- **2. NCAA national office updates.** The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee received updates from NCAA staff on the current state of Division I which included an update from the NCAA president regarding the *House* settlement implementation and sports wagering.

- **3. Diversity and Inclusion Social Media Campaign updates.** The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee received an update on the Diversity and Inclusion Social Media Campaign and provided feedback on future campaigns.
- 4. NCAA Division I Decision-Making Working Group update. The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee received an update on the recent work of the Decision-Making Working Group. The committee offered feedback on how the proposed streamlined Division I governance structure would affect the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and student-athlete experience overall.

Among priorities discussed were the *House* settlement implementation and its effects on the student-athlete experience. In addition, SAAC chairs plan to meet with conference SAAC leaders to promote conference engagement.

 - a. <u>Elimination of the Prohibition on Wagering on Professional Sports</u>. The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee supported the proposal to eliminate the prohibition on wagering on professional sports introduced by the Division I Council during their June meeting. The committee expressed concern regarding potential promotion and incentivization of professional sports wagering if adopted. SAAC advocated for educational and student-athlete support resources related to wagering on professional sports.
