

HISTORY OF DI REVENUE DISTRIBUTIONS

- 1990 NCAA Executive Committee formalized the Division I Revenue Distribution. First distributions in 1991.
 - Basketball Fund
 - Grants-in-Aid
 - Sports Sponsorship
- 1996 Division I Revenue Distributions calculations are codified under legislation.
- Others over time:
 - Academic Enhancement
 - Conference Grants
 - Special Assistance Fund / S-A Opportunity Fund
 - Student Support Fund
- 2016 Values-Based Revenue Distribution Working Group (VBRGWG) reviewed principles and calculation methodologies.


KEY POINTS FROM THE VBRDWG

- Recognized revenue distribution at that time was values based;
- Recognized the history of the distribution and the conference funding model, that in some cases relies on NCAA funds as a major source of operational revenue;
- Any changes to the distribution model would be measured, announced, staged, transparent, transitioned thoughtfully from existing distribution;
- Changes to the distribution, if any, should help simplify the distribution; be transparent; include objective (not subjective) criteria; and reflect the Association's values; and
- Acknowledgement that current revenue distribution provided revenue for academic uses, but allocated no money based on academic measures.


