MEN'S AND WOMEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEES  
APRIL 24, 2025, JOINT VIDEOCONFERENCE

**INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.**

1. **NCAA 2025 Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Championships update.** The NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Oversight committees received an update from the NCAA staff on the attendance, broadcast ratings, social media, community events and highlights from the 2025 NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Championships.
2. **National Association of Basketball Coaches and Women's Basketball Coaches Association Conventions updates.** The oversight committees received updates from the NABC and WBCA regarding their recent conventions that occurred in conjunction with the 2025 NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Championships.
3. **Maximum contest limitation proposal discussion.** The oversight committees took action to amend NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2025-2 (Playing and Practice Seasons – Basketball – Maximum Number of Contest and Qualifying Regular-Season Multiple-Team Event Requirements) to include the elimination of the in-season foreign competition legislation in basketball. The oversight committees noted that maintaining the current in-season foreign competition rule would impose an unintended restriction on the location of future multiple-team events. Further, the intent of Proposal No. 2025-2 is to lessen restrictions in order to maximize an institution's discretion surrounding scheduling decisions (e.g., location of contest).

Additionally, the oversight committees noted if the amended proposal is adopted, NCAA Division I Bylaw 17.1.7.10.1 (Exception – Participation in Qualifying Regular-Season Multiple-Team Event) would be eliminated. This legislation specifies that one time during a four-year period, an institution is not required to provide student-athletes with three consecutive days off when a team participates in a qualifying regular-season multiple-team event during the institution's official vacation period after the first term when classes are not in session (e.g., winter break).

4. **Update on preseason practice scrimmages and exhibition contests legislation and legislative proposal for women's basketball.** The Women's Basketball Oversight Committee shared an update from the NCAA Division I Council's April 15-16 meeting regarding Proposal No. 2025-1. Specifically, the Council took action to amend and adopt the proposal as expedited legislation, aligning it with Proposal No. 2024-12 which was adopted in January 2025 in men's basketball. As a result of Council action on Proposal No. 2025-1, men's and women's basketball teams may now participate in up to two preseason scrimmages and/or exhibition games against four-year institutions beginning with the 2025-26 basketball season.

5. **Review Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees' Council-approved legislative and policy priorities.** The oversight committees reviewed their respective legislative and policy priorities that were approved by the NCAA Division I Council Coordination Committee.
6. **NCAA Division I Decision-Making Working Group update.** The oversight committees received an update from the NCAA Division I Decision-Making Working Group.
7. **Other business.** The oversight committees received an update from the NCAA staff regarding the upcoming NCAA Men's and Women's Basketball Playing Rules Committee meetings which will occur May 6–8.
8. **NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees' January 14 and March 25, 2025, joint videoconferences reports.** The oversight committees reviewed and approved the January 14 and March 25 joint videoconferences meeting reports.
