

## REPORT OF THE NCAA DIVISION III CHAMPIONSHIPS COMMITTEE SEPTEMBER 8-9, 2025, MEETING

## ACTION ITEMS.

None.

### INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

- 1. Opening remarks and review of schedule and agenda. Division III Championships Committee Chair Leonard Trevino welcomed the group to the in-person meeting and previewed key agenda items.
- **2. Recent Championships Committee report.** The committee approved the report from its August 19 videoconference as presented.
- **3.** Championships discussion guide. The committee reviewed an updated version of this document that details the status of key items to date.
- **4. Championships equity update.** John Baldwin, NCAA Managing Director of Championships and the point person for monitoring equity within the NCAA championships program, joined the meeting to provide an update regarding ongoing efforts to ensure equity among Division III championships.
- 5. Championships topics.
  - **a. Governance scorecard**. Staff provided the results of the 2024-25 governance scorecard, which is a tool that allows Division III committee members to evaluate their experience and the NCAA staff liaisons' support of the Division III governance bodies, including sport committees. Staff noted the high response rate (87%) and that the evaluations were positive.
  - b. Championship bench size. The committee continued its discussion from the August videoconference regarding bench limits per sport and the proposed new bench limits along with rationale/commentary from the sport committees. After lengthy discussion during this meeting, committee members voted to accept the sport committee recommendations, effective with the 2025-26 championships. [Attachment A] However, based on the committee's desire during the August videoconference and additional discussion during this meeting to maximize flexibility for participating institutions, the committee agreed to seek additional feedback from sport committees regarding whether the bench limit should permit all rostered student-athletes as facilities allow. The committee indicated that sport

committees can reaffirm their recommendations, but the Championships Committee is open to maximizing flexibility if the sport committee opts to do so. The committee reiterated that even if a sport's bench size were to be increased, the current policies regarding what student-athletes beyond those within the squad size are allowed to do during the championships would remain the same. The Championships Committee will

revisit this idea based on sport committee feedback during its October videoconference.

- c. Bracketing pilot analysis. The committee reviewed the first year of the bracketing pilot program that protects tops seeds and adds flights where necessary to ensure competitive equity and balance in the preliminary rounds. Staff provided a chart showing the total number of flights by championship and by round from 2021-22 through this past year. The chart also indicates bracket growth over that span. The committee will continue monitoring flights through year two of the bracketing pilot and leading into the next budget cycle.
- **d. Video review requirements**. The committee reviewed a document that the division's conference commissioners and other stakeholders requested that outlines what is required for hosting preliminary rounds relative to video review technology. This resource will be shared more broadly with commissioners and sport committees leading into this year's championships.
- **6. Waiver request.** The committee considered and ultimately supported a request from the Midwest Conference regarding men's and women's golf to waive Bylaw 31.3.3.1.1.1, which requires that all six sponsoring institutions to have been core for at least two academic years in order to receive automatic qualification. The conference's sponsorship in men's and women's golf recently fell below the required six core members. The conference is now adding a core member and is seeking relief of the requirement that all six sponsoring institutions be core members for at least two academic years. The committee felt that the conference's commitment to rectifying the situation was compelling and approved the waiver request.
- **7. 2026 NCAA Convention proposals.** The committee reviewed and took positions (support, opposition or no position) on the following membership-sponsored legislative proposals that were referred by the Division III Management Council for the 2026 Convention.
  - a. Championships Automatic Qualification Required Participation by Conference Core Members. Intent: To require that if an institution is a core member of a conference and that conference has an AQ in a sport, that institution must participate in the conference's fully established AQ process in that sport to have access to the NCAA championship. This access is either winning the conference AQ or through the at-large selection process. The conference has authority to define its AQ process (regular-season champion, tournament champion, etc.). If the institution decides not to participate in its conference's defined AQ process (including declining participation in the conference's postseason tournament), the institution is not eligible for NCAA selections, including atlarge selections.

<u>Championships Committee position</u>: Recommend that the Management Council support the proposal, though the committee asked that the sponsors be contacted to clarify the criteria by which a conference defines its AQ process.

b. Championships – Amend the In-Region Competition Requirement. Intent: To reduce the required minimum percentage of in-region competition for championships eligibility from 70% to 50% for all sports except golf, which would stay at 25%, and tennis, which would maintain its 50% requirement, and to expand the spring break exception to allow institutions hosting contests during another institution's break to also exempt the out-of-region contest even if that hosting institution is not in an institutional vacation period.

<u>Championships Committee position</u>: Recommend that the Management Council support the proposal.

c. Eligibility – Criteria for Determining Season of Eligibility – Minimum Amount of Participation – Only Competition Triggering Use of a Season. Intent: To specify that a student-athlete would be charged with a season of eligibility if the student-athlete competes at any point during the traditional season.

<u>Championships Committee position</u>: The committee voted to take no position on the proposal because members believe it does not directly affect the administration of Division III championships.

d. Championships – Automatic Qualification – Multiple Automatic Qualifier Model. Intent: To develop a formula to provide multiple automatic qualifiers to multisport conferences that have 13 or more members that sponsor a sport that includes the following factors: (a) once a conference reaches 13 or more core members sponsoring a sport, the conference would immediately receive a second automatic qualifier in that sport; (b) if a conference falls below 13 core members sponsoring a sport, the conference would immediately lose their second automatic qualifier in that sport; and (c) the method by which the conference determines its conference representatives is the responsibility of the conference and shall be declared and outlined at the time of the automatic qualifier declaration.

<u>Championships Committee position</u>: Recommend that the Management Council not support the proposal based on the potential negative impact on the number of at-large bids.

e. Championships – Automatic Qualification – Waiting Period – Multisport Conference – Adjust from Two Years to One. Intent: To reduce the waiting period for a multisport conference to receive an automatic qualification from two years to one.

<u>Championships Committee position</u>: Recommend that the Management Council not support the proposal based on the differences between core and affiliate members of a

conference, as well as acknowledging that a waiver process already exists for a conference with compelling rationale to reduce the waiting period.

f. Championships – Establish a Division III Women's Wrestling Championship. Intent: To establish a Division III Women's Wrestling Championship starting in the 2027-28 academic year and a Division III Women's Wrestling Committee as specified.

<u>Championships Committee position</u>: Recommend that the Management Council support the proposal.

## 8. Sport committee reports.

## a. Men's and women's golf.

• Playing and practice season modification. The committee received an overview of the progress the Division III Men's and Women's Golf Committees have made on their regional format proposal, which would create five regions per gender with regional competition (15 men's teams and 12 women's) determining advancement to the finals sites beginning with the 2027 or 2028 championships. [Note: The golf committees are recommending 2027 or 2028 based on allowing enough time to implement the new championships format with securing regional hosts and amending the final site logisitnes. The committees believe 2027 would be ideal, but realize in may take additional time to solidify all of the necessary details.] The golf committee have sought feedback from the membership and determined budget estimates to formalize their proposal. The recommendation comes with a significant budget impact (approximately \$550,000 for both regionals). While the committee did not take a position on the proposal at this time, members offered feedback and asked for additional information/clarification regarding various components of the proposal. The golf committees plan to formally submit the proposal for the Championships Committee to consider during its February meeting when it begins deliberations regarding the next budget cycle.

#### b. Men's lacrosse.

• Bench and squad size. The committee revisited the sport committee's request to increase the bench limits and noted the broader discussion regarding bench size in Agenda Item No. 5-b. The sport committee also requested an increase in the squad size, but the Championships Committee believes that squad size should be addressed across sports rather than separately and will engage in a broader discussion later.

c. Men's and women's soccer.

• Additional official. The committee approved the soccer committees' request to add an eighth official per gender to the finals site. The recommendation comes with a nominal budget impact, which the soccer committees indicate can be absorbed within their existing budgets.

#### d. Men's and women's tennis.

- (1) Men's tennis automatic qualification. The committee approved the following conferences for automatic qualification for the 2026 Division III Men's Tennis Championships: American Rivers Conference; American Southwest Conference; Atlantic East; Centennial Conference; City University of New York Athletic Conference; College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin; Collegiate Conference of the South; Conference of New England; Empire 8; Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference, Landmark Conference; Liberty League; Little East Conference; Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association; Middle Atlantic Conference Commonwealth; Middle Atlantic Conference Freedom; Midwest Conference; Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference; New England Small College Athletic Conference; New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference; North Coast Athletic Conference; Northern Athletics Collegiate Conference; Northwest Conference; Ohio Athletic Conference; Old Dominion Athletic Conference; Presidents' Athletic Conference; Skyline Conference; Southern Athletic Association; Southern California Inter. Athletic Conference; Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference; United East Conference; University Athletic Association; Upper Midwest Athletic Conference; USA South Athletic Conference; Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.
- (2) Women's tennis automatic qualification. The committee approved the following conferences for automatic qualification for the 2026 Division III Women's Tennis Championships: American Southwest Conference; American Rivers Conference; Centennial Conference; City University of New York Athletic Conference; College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin; Collegiate Conference of the South; Conference of New England; Empire 8; Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference; Landmark Conference; Liberty League; Little East Conference; Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association; Middle Atlantic Conference Commonwealth; Middle Atlantic Conference Freedom; Midwest Conference; Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference; New England Small College Athletic Conference; New England Women's and Men's Athletics Conference; New Jersey Athletic Conference; North Atlantic Conference; North Coast Athletic Conference; Northern Athletics Collegiate Conference; Northwest Conference; Ohio Athletic Conference; Old Dominion Athletic Conference; Presidents' Athletic Conference; Skyline Conference; Southern Athletic Association; Southern California Inter. - (3) Data spreadsheet contractor. The committee supported a recommendation for the tennis committees to contract a former committee member to help provide data spreadsheets for team and individual rankings and selections. While the goal is to have NPI established to manage the team rankings and selections, the spreadsheets help organize the data for individuals (singles and doubles) in a concise and clear format that is beneficial for ranking and selection discussion. The recommendation includes a small stipend, which the tennis committees believe can be absorbed within their existing budgets.
- **(4) Seven-point scoring pilot.** The Championships Committee noted as information the tennis committees' recommendation (and subsequent approval from the tennis rules subcommittee) that the seven-point scoring pilot be adopted as a permanent rule change beginning with the 2025-26 season.

#### 9. Other business.

• Committee meeting frequency. The committee discussed its current meeting cadence and explored potentially reducing the number of meetings annually to increase efficiency. Committee members were open to the idea and asked staff to draft a revised cadence for the committee to consider during a future meeting.
