



**ADDENDUM REPORT OF THE NCAA
DIVISION I MEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE
JANUARY 10, 2023, MEETING**

ACTION ITEMS.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

1. **Review of legislative proposals scheduled for January 2023 vote by NCAA Division I Council.** The NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee (MBOC) received an update from the NCAA Division I Legislative Committee Modernization of Rules Subcommittee on key legislative proposals that will be voted on by the Council during its January meeting. The committee supported the recommended modification that the Legislative Committee will make to the Council to modify NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2022-32 to remove the provision that would have eliminated the institutional official visit two-year rolling limit for men's basketball. The oversight committee noted in conjunction with this anticipated modification to Proposal No. 2022-32, it will be asked to continue to review the best way to structure institutional limits around official visits moving forward. The Legislative Committee noted it would consider recommending use of the modernization legislative track to advance modifications to institutional official visit limits as soon as the respective committees identify the appropriate number for the impacted sports.

The oversight committee also received an update on Proposal No. 2022-30 (Athletics Personnel and Recruiting Limitations on Number of Coaches and Off-Campus Recruiters – Basketball) and the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee (WBOC) discussion regarding WBOC's women's basketball fellow concept. The committee maintains its support for the proposal in men's basketball and will continue to receive updates from WBOC on any future discussions surrounding the women's basketball fellow concept.

2. **Discuss NCAA rules related to participation in the NBA Draft.** The committee received an update on how potential changes to the NBA and National Basketball Players Association collective bargaining agreement may impact current NCAA legislation; specifically, if the NBA draft eligibility rule or the free agency policy are changed in the new collective bargaining agreement. The committee began preliminary discussions on whether amendments to current NCAA legislation or policy may be necessary in the future to account for such potential changes. The committee will continue its discussion at a future meeting.
3. **2023 NCAA Men's College Basketball Academy update.** The committee received an update on the logistics and operations for the 2023 Men's College Basketball Academy, including an update on the host city, proposed event dates, planned life skills programming and overall academy schedule.
4. **Review of nominees for the NCAA Men's Basketball Rules Committee vacancies.** The committee reviewed and provided feedback on the slate of nominees for two vacancies on

the Men's Basketball Rules Committee and provided a formal recommendation to be considered by the NCAA Division I Council Coordination Committee.

5. **NCAA men's basketball transfer update.** The committee reviewed and discussed 2021-22 men's basketball transfer data, transfer educational tools currently available for administrators and student-athletes, current transfer waiver trends and transfer waiver guidelines for the 2022-23 academic year.
6. **NCAA Division I Transformation Committee update.** The committee received an update on the Transformation Committee's final report out to the NCAA Division I Board of Directors, including recommended changes to the current governance model that would expand the authority of sport oversight committees and advance the student-athlete experience. The Board of Directors will consider the Transformation Committee's recommendations during its meeting on January 12.
7. **Determination of a scholastic team discussion.** The committee received an update on the current landscape of scholastic recruiting during the fall portion of the academic year recruiting period. The committee also received an update on educational resources being expanded upon by NCAA staff to make the scholastic determination easier and clearer for the membership to apply in the future.
8. **Scholastic and nonscholastic international recruiting during academic year recruiting periods discussion.** The committee provided preliminary feedback on international recruiting during the academic year in men's basketball. The committee requested staff develop international recruiting period concepts to be considered for addition into the recruiting calendar. The committee will further discuss the topic and consider potential legislative concepts during future meetings.
9. **June scholastic events summit update.** The committee received an update on the June scholastic events summit that occurred on December 8, 2022. The summit included scholastic basketball stakeholders from the National Federation of State High Schools, various high school basketball coaches' associations and high school athletics associations, and important topics of note during the summit included a debrief on June 2022 scholastic events and what is to come for June 2023 scholastic events.
10. **College basketball summer initiative update.** The committee received an update on the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee Summer Basketball Initiative Working Group's first meeting in December, including the working group's charge and anticipated timeline. The working group will continue to provide the committee with monthly updates.
11. **Review of multiple-team event resources (MTE).** The committee received an update on recent MTE questions and feedback from event operators regarding confusion surrounding current NCAA MTE legislation. The committee reviewed and approved educational

resources regarding MTE legislation and frequently asked questions that will be distributed to basketball stakeholders in early 2023.

12. **Men's basketball exhibition games for fundraising efforts.** The committee received an update on legislative relief waivers that were approved during fall 2022 related to men's basketball teams seeking to participate in an exhibition game against another Division I institution for the purpose of raising funds for charity. The committee will continue to receive an update on men's basketball exhibition games for fundraising efforts on an annual basis.
13. **National Association of Basketball Coaches update.** The committee received an update from the NABC and its current work on the association's upcoming convention in conjunction with the 2023 Men's Final Four.
14. **Identification of discussion topics for upcoming NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees' joint meeting.** The committee reviewed topics for discussion during the upcoming joint Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees meeting in April 2023.
15. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee December 1, 2022, videoconference report.** The committee reviewed and approved the committee's December 1, 2022, videoconference report.
