



**REPORT OF THE NCAA  
DIVISION I MEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE  
NOVEMBER 2, 2022, VIDEOCONFERENCE**

**ACTION ITEMS.**

- **Legislative Item.**
  - **Men's basketball notification of transfer window.**
    - (1) Recommendation. That the Council adopt noncontroversial legislation, in men's basketball, to change the notification of transfer window from beginning the day after Selection Sunday to a uniform transfer window close date of May 1, while maintaining the 60-day timeframe.
    - (2) Effective date. Immediate.
    - (3) Rationale. The proposed change in the notification of transfer window provides an earlier transfer portal "opening" date and standardized "close" date (May 1) for student-athletes who may wish to enter the transfer portal as well as provide teams earlier knowledge of their roster for the upcoming season and summer recruiting cycle.
    - (4) Estimated budget impact. None.
    - (5) Student-athlete impact. The change in the notification of transfer window is expected to provide student-athletes with an earlier date to enter the portal that is consistent with the majority of teams end of season and a standardized transfer portal close date that will be easier for student-athletes to track each year.

**INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.**

1. **2023 NCAA Boys' College Basketball Academy update.** The NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee received an update on the logistics, operations and timeline for the planning of the 2023 Boys' College Basketball Academy.
2. **College basketball summer initiative update.** The oversight committee received an update on the initial charge of creating a summer basketball initiative that would allow teams to participate in a modest number of exhibition games during the summer months. College basketball is currently missing an important opportunity to remain relevant in the basketball universe during the summer and, during a team's eight-week summer access period, college basketball can be showcased to market and promote the teams and student-athletes. The initiative will also be reviewed by the Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee which will form its own working group to review the topic. The Council Coordination Committee is set to review the working group roster, charge and timeline during its November 9 teleconference.

3. **NCAA Division I Council October 27 meeting legislative proposals update.** The oversight committee initially reviewed five proposals introduced by the Council on October 27 related to coaching limitations and campus visits. The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee Legislative Subcommittee will review these proposals during its November 11 meeting in conjunction with two proposals, NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2021-23 (recruiting -- official visit -- length of official visit -- basketball -- 36 hours and two nights of lodging) and 2022-6 (recruiting -- contact restrictions at specified sites -- prospective student-athlete's educational institution -- no contact when classes are in session -- sports other than basketball), previously recommended by the oversight committee and currently tabled.
4. **Review of legislative relief waiver of men's basketball official visit limit.** The oversight committee reviewed a blanket waiver request regarding the institutional limitation on the annual number of official visits provided to men's basketball prospective student-athletes. The oversight committee did not support the blanket waiver request and noted the importance of maintaining an annual limit on the number of official visits provided in men's basketball. The oversight committee noted unique circumstances can be managed on a case-by-case basis.
5. **Prohibition on recruiting contact during the school day.** The oversight committee reviewed Proposal No. 2022-6, which was tabled by the Council pending work of the NCAA Division I Transformation Committee. The proposal would extend the prohibition against recruiting contact during a prospective student-athlete's school day in basketball to all sports. The oversight committee does not support Proposal No. 2022-6 and agreed to support the National Association of Basketball Coaches' concept to eliminate the current rule in basketball. The oversight committee noted that the ability for coaches to meet with a prospective student-athlete in their school environment, alongside other academic stakeholders such as their high school coaches, administrators, teachers and counselors, accentuates the prioritization of academic success. Further, permitting such contact during the school day continues to further the goal of reintegrating scholastic coaches into the recruiting ecosystem. The oversight committee's feedback will be shared with the NCAA Division I Modernization Rules Subcommittee at an upcoming meeting.
6. **Men's basketball certified event timing policies, procedures and legislation.** The oversight committee continued a discussion from the October 4 joint Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees' meeting related to standardizing the operating procedures for the timing of certified boys' basketball events for event operators during April and July and legislated times that exist within the basketball recruiting calendar. The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee reviewed the differences in the Enforcement Certification and Approvals Group policies for boys' basketball certified events versus the evaluation period legislation and supported standardizing the policies and procedures surrounding event operators' ability to conduct contests during certified nonscholastic events in April and July to never start before 8 a.m. and the last game must begin by 10 p.m.

7. **NCAA Division I Transformation Committee update.** The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee received an update on the on-going work of the Transformation Committee. The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee will continue to discuss its role and authority in a new governance structure during its upcoming administrative subcommittee meeting. The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee's feedback will be shared with the Transformation Committee.
8. **NCAA Minority Opportunities and Interests Committee update for senior minority administrator timeline and process.** The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee received an update on MOIC's timeline and process for reviewing the senior minority administrator concept. MOIC expects to finalize a working group in December 2022 to review the concept and anticipates the group will complete its review by May 2023. The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee will have one representative serve on the working group and will continue to update the committee on the working group's progress during future meetings.
9. **National Association of Basketball Coaches update.** The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee received an update on its upcoming 2023 NABC Convention and initial planning and logistics surrounding the event that will take place in Houston, Texas, in conjunction with the 2023 Men's Final Four.
10. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee update.** The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee received an update from the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee regarding planned network coverage for the 2023 Men's Basketball Championship, as well as the Men's Basketball Committee's continued evaluation of prospective host cities for future men's basketball championships.
11. **Identification of discussion topics for upcoming NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees' joint meeting.** The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee reviewed topics for discussion during the upcoming joint Men's and Women's Oversight Committee meeting in January.
12. **NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee October 3-4 in-person addendum report.** The Men's Basketball Oversight Committee reviewed and approved the Men's Basketball Oversight Committee's October 3-4 in-person addendum report.
