



**REPORT OF THE
NCAA DIVISION I WOMEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE
ADMINISTRATIVE SUBCOMMITTEE
DECEMBER 15, 2022, VIDEOCONFERENCE**

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

1. **Request for feedback from the NCAA Division I Transformation Committee on the role and authority of the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee.** The Women's Basketball Oversight Committee Administrative Subcommittee provided feedback to inform the Transformation Committee as it develops a recommendation for a new governance structure in Division I. The administrative subcommittee noted the success of the current oversight committee structure in managing the sport of women's basketball and addressing the priorities of the sport. In addition, the administrative subcommittee noted the success of the collaboration with the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee on issues impacting both sports. Therefore, the administrative subcommittee recommends that men's and women's basketball maintain separate oversight committees in order to address the unique priorities of each respective sport; however, there is an imperative need to remain disciplined and committed to collaborating on key areas that affect both sports at all levels (e.g., campus, conference, national). The current model could be refined (e.g., establish a smaller group with representatives from each oversight committee) but an extensive overhaul is not necessary at this time.
2. **Review of 2022-23 NCAA Division I Council legislative proposals originating from the NCAA Division I Modernization of Rules Subcommittee.** The administrative subcommittee reviewed and provided feedback on select proposals slated for January 2023 voting.
 - a. **NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2022-28 (Athletics Personnel and Recruiting – Limitations on the Number of Coaches and Off-Campus Recruiters and Recruiting Coordination Functions).** The administrative subcommittee requests the modernization of the rules subcommittee recommend the Council modify Proposal No. 2022-28 to specify that women's basketball managers are not required to be appointed within seven years of initial full-time enrollment. This requirement is not necessary and limits the pool of potential managers, including former professional women's basketball players who would like to enter the coaching profession.
 - b. **NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2022-32 (Recruiting – Official and Unofficial Visits).** Due to time constraints, the administrative subcommittee or the women's basketball oversight committee will provide feedback at a future date.

- c. **NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2022-30 (Athletics Personnel and Recruiting – Limitations on the Number of Coaches and Off-Campus Recruiters – Basketball).** The administrative subcommittee requests the modernization of the rules subcommittee recommend the Council modify the proposal to require that one of the two additional coaches to be required to meet the following criteria: (1) Be a former college basketball student-athlete; (2) Have no previous coaching experience; (3) Limited to eight exempted opportunities to recruit off-campus accompanied by a current coach; and (4) Limited to a period of no more than two years in the position. Women’s basketball is at a critical juncture in its sport as the number of female coaches and the number of minority coaches continue to decline. This concept with these requirements will increase the number of opportunities for women and minorities to become more qualified for future coaching positions and for coaching positions to better reflect the diversity of the sport and the membership. This would also create a pipeline for former men’s and women’s basketball student-athletes to fill a pipeline for future coaches and provides an entry point for aspiring coaches to gain valuable coaching and recruiting experiences, as both expertise in on-court coaching and recruiting are key job functions of a coach.
