



**REPORT OF THE NCAA
DIVISION I MEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE
DECEMBER 3, 2024, VIDEOCONFERENCE**

ACTION ITEMS.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

1. Discussion and vote on legislative proposals.
 - a. **NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2024-57 – Athletics Personnel – Limitations on the Number of Off-Campus Recruiters – Men's Basketball.** The NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee adopted Proposal No. 2024-57, in men's basketball, to permit any four of the six men's basketball countable coaches to recruit off campus each day. The adopted proposal is subject to review by the NCAA Division I Council during its January 2025 meeting.
 - b. **NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2024-60 – Legislative Action – Playing and Practice Seasons – Basketball – Summer League Certification – Policies and Procedures.** The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee adopted Proposal No. 2024-60, in men's basketball, to move summer league certification from the legislation to men's basketball oversight committee policies and procedures. The adopted proposal is subject to review by the NCAA Division I Council during its January 2025 meeting.
2. **Review of NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2024-69 – Committees – Sport Championship Committees – Eliminate Regional Representation Requirements.** The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee reviewed Proposal No. 2024-69. The committee provided feedback to the NCAA Division I Council Nominating Committee noting concerns that the current legislation could lead to an over-representation of the western region; however, the proposal could lead to an over-representation of the eastern or other regions. The oversight committee requests clarification on the proposal's ability to maintain a balance for regional representation. Finally, the committee requested information regarding how the proposal would impact conference representation generally. The committee will review the requested additional information during their January 2025 meeting. The Division I Council is expected to vote on this proposal during its January 2025 meeting.
3. **NCAA College Basketball Academy and men's basketball recruiting calendar.** The committee discussed adjusting the current men's basketball recruiting calendar due to the cancellation of the 2025 College Basketball Academy. As an initial concept for consideration, the committee also discussed having both summer evaluation periods mirror each other, running Thursday through Sunday on July 10-13 and July 17-20, 2025. The evaluation periods would not have a time constraint; however, the committee noted events may not tip-off prior to 8 a.m. or after 10 p.m. local time based on NCAA event certification policies and procedures. The evaluation period originally scheduled to occur during the College Basketball Academy, from July 21-23, 2025, would move to a dead period. The

committee is expected to take action to revise the 2025 recruiting calendar and revisit other impacts due to the cancellation of the College Basketball Academy during its January 14, 2025, meeting.

4. **Multiple-team event discussion.** The oversight committee discussed the comprehensive review of MTE legislation. Kevin Pauga, the Associate A.D. of Strategic Initiatives and Conference Planning at Michigan State University, provided an analysis of men's and women's basketball MTE data. The committee expects to have a legislative concept for sponsorship for the June 2025 legislative cycle. Also, the committee did not take action to extend the current MTE blanket waiver. The committee will consider an extension of the 2024-25 MTE blanket waiver to the 2025-26 season during its January meeting.
5. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Student-Athlete Engagement Group update.** The committee received an update from the SAEG's October 21 and November 18 videoconferences.
6. **National Invitation Tournament update.** The committee received an update on the new automatic qualification procedures for the 2025 NIT.
7. **National Association of Basketball Coaches update.** The committee received an update from the NABC.
8. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee update.** The committee received an update from the October 28-29 Men's Basketball Committee meeting.
9. **Approval of reports.** The oversight committee reviewed and approved the meeting reports from the October 7-8, Men's Basketball Oversight Committee and the October 28-29, the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee.
10. **Identification of discussion topics for the NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees' January 14, 2025, joint meeting agenda.** The oversight committee was asked to identify any topics to be discussed during the upcoming joint meeting on January 14, 2025.
