

REPORT OF THE NCAA DIVISION I WOMEN'S BASKETBALL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE MAY 3, 2021, VIDEOCONFERENCE

ACTION ITEMS.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

- 1. Update on the gender equity review. An update from the weekly Division I women's basketball leadership meetings with Kaplan Hecker & Fink LLP was provided to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee. It was noted that an outside firm has been contracted to develop a valuation of the current women's basketball television contract with ESPN, including a side-by-side comparison to the contract in place for men's basketball. The weekly leadership meetings will continue through early August with Kaplan Hecker.
- 2. Open discussion and reflections on work and discussions to date. The WBOC provided the following feedback for the full group to consider:
 - a. The expansion of the College Basketball Academy to girls' basketball should be included in the review or immediate considerations by the membership.
 - b. Activation of sponsors and corporate partners around both Division I basketball championships should be examined.
 - c. The platforms such as the webpage and social media sites should be more equitably inclusive of women's basketball.
 - d. Short and long-term basketball and women's basketball branding and marketing strategies need to be determined and supported.
 - e. Notice should be provided to the NCAA that budget dollars be set aside to address disparities for the 2022 women's basketball championship.
 - f. The following are specific questions for the NCAA leadership: Will March Madness be used for the 2022 women's basketball championship, how will the men's and women's basketball student-athlete experience be equitable (e.g., mementos) and what is the 3-5 year marking plan for women's basketball.
 - g. What can be done to equip the coaches who do not make it to the tournament but need to see change on their campus?
