



NCAA Division I Working Group on Transfers
Summary of Key Takeaways
June 22, 2020, Videoconference

- **Uniform transfer eligibility concepts and criteria.** The NCAA Division I Working Group on Transfers received background on the division's existing legislative approach to transfer eligibility, as well as recent concepts explored by the membership and the NCAA Division I Committee on Academics. Specifically, the working group was introduced to the transfer eligibility concept developed by the Big Ten Conference prior to the 2019-20 Division I legislative cycle. While the Big Ten's concept was not introduced into the 2019-20 legislative cycle due to the then legislative moratorium on transfer eligibility proposals, the concept included criteria that will be considered by the working group as it progresses in its work.

Additionally, the working group received an overview of the NCAA Division I Committee on Academics recent development of academic-based models for undergraduate four-year transfer eligibility. Based on this presentation, the working group requested data on how many Division I student-athletes transfer below the current NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate transfer adjustment standard.

In advance of its next videoconference, the working group members will provide feedback on what criteria are most essential to a uniform and equitable transfer eligibility approach in Division I. The working group will discuss this feedback on its next videoconference.
