



**ADDENDUM REPORT OF THE NCAA  
DIVISION I MEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE  
JUNE 26-27, 2023, MEETING**

**INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.**

1. **Current state of Division I men's college basketball.** In preparation for the discussion, NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee were requested to meet with their men's basketball head coach(es) to respond to questions regarding their men's basketball program(s) and the current state of men's college basketball. The questions related to the following areas: (1) Roster breakdown; (2) Summer access and foreign tours; (3) Summer recruiting; and (4) Countable coaches. During the meeting, the committee discussed the information received so that it can better understand the overall state of Division I men's college basketball.
2. **Scholastic/nonscholastic education and clarification update.** The committee received an update from the staff on the progress made to enhance educational materials for the membership related to the definition and determination of a scholastic team. The staff is working with the National Federation of High School Associations to develop resources to help the membership better understand the application of the scholastic team definition and what events/games coaches may attend during the academic year recruiting period. Staff plans to release updated education prior to the academic year recruiting period that will feature additional questions and answers, a new feature to search teams within the NCAA Eligibility Center High School Portal, and a list of state high school associations declared basketball playing seasons.
3. **International recruiting discussion.** The committee received an update from the staff regarding an initial draft concept pertaining to international recruiting. The committee reviewed the draft concept that would allow for men's basketball coaches to evaluate international prospective student-athletes during international practices and competition during the academic year recruiting period, provided any evaluation would count against the institution's limit of 100 recruiting person days. The committee requested the National Association of Basketball Coaches review the concept with its membership as part of its holistic recruiting calendar review and provide feedback to the oversight committee prior to the committee considering whether to recommend a legislative change.
4. **NBA pre-draft process update.** Garth Glissman, vice president of NBA basketball operations provided an update on the 2023 NBA pre-draft process, including a review of key dates and information related to the number of Undergraduate Advisory Committee (UAC) evaluation requests, process and timeline for UAC feedback, NBA Draft early entrants, NBA Draft Combine and G League Elite Camp participation and NBA Draft data. The pre-draft process impacts a broad range of Division I student-athletes, schools and conferences and the communication, collaboration and education among NCAA and NBA staff members has improved the pre-draft process and allowed NCAA men's basketball student-athletes to make more informed decisions on their professional basketball readiness. Further, the NCAA requirement that student-athletes must seek UAC feedback

prior to declaring for the NBA Draft is helping connect athletes/families directly with the NBA about their professional readiness and rely less on guidance from outside sources.

The following key data and themes were noted from the discussion:

- Since 2018, student-athletes seeking UAC feedback has steadily increased while number of undrafted underclassmen continues to decline.
- The number of student-athletes entering the 2023 NBA Draft as early entrants declined by 15% in comparison to last year which could be due to the recent changes to the NCAA Name, Image and Likeness Policy and one-time transfer exception for men's basketball student-athletes.
- For the first time since 2001 and the second time in history, four noncollege athletes were drafted in the top five of the 2023 NBA Draft and five noncollege athletes were drafted in the top 10. Further, G-League Ignite has produced more draft picks (10) than any other program or institution over the last three years. However, 46 of the 58 athletes drafted in the 2023 NBA Draft were college athletes demonstrating that college athletes continue to comprise an overwhelming majority of drafted athletes.

Finally, the committee received an update on the new Collective Bargaining Agreement between the NBA and National Basketball Players Association that covers the 2023-24 through 2029-30 NBA seasons.

5. **Decentralization concepts.** The committee received an update from the NCAA Division I Legislative Committee Modernization of Rules Subcommittee (MRS) regarding the areas the subcommittee is currently considering for deregulation including pre-enrollment professional opportunities, post-enrollment professional opportunities, professional drafts, use of agents and financial aid limits. The committee noted that it will be important to consider these concepts in greater detail and receive more information from MRS in the future so that the committee can weigh the potential impact, risks and benefits of these concepts to men's college basketball.
6. **Pilot of legislative processes.** The committee received an update on the pilot of legislative processes and the specified areas that sport oversight committees will be provided authority to adopt legislation related to the sport including conduct of athletics personnel, recruiting, playing and practice seasons, processes and procedures related to the administration of the regular season and championships, and sportsmanship and other ethical behaviors. The committee noted that the pilot process would allow conferences to submit concepts to sport oversight committees to consider introducing a proposal and any legislation adopted is not considered final until after NCAA Division I Council reviews.
7. **National Letter of Intent update.** The committee received an update from NCAA staff on the National Letter of Intent program.

8. **NCAA College Basketball Academy update.** The committee received a final update on the 2023 NCAA College Basketball Academy (CBA) including information on number of players, coaches, officials and student managers that will be participating in the event. The committee also discussed the life skills sessions that will occur in the areas of agents and NIL, NCAA Eligibility Center information, mental health, the NBA UAC process, recruiting and the NCAA Transfer Portal. Finally, the committee was advised of information that will be included in a post event survey that will be sent to all participants and parents after the CBA. The committee will receive an update on survey feedback during an upcoming meeting in order to make improvements to the CBA in the future.
9. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Student-Athlete Engagement Group update.** The committee received an update on the newly formed NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Student-Athlete Engagement Group. The group held its first videoconference on May 30, 2023. The group serves as a men's basketball student-athlete-specific group that will engage and provide feedback on current basketball related topics as well as receive specialized programming from NCAA staff and outside basketball stakeholders throughout the year.
10. **NCAA media rights update. The committee received a media rights update.**
11. **Sports wagering update.** Due to time constraints, the committee decided to move this agenda item to its upcoming July 31 videoconference agenda.
12. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee May 15 videoconference report.** The committee reviewed and approved its May 15 videoconference report.
