1. WELCOME AND ANNOUNCEMENTS.

October 20-21 Management Council. The meeting was called to order at 8:28 a.m. Eastern time, October 20, and 8:29 a.m. Eastern time, October 21. The chair, Jason Verdugo, welcomed the council and asked the two new SAAC representatives, Michael Cohen from King's College and Luana Batista Soares from the University of Massachusetts Boston, to introduce themselves. Mr. Verdugo also asked individuals observing the meeting as participants of the NCAA Pathway Program to introduce themselves.

October 28 Presidents Council. The meeting was called to order at 8:34 a.m. Eastern time, October 28. The chair, Jim Troha, welcomed the council, thanked members for their engagement with the Presidents Advisory Group the previous evening and previewed key agenda items for this meeting.

2. REVIEW OF RECORDS OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS.

(2) 2026 NCAA Convention Legislation.

Management and Presidents Councils. The councils ratified the Administrative Committee's action to approve, in final format, the following 2026 NCAA Convention legislative proposals sponsored by the Division III Management Council, consistent with the September 1 deadline.

- (a) Awards, Benefits and Expenses for Enrolled Student-Athletes Types of Awards, Awarding Agencies, Maximum Value and Numbers of Awards Remove Exact Dollar Amounts and References to Award Values. This proposal removes the dollar amounts and references to the value of awards from the awards legislation.
- (b) Awards, Benefits and Expenses for Enrolled Student-Athletes Permit Actual and Necessary Expenses for One All-Star Contest

or Other Post-Eligibility Event. This proposal permits institutions to provide actual and necessary expenses for student-athletes to participate in one collegiate all-star contest or similar post-eligibility competitive event.

- (c) Awards, Benefits and Expenses for Enrolled Student-Athletes Team Entertainment Professional Sports Tickets. This proposal clarifies that institutions may provide reasonable entertainment during the playing season; further that reasonable entertainment could include providing professional sports tickets.
- (d) Recruiting Contacts and Evaluations Four-Year College Prospective Student-Athletes Require Use of the NCAA Transfer Portal. This proposal (1) replaces the current "permission to contact" legislation related to NCAA four-year college transfer student-athletes with a "notification of transfer" model; (2) specifies that an institution must place a student-athlete's written request for transfer into the NCAA Transfer Portal within seven-consecutive calendar days; (3) specifies that a student-athlete must successfully complete an educational module before they are entered into the NCAA Transfer Portal; and (4) maintains the existing processes for the Division III self-release, for student-athletes interested in transferring to another Division III institution.
- (e) National Collegiate Championship Acrobatics and Tumbling. This proposal establishes a National Collegiate championship and establishes a women's acrobatics and tumbling committee.
- (f) National Collegiate Championship Stunt. This proposal establishes a National Collegiate championship and establishes a women's stunt committee.

(3) Noncontroversial Legislation

<u>Management and Presidents Councils</u>. The councils ratified the Administrative Committee's action to approve, in final format, the following noncontroversial proposals that were approved, in concept, during the Management Council's summer meeting. The committee's action allowed the proposals to be effective immediately versus waiting until after the October Management Council meeting.

(a) Infractions Program – Committee on Infractions – Negotiated Resolution. The legislation establishes a structured resolution process that enables institutions and involved individuals to address infraction cases collaboratively with NCAA enforcement staff. Parties work together to agree on relevant facts, identified violations, violation levels, and proposed penalties. These

agreements are then submitted for review and approval by the Committee on Infractions, which apply a highly deferential standard where agreements are only rejected if the penalties are found to be "manifestly unreasonable" or if the agreements do not serve the best interests of the Association.

- (b) Enforcement Policies and Procedures Multiple Resolution Methods. The legislation allows a single infractions case to be resolved by multiple methods, such as negotiated resolution, summary judgment or hearing.
- (c) Organizational Structure and Committees Playing Rules Oversight Panel and Rules Committees Without Championships Administration Responsibilities – Establishment of New Playing Rules Structure and Process. The legislation establishes a new playing rules structure and process for Division III.

(4) Championship Bracket Enhancements.

Management and Presidents Councils. The councils ratified the Administrative Committee's action to approve two requests from the Division III Championships Committee to increase championship brackets in women's ice hockey from 12 to 13 teams and in men's volleyball from 19 to 21 teams. The committee's action allowed the proposals to be effective immediately versus waiting until after the October Management Council meeting.

f. Management Council Policies and Procedures.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council approved a revised policies and procedures document that includes its steps to consider a request to exempt Division III from a common playing rule.

The councils also were informed of discussions within the Strategic Planning and Finance Committee related to managing the division's reserves in relation to building the FY27 and FY28 budgets.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council received an update from the subcommittee's September 10 meeting, noting the subcommittee's identification of federal legislation and the implementation of a new governance structure in Division I as key priorities to monitor regarding their potential impact on Division III.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The council also reviewed the subcommittee's report and noted the importance of the subcommittee given the building consensus regarding the desire to conduct a comprehensive analysis of Division III. Accordingly, the council discussed whether the subcommittee composition, meeting frequency and reporting procedures ensure the subcommittee is best situated to achieve its mission and purpose. The council agreed that these components should be discussed further during the subcommittee's next meeting in December and during a future Presidents Council meeting.

(a) Noncontroversial legislation – Bylaw 8.7.6 – Association-wide Committees – Rules Committees Without Championships Administration Responsibilities – Men's and Women's Ice Hockey Rules Committee Composition.

Management Council. The council approved, in concept, noncontroversial legislation to reduce the number of Division II

representatives on the Divisions II and III Men's and Women's Ice Hockey Rules Committee from two to one (and thus reduce the total representation on the committee from nine to eight (six Division III members; one Division II member; one non-voting secretary-rules editor). The recommendation is based on the challenges with soliciting nominations for the Division II spots given how few Division II institutions sponsor ice hockey. The Division II Management Council also adopted noncontroversial legislation to accommodate this request. While the recommendation does not affect Division III representation on the committee, the bylaw in question is common legislation and thus requires approval from both divisions.

The council was advised of the Championships Committee's decision, based on feedback from sport committees, to increase the bench size to include all rostered student-athletes or the number recommended by the sport committee. Official Interpretation Regarding Sickle Cell Solubility Testing.

<u>Management Council</u>. Per a recommendation from the committee, the council approved the following official interpretation:

The Interpretations and Legislation Committee determined that only results from a sickle cell test that meet or exceed the standard of a sickle cell solubility test, as determined by a team physician, satisfy NCAA legislation.

(9) Request to Exempt Division from a Common Playing Rule.

Management Council. The council reviewed and supported a request from five Division III conferences to exempt Division III from a newly adopted playing rule in women's lacrosse that requires officials to wear headsets beginning with the 2027 season. The council noted the potential long-term impact on officials within the sport, the precedent this may establish for other sports, the benefit for allowing flexibility for officials in regions where headset use is common, while providing additional time for others to acquire the necessary equipment. The council's action renders the new playing rule as permissive rather than mandatory.

(a) Noncontroversial Legislation – Exemption to the Current Compositional Requirements for NCAA Division III Management Council-Assigned Committees and the NCAA Division III Strategic Planning and Finance Committee.

Management Council. The council approved, in concept, noncontroversial legislation clarifying that an appointed position on a committee does not count for determining area or multi-sport conference representation; and that for the members of the NCAA Division III Strategic Planning and Finance Committee who are not appointed by position (at-large members), there must be at least one representative from each Division III geographic area. The effective date of the legislation is immediate. Current legislation prohibits two people from the same conference serving on a committee at the same time. It implies that if the appointed position is from the same conference as an existing committee member, one of the individuals must be removed from the committee. Additionally, current legislation requires at least two and not more than three members from each Division III geographic area serve on the Strategic Planning and Finance Committee. Because the Strategic Planning and Finance Committee has six appointed positions, it is challenging to comply with this requirement.

(3) Committee on Competitive Safeguards and Medical Aspects of Sports (CSMAS).

Management Council. The council reviewed the report from the committee's June meeting and received a verbal update from the September meeting. The committee has asked relevant playing rules bodies for sports that limit substitutions and/or reentry to allow exceptions for any student-athlete seeking timely medical evaluation and/or treatment of any condition with the potential to cause catastrophic injury or illness (including, but not limited to diabetes, sickle cell trait, asthma), as determined by the primary athletics health care provider. No action from the council was necessary.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council reviewed the committee's report. No action was necessary.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

(6) Walter Byers Postgraduate Scholarship Committee.

<u>Management Council</u>. The committee had no formal report. No action was necessary.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. No action was necessary.

4. PROPOSED LEGISLATION FOR THE 2026 NCAA CONVENTION.

- a. Membership-Sponsored Legislation Governance Position.
 - (1) Recruiting Unofficial Visit Meals for Prospective Student-Athletes and Their Guests.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council supported the proposal to allow institutions to provide meals in an on-campus dining facility for a prospective student-athlete and those individuals accompanying the prospective student-athlete. The council believes the proposal alleviates the confusion surrounding the current rule since some institutions are able to use the exception in Bylaw 13.7.3 and provide meals to the guests of prospective student-athletes through their admissions offices but not others.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

(2) Eligibility – Criteria for Determining Season of Eligibility – Minimum Amount of Participation – Only Competition Triggering Use of a Season.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council recommended no position on the proposal specifying that a student-athlete would be charged with a season of eligibility if the student-athlete competes at any point during the

traditional season. The council believes that the proposal would have a widely varied impact on the Division III membership and should be left to a vote on the Convention floor.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The council reviewed the proposal, as it was considered presidential in nature, and opposed it, believing that the proposal conflicts with the Division III philosophy and may impose a financial impact on student-athletes.

(3) Playing Seasons – Add a Mandatory Winter Break.

Management Council. The council opposed the proposal to establish a seven consecutive calendar day period over the winter break and to specify that during this break, student-athletes may not be employed at institutional camps and clinics, may not participate in any countable athletically related activities and may not participate in any voluntary athletically related activities on campus unless the facility is open to the general student body. The council believes the proposal is overly restrictive and may impede access to on-campus facilities and place an unnecessary burden on student-athletes who may have to find alternative accommodations and facilities.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

(4) Championships – Establish a Division III Women's Wrestling Championship.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council recommended that the Presidents Council support the proposal to establish a Division III Women's Wrestling Championship starting in the 2027-28 academic year and a Division III Women's Wrestling Committee as specified. The council believes sport sponsorship data merit the establishment of the championship and that sponsorship will continue to grow accordingly.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The council reviewed the proposal, as it was considered presidential in nature, and supported it.

(5) Automatic Qualification – Required Participation by Conference Core Members.

Management Council. The council recommended that the Presidents Council support the proposal stating that if an institution is a core member of a conference and that conference has an AQ in a sport, that institution must participate in the conference's fully established AQ process in that sport to have access to the NCAA championship. This access is either winning the conference AQ or through the at-large selection process. The conference has authority to define its AQ process (regular-season champion,

tournament champion, etc.). If the institution decides not to participate in its conference's defined AQ process (including declining participation in the conference's postseason tournament), the institution is not eligible for NCAA selections, including at-large selections. The council believes the proposal maintains the desired integrity within the AQ process.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The council reviewed the proposal, as it was considered presidential in nature, and supported it.

(6) Automatic Qualification – Multiple Automatic Qualifier Model.

Management Council. The council recommended that the Presidents Council oppose the proposal to develop a formula to provide multiple automatic qualifiers to multisport conferences that have 12 or more core members that sponsor a sport. Specifically: (1) Once a conference reaches 12 or more core members sponsoring a sport, the conference will immediately receive a second automatic qualifier in that sport; (2) If a conference falls below 12 core members sponsoring a sport, the conference will immediately lose their second automatic qualifier in the sport; and (3) The method by which the conference determines its conference representatives is the responsibility of the conference and shall be declared and outlined at the time of the automatic-qualifier declaration. The council is concerned that the proposal would negatively impact at-large selections.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The council reviewed the proposal, as it was considered presidential in nature, and opposed it, agreeing that it would likely have a negative impact on the number of at-large selections.

(7) Championships – Amend the In-Region Competition Requirement.

Management Council. The council recommended that the Presidents Council support the proposal to reduce the required minimum percentage of in-region competition for championships eligibility from 70% to 50% for all sports except golf, which would stay at 25%, and tennis, which would maintain its 50% requirement, and to expand the spring break exception to allow institutions hosting contests during another institution's break to also exempt the out-of-region contest even if that hosting institution is not in an institutional vacation period. The council believes the additional flexibility would benefit Division III members and greatly reduce waiver requests in this space. The council also believes the percentage reduction does not run counter to the emphasis on in-region play in the Division III philosophy statement.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The council reviewed the proposal, as it was considered presidential in nature, and supported it.

(8) Championships – Automatic Qualification – Waiting Period – Multisport Conference – Adjust from Two Years to One.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council opposed a proposal seeking to reduce the wait time for a multisport conference to receive an automatic qualification from two years to one. The council believes the proposal is unnecessary given the existing waiver process available for conferences with compelling circumstances to reduce the waiting period.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

(9) Resolution – Name, Image and Likeness Activities.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council recommended that the Presidents Council support the resolution to charge the governance structure with monitoring the changing landscape around Division I NIL and its impact on Division III, and to develop strategies, policies and if warranted, propose legislative changes that would protect valid NIL opportunities consistent with the Division III philosophy.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The council reviewed the resolution, as it was considered presidential in nature, and supported it.

b. Proposal Groupings.

- c. Review of Noncontroversial Legislation Approved by the Management Council.
 - Sports Wagering Proposal.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council approved, in final legislative form, the proposal to permit wagering on professional athletics:

NC 2026-15: Ethical Conduct – Sports Wagering Activities -- Elimination of Prohibition on Wagering on Professional Sports. Intent: To eliminate the prohibition on wagering on professional sports. The council approved with a November 1, 2025, effective date. (Note: Division II also approved

with the same effective date and Division I approved but amended its effective date to November 22, 2025. Because it is a common provision, the proposal must be the same for all three divisions, which, in turn, means the effective date will be November 22.)

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

5. DIVISION III INITIATIVES AND UPDATES.

a. Convention Update.

<u>Management and Presidents Councils</u>. The councils reviewed the upcoming NCAA Convention schedule and noted the meetings pertaining to each group.

b. Joint Meeting with Division III Conference Commissioners Association (DIIICA) and National Association of Division III Athletics Administrators (NADIIIAA).

<u>Management Council</u>. The council received a summary of the meeting with DIIICA and NADIIIAA leadership in August.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

c. NCAA ID Numbers.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council approved a change to its policies for reporting of Division III graduation rate information beginning in 2032. The change will require all Division III student-athletes initially enrolling in a Division III institution beginning in the fall of 2026 to have an NCAA ID number.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

d. Athletics Communication Working Group.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council received a copy of the updated Guide to Strategic Athletics Communication on Campus. The publication was updated to help institutions appropriately emphasize the importance of athletics communicators in Division III and support their staff. Additionally, the council was advised of the working group's request to the Division III Strategic Planning and Finance Committee to include a grant of up to \$2,000 per year for FY27 and FY28 as part of the new biennium budget to support institutional athletics communication professionals.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The new guide was distributed during the council's joint meeting with the Presidents Advisory Group the previous evening.

e. Faculty Athletics Representative Advisory Group.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council received the advisory group's report. No action was necessary.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

f. Division III Branding and Promotions.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council received an update on the division's branding and promotions efforts, including the quarterly update from the College Sports Communicators and on the Emerging Elite Program.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

g. Championships Live Streaming.

<u>Management and Presidents Councils</u>. The councils received an update on the live streaming of Division III team championships in 2025-26, including a recent agreement for all rounds of team championships in 2025-26 not already covered by existing ESPN agreements to be streamed free of charge on a centralized platform (i.e., NCAA.com) administered by Hudl.

h. Officiating.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council received updates on the Division III Commissioners Association's partnership with the National Association of Sports Officials to assist with the recognition and recruitment of officials.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

i. Sportsmanship.

<u>Management and Presidents Councils</u>. The councils received an update on the new de-escalation training module developed to support the Division III membership's efforts to promote sportsmanship and improve the game environment.

j. Health and Safety Initiatives.

Management Council. No action was necessary.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The council received this update during its joint meeting with the Presidents Advisory Group the previous evening.

k. Annual Report.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council was informed that the division's 2024-25 annual report is available online.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

1. Analysis of Division III.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council discussed various concerns and challenges within Division III and agreed that given the current state of intercollegiate athletics and higher education, coupled with the diversity of the Division III membership, a broad analysis of the division is needed. The council identified the following as items that should be considered in the review:

- Membership requirements;
- Requirements for earning an automatic qualifier to participate in a Division III championship;
- Eligibility and enrollment requirements;
- Ability to compete at the conference and national level; and
- Financial stability within higher education and college athletics.

The council noted that the goal of the analysis should be to determine if the core tenets of the division are still appropriate for where the division desires to be in the future, and to identify the areas of concern and provide recommendations to resolve those issues for the membership to consider.

Presidents Council. The council also discussed the merits of conducting a comprehensive analysis of Division III at various points during its agenda and ultimately agreed that such an exercise would be beneficial as the Association and Division III continue to navigate the evolving landscape of higher education and intercollegiate athletics. Accordingly, the council endorsed a focused review of key issues, possibly including championship access, eligibility standards, and membership criteria, beginning with the Presidents and Chancellors Forum and the Division III Issues Forum during the upcoming 2026 Convention. The council noted that this effort is intended to build on recent evaluations conducted by Deloitte (finances), Lewis Rice (Enrichment Fund), and the Division III Philosophy Working Group.

6. ASSOCIATION-WIDE UPDATES AND ISSUES.

a. Update from NCAA President Charlie Baker.

<u>Management and Presidents Councils</u>. President Baker updated the councils on issues affecting the Association overall and Division III in particular.

b. Board of Governors Updates.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council reviewed the reports from the board's recent meeting.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. In addition to reviewing those reports, the council as part of the consultative process received an overview of key agenda items for the board's October 29 meeting.

c. Updates from Division I and Division II Governance.

<u>Management Council</u>. Senior Vice President for Governance and Member Services Jenn Fraser and Division II Vice President Terri Steeb Gronau updated the council regarding initiatives and priorities in Divisions I and II.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

d. Sport Science Institute (SSI) Updates.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council received an update regarding the following items:

- (1) Athletic Trainer Stakeholder Meeting. SSI has held several meetings with athletic trainer stakeholders: the National Athletic Trainers' Association and the accrediting and educational bodies for athletic trainers. SSI is collaborating with these groups to develop strategies that will positively influence athletic trainers working in intercollegiate athletics, such as mentoring, team physician advocacy, and alternative health care delivery models.
- (2) Sports Betting Harm Reduction Strategies. The council was advised that SSI has published additional resources to assist the membership with the implementation of harm reduction strategies to address sports wagering.
- (3) Performance Technology. SSI conducted a summit in May 2025 on the topic of performance technologies, which resulted in the development of nonbinding guidance for the membership that includes a plan for responsible use of performance technology, a process for selecting and implementing those technologies, education and data management. Once finalized, the consensus statements will be reviewed by the NCAA Committee on Competitive Safeguards and Medical Aspects of Sports and then released to the membership.
- (4) Mental Health. The staff advised that SSI is providing the membership with opportunities to receive mental health first aid training. The next opportunity will be at the 2026 Convention.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The council received this update during its joint meeting with the Presidents Advisory Group the previous evening.

e. Legal Update.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council received updates from the NCAA's office of legal affairs on litigation affecting the Association and Division III.

<u>Presidents Council</u>. The council received this update during its joint meeting with the Presidents Advisory Group the previous evening. The council and PAG discussed the importance of affirming the division's commitment to apply its rules fairly and consistently, its established rule making processes, and its opposition to court-ordered exceptions outside of its bylaws.

f. Government Relations.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council received an update from the NCAA's external affairs staff regarding the status of federal legislation affecting Division III.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

g. Purchasing Cooperative.

<u>Management Council</u>. The council received an update regarding the partnership with E&I designed to consolidate purchasing needs to financially benefit member institutions.

Presidents Council. No action was necessary.

7. EXECUTIVE SESSION.

Presidents Council. The council convened an executive session.

8. ADJOURNMENT.

<u>Management Council</u>. The meeting adjourned at 4:30 p.m. Eastern time, October 20, and 11:30 a.m. Eastern time, October 21.

Presidents Council. The meeting adjourned at 11:40 a.m. Eastern time, October 28.
