NCAA DIVISION I STUDENT-ATHLETE ADVISORY COMMITTEE
OCTOBER 1-2, 2022, MEETING

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

1. **Guest speakers.** The NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advisory Committee welcomed guest speakers from the NCAA national office staff:
 - a. Kevin Lennon, vice president of NCAA Division I Governance, provided an update regarding the current state of Division I Governance, the progress of the NCAA Division I Transformation Committee and the future of the student-athlete experience as the expectations of the Division I membership and its governance structure continues to evolve.
 - b. Amanda Conklin, director of Division I Governance, discussed the role of the student-athlete experience and voice within proposed Division I membership expectations created by the Transformation Committee.
2. **2022-23 Division I Student-Athlete Advisory Committee priorities.** The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee revisited and updated its strategic priorities. The priorities focus on examining the structure of the committee and developing ways to become more influential at the campus, conference and national levels, enhancing the student-athlete experience and, student-athlete health and well-being. The committee focused on updating the priorities related to committee structure and mental health for implementation at the institutional, conference and national level.
3. **Student-Athlete Advisory Committee Policies and Procedures.** The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee updated its policies and procedures and identified additional areas of opportunity to create educational resources for institutional and conference Student-Athlete Advisory Committees. The committee noted the importance of aligning the expectations of Student-Athlete Advisory Committees at the institutional, conference and national level.
4. **Student-Athlete voice in governance structure.** The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee discussed opportunities for student-athlete representation in the decision-making process at the conference and institutional levels. The committee's recommendations will be submitted to the NCAA Division I Transformation Committee for review during its discussions on the student-athlete voice and representation in the decision-making process.
5. **NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Experience discussion.** The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee discussed the NCAA Division I student-athlete experience and identified areas of opportunity within the proposed Division I membership expectations created by the NCAA Division I Transformation Committee. The committee's recommendations will be

submitted to the NCAA Division I Transformation Committee for review during its discussions on the student-athlete voice and representation in the decision-making process.

6. **Student-Athlete Advisory Committee video contest.** The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee discussed the focus and criteria for the 2023 video contest. The theme of the 2023 video contest will be “CommUNITY”, with the contest set to begin on November 1. [Supplement]

- Submissions must include a completed online form that will require the name, email address, and phone number of each individual who appears in the video or was involved in the production of the video, the name of the primary NCAA institution and conference (if applicable) and the name of the primary athletic administrator who is affiliated with the video submission.
- Submissions will require a viewable YouTube link to view your video.
- Only complete submissions can be considered for the prize.
