



**NCAA Division I Working Group on Transfers**  
**Summary of Key Takeaways**  
**July 20, 2020, Videoconference**

- 1. Notification of transfer date.** The NCAA Division I Working Group on Transfers continued its discussion of whether there should be a time by which a student-athlete must indicate their intent to transfer in order to access the uniform transfer eligibility exception under development. The working group received feedback on a notification of transfer date concept from the NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committee, NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee, NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee and the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Experience Committee. The working group discussed the varying ideas offered by the committees and agreed to return to this concept on its upcoming videoconference. The working group continued to agree that if a notification of transfer date is recommended as a component to a uniform legislative transfer exception, the date must provide student-athletes with adequate time to make an informed decision about initiating the transfer process.
- 2. Midyear transfer provisions.** The working group reviewed the existing midyear transfer provisions that apply to select Division I sports when a student-athlete transfers between programs during the same academic year. The working group will provide feedback on whether a uniform transfer exception should maintain a midyear transfer provision during its next videoconference.
- 3. Future videoconference.** The working group will hold its next videoconference at 2 p.m. Eastern time July 27.
