



**REPORT OF THE  
NCAA DIVISION I MEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE  
OCTOBER 23, 2020, VIDEOCONFERENCE**

**ACTION ITEMS.**

- **Legislative item.**
  - **Recruiting – Camps and Clinics, Official and Unofficial Visits – Conflicts with NCAA College Basketball Academy.**
    - (1) Recommendation. That the NCAA Division I Council introduce legislation for the 2020-21 cycle to prohibit the following during the dates of the NCAA College Basketball Academy: (a) Institutional basketball camps and clinics; and (b) Official and unofficial visits.
    - (2) Effective date. Immediate. However, a contract signed before October 29, 2020, may be honored.
    - (3) Rationale. The NCAA College Basketball Academy was created as part of the recommendations from the Commission on College Basketball. The purpose of the academy is to provide a valuable athletic and educational experience for prospective student-athletes. The academy aims to create a beneficial evaluation experience for all Division I men's basketball coaches. The academy is scheduled for July 19-24, 2021, and July 25-30, 2022, (which may differ from the prescribed July evaluation period). Eliminating these conflicts increases the opportunity for select players to attend and improves the field of players for coaches to evaluate. Finally, this proposal is supported by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.
    - (4) Estimated budget impact. None.
    - (5) Student-athlete impact. None.

**INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.**

1. **Review of legislative relief blanket waiver of qualifying regular-season multiple-team events requirements.** The NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee reviewed the qualifying regular-season multiple-team event requirements and recommended a legislative relief blanket waiver to address unforeseen and urgent circumstances associated with the COVID-19 pandemic that are outside of the institution's control. The blanket waiver request will be forwarded to the NCAA legislative relief waiver staff for its review and decision. Finally, the NCAA Division I Women's

Basketball Oversight Committee will consider whether to recommend a legislative relief blanket waiver of the qualifying regular-season multiple-team event legislation in the sport of women's basketball during its meeting on November 4.
