeting report.
10. **Other business.** The oversight committee reviewed and provided feedback to the NCAA Division I Membership Committee on a legislative relief waiver.
