NCAA Division II Civic Engagement Day

NCAA Division II schools and conferences adopted a proposal at the 2022 NCAA Convention that prohibits countable athletically related activities, including practices and games, each year on Election Day in November. This legislation gives student-athletes the opportunity to take part in civic engagement activities, such as volunteering or voting, on this day.

Civic Engagement Day embodies our Division II "Life in the Balance" philosophy and gives student-athletes opportunities to make a difference outside of their sport. With this legislation, student-athletes also can participate in community engagement that goes beyond casting their vote.

Student-athletes should use this opportunity to positively impact their communities, and your Student-Athlete Advisory Committee can help facilitate and execute these efforts.

- · Volunteer on a political campaign.
