(1) Championships Committee.

<u>January 12 Management Council</u>. The Council received the following championships updates:

The Championships Committee revisited winter sport sponsorship numbers as they are known to date and reviewed survey responses. The survey data were not conclusive, which the committee expected given that the surveys were sent in December when many conferences and institutions were still considering their competition decisions. The committee reported that its next steps will be to ask institutions to declare their intentions to compete in winter championships based on their plans to conduct competition and be eligible for selection. The committee will develop and distribute this declaration request by mid-January. Prior to February 1, based on declaration responses, the committee will consider whether to recommend a change to holding winter championships.

The Return to Championships Guidelines have been finalized for all sports based on guidance/direction from the NCAA COVID-19 Medical Advisory Group. The guidelines are intended to be consistent with guidance published by the federal government and its corresponding health agencies and otherwise reflective of the best available scientific and medical information available at the time of publication. Each document will be the basis for each preliminary round and Championship finals host site.

The winter bid process has been initiated to solicit hosts for preliminary rounds in men's and women's basketball and all rounds of men's and women's ice hockey. Prospective hosts must demonstrate the ability to meet health and safety protocols.

4. PROPOSED LEGISLATION FOR THE 2021 CONVENTION.

a. Review of 2021 NCAA Convention Notice.

January 12 Management Council. The Council recommended the Presidents Council consider withdrawing Proposal No. 2021-1, which would allow Division III student-athletes to use their name, image, and likeness for promotional purposes. The Council reaffirmed its commitment to providing name, image, and likeness (NIL) opportunities to Division III student-athletes at the first practicable opportunity. However, in light of input from the U.S. Department of Justice Antitrust Division regarding NIL legislation proposed in all three divisions, the Council recommended the Presidents Council consider withdrawing Proposal No. 2021-1.

The Council received information that the Division III legislative proposal is fully compliant with U.S. antitrust law. Further, throughout the development of the current proposal, the Division III membership expressed strong support for these changes. However, given the current environment and the fact that Division III has not yet voted on the NIL proposal, the Council believes it is responsible and prudent for the Presidents Council to postpone a vote until the NCAA can gather additional relevant information about the potential impact of the various concerns at issue.

The Council also recommended the Presidents Council reaffirm its commitment to modernize legislation to provide NIL opportunities to Division III student-athletes at the first practicable opportunity. Nothing about this request to withdraw Proposal No. 2021-1 should be taken as a sign that the Division III governance structure does not support the legislation.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The Council endorsed the recommendation and formally withdrew Proposal No. 2021-1.

b. Legislative Proposal Question and Answer Guide.

<u>January 12 Management Council</u>. The Council reviewed the Legislative Proposal Question and Answer guide. No action was necessary since it recommended withdrawing the proposal.

c. Review of Parliamentary and Voting Issues.

<u>January 12 Management Council</u>. The Council recommended Presidents Council approve the updated 2021 NCAA Convention Mootnicity and related parliamentary issues document that reflected the withdrawal of the Name, Image and Likeness proposal.

d. Division III Officiating Strategic Plan.

<u>January 12 Management Council</u>. The Council reviewed a document that outlines the five-year strategic plan to address the cultural and systemic issues identified in the Division III Commissioners Association 2020 Strategic Analysis of the State of Collegiate Officiating and engage stakeholders in a collaborative approach to influence the future of collegiate officiating. The document details the vision, values, and pillars of the strategic plan.

e. Division III Graduation Rates.

<u>January 12 Management Council</u>. Staff provided an update on the most recent Division III graduation rates. Student-athlete graduation-rate reporting was mandatory for the first time with this reporting cycle. The Division III national four-year average Academic Success Rate (ASR) continues to hold steady at 87 percent. Even when utilizing the less-inclusive federal rate, Division III student-athletes perform better than the general student body. The four-year, federal rate for student-athletes was 68 percent and the federal rate for the overall student body was 66 percent.

6. ASSOCIATION-WIDE UPDATES AND ISSUES.

a. Board of Governors (BOG) Update.

<u>January 12 Management and Presidents Councils</u>. The Councils received an update on the BOG initiatives including:

- (1) National office and COVID-19 response.
- (2) Sexual violence prevention policy expansion.
- (3) Committee to Promote Cultural Diversity and Equity.

b. NCAA Committee Member Appointment Process Analysis.

January 12 Management Council. The office of inclusion provided an update on a recent study that examined the NCAA committee member appointment process. The purpose of the analysis was to examine the appointment process relative to its ability to produce a diverse and representative governance structure. This analysis is in response to the goal of the Board of Governor's Committee to Promote Cultural Diversity and Equity (CPCDE) to operationalize the NCAA Presidential Pledge. The analysis uncovered a series of questions for further consideration and opportunities to revise administrative and data collection practices. The report presents preliminary concepts to consider increasing the representation of women and ethnic/racial minorities on NCAA committees or to otherwise enhance the extent to which NCAA committee members reflect the diversity of NCAA studentathletes.

c. Sport Science Institute (SSI) updates.

January 12 Management Council. Chief Medical Officer Dr. Hainline provided an update on the December release of the Resocialization of Collegiate Sport: Developing Standards for Practice and Competition, Second Edition (Updated), which will serve as the most current reference point for student-athletes in fall, winter and spring sports for practice and competition. The document includes considerations specific to the prevention of community spread of COVID-19, reclassification of transmission risk of sport based on emerging information, and COVID-19 testing and masking for athletes, officials, and other Tier 1 personnel.

The Council also received an update on outcomes and deliverables from the Gender Identity and Student-Athlete Participation Summit co-hosted by SSI and the office of inclusion in early October. The summit, which included medical experts and divisional representation, looked at healthcare (physical/mental) for student-athletes who are gender transitioning, competitive equity, and inclusion.

d. NCAA Coaches Credential Curriculum Development Group.

January 12 Management Council. The Council received an update on a potential model for NCAA Coaches Credentialing. It reviewed a document that was the result of 18 months of discussion and study involving a two-phase coaches' pilot. The model is an outcomesbased education program focused on providing a set of core requirements and electives to establish foundational knowledge and educate coaches in meaningful ways to support them in their role developing student-athletes as people and in their sport. Next steps include building the sport-specific curricular framework and launching several pilots.

e. Campus Sexual Violence Policy Implementation Task Force.

January 12 Management Council. In April 2020, the NCAA Board of Governors expanded the Association-wide policy on campus sexual violence to include individual accountability measures. This action is an opportunity for member institutions to evaluate their prevention measures based on their campus policies and state and federal laws. Additionally, the U.S. Department of Education (DOE) released new Title IX regulations that became effective in August 2020. These new regulations raise several questions for the membership regarding how the Association's expanded policy intersects with the new requirements of the DOE regulations. To fully serve the membership in fulfilling this annual policy requirement and given the new DOE regulations, the Board of Governors directed the development of a membership task force to provide resources to assist members in developing implementation measures on campus. The task force shall work to develop operational guidelines, best practices and supporting documentation that campuses can use to implement the expanded policy. Their work will enable member schools to use the resources developed to better prepare for the 2022-23 attestation requirements.
