



REPORT OF THE NCAA DIVISION I
MEN'S AND WOMEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEES
FEBRUARY 27, 2026, JOINT VIDEOCONFERENCE

ACTION ITEMS.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

1. **Legislative actions.** The Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees adopted the following legislative proposals. The four adopted proposals are not final until reviewed by the NCAA Division I Cabinet during its April 2026 meeting.
 - **NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2026-2 – Athletics Personnel and Recruiting – Limitations on the Number of Coaches and Off-Campus Recruiters – Basketball.** The oversight committees adopted Proposal No. 2026-2. The proposal, in basketball, permits any institutional staff to provide technical and tactical instruction to student-athletes and/or be designated as one of the six off-campus recruiters, with not more than four engaging in off-campus recruiting activities per day. The oversight committees noted the need to continue to review the application of the individual associated with a prospective student-athlete legislation for potential legislative change at their upcoming meetings.
 - **NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2026-6 – Playing and Practice Seasons – Summer Athletics Activities – Skill-Related Instruction – Basketball – Eliminate Four-Hour Rule.** The oversight committees adopted Proposal No. 2026-6. The proposal, in basketball, eliminates the weekly four-hour limit on skill-related instruction during summer athletics activities. An institution would remain limited to a maximum of eight hours per week of countable athletically related activities during its designated eight weeks of summer athletics activities.
 - **NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2026-7 – Playing and Practice Seasons – Preseason Practice Scrimmages/Exhibition Contests – Basketball – Up to Three.** The oversight committees adopted Proposal No. 2026-7. The proposal, in basketball, permits an institution to play up to three preseason practice scrimmages and/or exhibition contests against four-year collegiate institutions before the first permissible contest date. Further, the proposal exempts up to three preseason practice scrimmages and/or exhibition contests from the maximum contest limit.
 - **NCAA Division I Proposal No. 2026-8 – Playing and Practice Seasons – Foreign Tours – Time Lapse Between Tours – Basketball – Once Per Year.** The oversight committees adopted Proposal No. 2026-7. The proposal, in basketball, eliminates the once-in-four-year restriction on institutional foreign tours. An institution would be limited to one foreign tour each year.
2. **Update from February 25 Women's Basketball Oversight Committee meeting and February 26 Men's Basketball Oversight Committee meeting.** The oversight committees

received an update from each committee's most recent February meeting. Specifically, the Women's Basketball Oversight Committee provided an update on its comprehensive review of the women's basketball playing and practice season and its evaluation of the women's basketball recruiting calendar, and the Men's Basketball Oversight Committee provided an update on its review of the outside competition legislation.

3. **NCAA Division I men's and women's basketball future tournament considerations.** The oversight committees received an update on NCAA Division I men's and women's basketball future tournament considerations.
4. **NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Basketball Oversight Committees' January 9 joint meeting report.** The oversight committees reviewed and approved their January 9 joint meeting report.
5. **Other business.** The oversight committees received an update specific to the 2026 NCAA Division I men's and women's basketball tournaments on the family travel stipends and regional team lounge program. It was noted neither the NCAA family travel stipend nor the team lounge program will be expanded to include regional rounds as was previously communicated. As the national office continues to prioritize long-term sustainability, programs of this nature have come under renewed review. The Final Four family travel stipend and Final Four team lounges will not be impacted.
6. **Future meeting schedule.***
 - June 1-2, 2026 – in-person meeting in Indianapolis.
 - October 5-6, 2026 – in-person meeting in Indianapolis.
